"What are you doing for the summer?" is a question I am asked often these days as the seminary studies for the men come to an end and ordinations take place all across the country. Summertime in the Office for Vocations means lots of activity. While there is some downtime and vacation time, summer is also busy. Here are some of the events to be aware of:

June 16-18 Dare to Follow Retreat for 6-10th grade boys: we usually have around 30 young men praying, having fun, and listening to talks by the seminarians and newly ordained priests about the joy of priesthood.

June 25 Ordination to the priesthood for Deacon Daniel Sedlacek: 10:00 AM at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman in La Crosse. Everyone is invited to attend and give praise to God for a new priest for our diocese.

July 15-17 Threshold Retreat for high school boys in grades 11-12, and college men: This retreat focuses on taking the next step in discernment and giving serious consideration to what the Lord may be calling a young man to do with his life. On average ½ of the young men attending Threshold Retreat apply for seminary.

July 31 Priests for Tomorrow Fundraiser: Our largest fundraiser, Priests for Tomorrow is an opportunity for people to meet nearly all of our seminarians, have a wonderful supper and enjoy an informative program about some aspect of priestly life and formation. This year Monsignor Thomas Melvin, Rector of the IHM Seminary in Winona, will discuss fishing for vocations.

August 1-6 The Seminarian Gathering: Bishop Callahan spends the days with our seminarians in discussion, prayer and fun as we get ready for the new year of formation and education to begin.

Some of our seminarians will be doing hospital ministry (CPE) in La Crosse and in Alaska! Other seminarians will be studying spirituality at the Institute of Priestly Formation in Omaha. One will be studying in a Spanish language immersion program in Texas. Others will be in parishes across the diocese, while the others work to earn money for their college studies. It will be a busy summer for our seminarians and for the Office for Vocations. In this issue of our Priests For Tomorrow Newsletter you will read about what your priests for tomorrow are doing for their summers. Please keep us all in your prayers and know that you are in ours as well.


