

Liturgical Calendar Dates

September 27 (Wednesday): Rural Life Day, day of thanksgiving for blessings received. Prayer texts from *The Mass for Various Needs and Occasions: After the Harvest* (n.28) can be used

with Preface V of the Sundays in Ordinary Time. The readings may be taken from *After the Harvest* in the Lectionary (n.20), numbers 917-921. The *Gloria* also ought to be said.

Christmas Mass Schedule

The Fourth Sunday of Advent this year falls on December 24. Masses during the day will celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent, while Masses on Sunday evening will observe the Vigil for Christmas. Catholics are to attend Mass twice for these two occasions.

One week later, Sunday, December 31, will celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family during the morning, while Sunday evening Masses can observe either the Feast of the Holy Family or the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God; either Mass will fulfill the faithful's Sunday obligation. Monday, January 1, is not a Holy Day of obligation in 2018.

Bread and Wine

At Pope Francis's direction, Cardinal Robert Sarah has sent a letter to bishops "to remind them that it falls to them above all to duly provide for all that is required for the celebration of the Lord's Supper" and, in turn, to "remind priests, especially parish priests and rectors of churches, of their responsibility to verify those who provide the bread and wine for the celebration and the worthiness of the material." Part of the need for the letter, Cardinal Sarah writes, comes from the possibility of online purchases from unfamiliar sources, as well as the frequent use of low-gluten hosts. DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (employee, volunteers, vendors, religious or clergy). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608-519-8002 or kbecker@cclse.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of the Vicar for Clergy or on the diocesan website at: www.diolc.org. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. DIOCESAN BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS



School Asbestos Management Information

In compliance with federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act - AHERA), all diocesan schools are required to complete a 3-year inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials.

Every six months a periodic surveillance report for asbestos is to be completed by a school buildings and grounds/maintenance employee. This six-month report is to be kept on file with the school asbestos records.

Public Notification: Schools are required annually to complete and post a public announcement regarding the asbestos management plan and location. If you haven't done so, please complete and post the linked form and return a copy to: Kathy Haverland, Diocesan Buildings and Grounds Office, PO Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54601.

Notice of Asbestos Inspection Management Plan Location and Availability

REMINDER: All building projects over \$5000, need standard diocesan review before they can begin. Pastors and School Administrators should not approve contracts before diocesan approval is granted.
