New Leader of Prayer Class Begins in June

Applications are open for a new class of men and women who wish to serve as Leaders of Prayer for the Diocese of La Crosse. This is a three-part course of study by which lay persons are prepared and commissioned to serve their parishes by bringing Holy Communion to the

sick, conducting a Liturgy of the Word with Communion on weekdays when a priest is unavailable, and leading parishioners in prayer at times of illness or death. In nursing homes or healthcare facilities, when no priest is available, they may also conduct a Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest. Completion of the Lay Formation Institute is a prerequisite for acceptance into the Leader of Prayer program, and candidates must be sponsored by their pastors. Order for the Reception of the Holy Oils—USCCB

The Roman Missal directs that "The reception of the Holy Oils may take place in individual parishes either before the celebration of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper or at another time that seems more appropriate" (Chrism Mass, 15). While the Missal does not specify how a "reception of the Holy Oils" would take place, a simple ceremony that is sober yet joyful, consistent with the Roman liturgy, and emphasizing the grace of the sacraments and unity with the bishop, would seem to be the most appropriate way to receive the oils in a parish. One possible model is found in the *Order for the Reception of the Holy Oils*, available from the USCCB at this link.

Some Liturgical Reminders

Mass of the Lord's Supper

- Altar may be decorated with flowers. (Rubric for Holy Thursday [=HT], 5)
- At the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, there may be a procession of the faithful in which gifts for the poor may be presented with the bread and wine. (HT, 14)

- Adoration is not to take place in a monstrance: "The Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a closed tabernacle or pyx. Under no circumstances may it be exposed in a monstrance." (Paschales Solemnitatis, n.55)
- Holy water stoups are emptied after Mass.

Good Friday

- Good Friday liturgy may not be celebrated in the absence of a priest. (Rubric for Good Friday [=GF], 4)
- Only one cross may be used for adoration. (GF, 19)

Easter Vigil

- The Paschal Candle is to be replaced each year: "The paschal candle should be prepared, which for effective symbolism must be made of wax, never be artificial, be renewed each year, be only one in number, and be of sufficiently large size so that it may evoke the truth that Christ is the light of the world." (*Paschales Solemnitatis*, n.82)
- If a deacon is not present to carry the Paschal Candle in the procession, the candle is carried by another minister and not the priest. (Rubric for the Easter Vigil [=EV], 15 and following)
- Lights in the church building are turned on when Paschal Candle is placed in its stand at front of church at end of the entrance procession. (EV, 17)
- If possible, the Priest intones triple Alleluia. (EV, 34)
- It is appropriate for the baptism of infants to take place at the Easter Vigil. (*Rite of Baptism for Children*, n.9; also Roman Missal, Easter Vigil rubric n.38)

Faculties for Adult Confirmation

Presently, a priest has the permission, either in virtue of universal Church law or by grant of the diocesan bishop, to confirm the following persons:

- (a) those persons who are no longer infants and whom he baptizes (cf. Cann. 530, 1°; 566, §1; 882; 883, 2° and 885, §2; RCIA, Nos. 14, 24, 215 and 305);
- (b) those persons who have attained the use of reason but already have been baptized in another church or ecclesial communion, when they are received by him into full communion with the Catholic Church (cf. Cann. 883, 2° and 885, §2; *RCIA*, No. 481; *NSC*, No. 35);
- (c) the baptized Catholic who has been an apostate from the faith (cf. Can. 883, 2°; NSC, No. 28);
- (d) the baptized Catholic who through no fault of his or her own has been raised in a non-Catholic religion or joined a non-Catholic religion (ibid);
- (e) the baptized Catholic who through no fault of his or her own never put the faith into practice. (cf. Can. 884, §1; NSC, No. 29).
- (f) those who are in danger of death (cf. Cann. 566 §1 and 883, 3°)

If, however, a priest wishes to confirm <u>a baptized Catholic who has been practicing the faith</u> (that is, he or she is not in the circumstances described above), permission for the faculty to do so must be requested from the diocesan bishop (Can. 882, Can. 884, §1). Updated Information: Note on Sacramental Records for Candidates and Catechumens

Keeping up-to-date and accurate sacramental records is an important – and sometimes confusing – role of pastors and those who might assist them in the preparation and celebration of the sacraments. Reference to these records may be made in the future if, for example, one were asked to be a godparent, to apply for the seminary and later for ordination, or to be married. If questions arise in the future about the proper recording of the sacraments, please consult the Handbook for Sacramental Records or contact the Chancery Office.

At the reception of a non-baptized person into the Church, the following entries are to be made:

RCIA Celebration of Baptism of an Adult

For Baptism celebrated for a non-Baptized adult (RCIA), the following information is to be entered in the Baptismal Register (*Can. 877 §1*):

- 1. the given and/or Christian name(s) of the person (always use the maiden name of a woman);
- 2. the name of the father (first, middle if any, and surname) and the name of the mother (first, middle if any, and maiden name);
- 3. the date and place of birth;
- 4. the name of the sponsor(s);
- 5. the date and place of the Baptism;
- 6. the name of the minister performing the Baptism; and
- 7. marginal notations of reception of Eucharist and Confirmation^[8] and of marital status (either current valid marriage or the convalidation of the current marriage). Any declaration of invalidity (including where granted and protocol number) should be noted.

In addition to the entries made in the sacramental registers, please also enter all sacramental receptions into the ParishSoft database. Everyone who receives sacraments and lives within your parish domicile should have a family and member record in ParishSoft. Enter as much information as you have at the time of reception of the sacrament per Parish Census Software Standard Operating Procedures found at diolc.org/pims.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (employee, volunteers, vendors, religious or clergy). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La

Diocesan Annual Appeal – Endurance in Hope The Church continues to work to fulfill its mission. The Diocesan Annual Appeal is how we as a diocesan community fund our commitment to do our part of fulfilling the mission. The good works continue as our story is told through the appeal, connecting with those who want to invest in the many good works. Thank you to all parish leaders who continue to promote this vital ministry. Remember to keep developing this ministry, as it is the largest source of funding for our charitable works and ministries.

As of April 13, 2019:

- We are at 96% of our goal; we are down slightly from this time last year due to the timing of Holy Week.
- 52 Parishes have received more than \$405,000 in rebates so far this year
- 66 Parishes have raised \$266,2182 (14%) more money this year than last year at this time
- 387 new investors to the Annual Appeal. These people have never invested in the Diocesan Annual Appeal before. They bring with them over \$46,000 in funding.
- 1,012 investors who were lapsed for at least one year are now re-engaged
- 17,731 (79%) of our supporters from last year have reinvested this year
- 6,145 investors have invested more this year than last year at this time. The average increase is \$166.22
- The average pledge is \$452, compared to \$417 last year
- 55 new people are investing through recurring installments. These are people who give monthly year round and tend to invest more on average, and their summer activity can give you momentum as we start the next year appeal.

The Holy Week mailing should be in mailboxes; if they are not, they will be arriving this week. We mailed all LYBUNTS and new parish members from all parishes. We will also mail all SYBUNT and "Nevers." To read the letters that went out, please see the appeal portal website. Last year Holy Week began on March 25, that is twenty days earlier than this year, so expect to see a pickup in the Diocesan Annual Appeal investments in the next few weeks. Your efforts to help promote the good works of the appeal continue to be necessary, whether or not your parish has met its goal. People investing after lapsing or for the first time give significantly less. Those who give annually give more and lower the cost of securing their participation.

As you know Holy Thursday Mass is the commemoration of the establishment of the Eucharistic sacrament and the vocation of the Priesthood. Our Holy Week mailing features some of our priests and the journey of their priesthood. We have a video "Works of Faith" on our website and it has been put on our Facebook Social Media page, which you can share through Facebook, MyParish App, Instagram, Twitter, and post on your website. Please share the Work of Faith video during the next few weeks. This message shows how hope is brought to so many. Hear from Bishop Callahan, Father Kyle Laylan of Holy Family Parish in Arcadia

and Most Sacred Heart Parish in Pine Creek, Father Barry Saylor of St. John the Baptist Parish in Marshfield, Father Clayton Elmhorst of St. Mary Parish in Lyndon Station, Father Steve Brice of Holy Spirit Parish in Stevens Point, Father Sebastian Kolodziejczyk of Holy Family Parish in Arcadia and Most Sacred Heart Parish in Pine Creek, Father Jeffrey Hennes of St. Adalbert Parish in Rosholt and St. Mary Parish in Torun and senior priest Msgr. Del Malin tell their story of Faith and service through their priestly vocation.

The next Diocesan Annual Appeal mailing will be targeted for a mail drop before Memorial Day weekend. The mail focus will be all LYBUNTS, and parishes below target. If you wish to include a letter from the pastor in this last mailing of the appeal year, please contact our office. The video messaging will be "Labor of Love," available on our website, which examines the good works of Catholic Charities.
