Adult Faith Formation during Lent

Something else to consider: Many adults that need to be re-engaged would be more inclined to come to a once-a month event that addresses topics or questions that peak their interest. This format makes sense as it follows the first stage of the RCIA process, which is the model for adult catechesis. The place to start is with the basics and their burning questions, such as why we go to Confession, or what the Church really teaches about certain issues and how adults should respond to their children's difficult questions. The conversation can always circle back to God's love for each person and the goodness of His Truth, which is compelling and can help to stir conversion. Catchy titles for the sessions are essential and perhaps taking a *Theology on Tap* type approach by hosting it at a coffee shop or local sports bar might be beneficial. Offering child-care is always a plus. There are several parishes offering this model and it is having significant results.

Forming a Culture of Prayer

"We shall not be saved by a formula, but by a Person" – Jesus Christ. (Novo Millennio Ineunte, n. 29) Please check out the "<u>Going Deeper in Prayer</u>" initiative that was developed in response to surveys of young people who want to encounter the Person of Christ, more than just saying words that may not have any meaning for them. Parents are to receive and be engaged with the resources before it is supported and implemented by parish programs and Catholic Schools. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd – June 13 – 15 and August 22 – 24 in Wisconsin Rapids

Please consider sending two people from your parish to receive Level I training in Wisconsin Rapids. <u>See flyer</u> for details. The presenter is excellent but space is limited and some people from out of state have already signed up. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is grounded upon the role of "wonder" in a child's religious development and engagement with concrete "hands on" activities. Children respond profoundly to the mystical meanings they have deduced for themselves from the concrete materials they have used. There are parishes in the Diocese who implemented Catechesis of the Good Shepherd with noteworthy results. The response of children to this form of the *kerygma* indicates that the message of Christ still has a potent attractive power in our own day.

Rite of Election Retreat, March 2

In preparation for the Rite of Election and of the Call to Continuing Conversion (March 10), many parishes (or groups of parishes) offer retreats for their catechumens and candidates. For those parishes that do not offer a retreat in the parish, there will be three retreats open to catechumens and candidates on the morning of Saturday, March 2: at St. Peter Parish in Stevens Point, St. Mary Parish in Altoona, and the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe in La Crosse. Although schedules may vary slightly at each retreat site, the day will include Mass, three spiritual talks, time for reflection, and lunch. A site-specific schedule will be sent upon registration or upon request. The registration form is available <u>here</u>; deadline is February 22. Please encourage those in your RCIA process to reserve this date.

Rite of Election, March 10

The Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion will be held at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman on Sunday, March 10, at 2:00. It is an occasion that marks entry into the period of Purification and Enlightenment (for newly-named "elect") that coincides with Lent. It is a wonderful opportunity for candidates and catechumens to see the larger Church, meet Bishop Callahan, be introduced to their new Cathedral, and receive the grace of the Rite. Reminder: Clarification Concerning Sacred Vessels at Mass

From the Holy See's 2004 Instruction "On certain matters to be observed or to be avoided regarding the Most Holy Eucharist" (*Redemptionis Sacramentum*): "It is strictly required [that the material from which sacred vessels are made] be truly noble in the common estimation within a given region, so that honor will be given to the Lord by their use, and all risk of diminishing the doctrine of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharistic species in the eyes of the faithful will be avoided. Reprobated, therefore, is any practice of using for the celebration of Mass common vessels, or others lacking in quality, or devoid of all artistic merit or which are mere containers, as also other vessels made from glass, earthenware, clay, or other materials that break easily. This norm is to be applied even as regards metals and other materials that easily rust or deteriorate." (117)

Reminder: Low-Gluten Hosts and Gluten-Free Hosts

In the estimation of the Church, gluten is an essential element in wheat bread. Consequently, "Hosts that are *completely* gluten-free are invalid matter for the celebration of the Eucharist. Low-gluten hosts (*partially* gluten-free) are valid matter, provided they contain a sufficient amount of gluten to obtain the confection of bread...." This 2003 clarification from the Holy See does not indicate how many parts per million represent "a sufficient amount of gluten." Inconsistent terminology confuses the matter further: the Food and Drug Administration allows foods with less than 20 parts per million to be labeled "gluten free," while the Celiac Support Association requires fewer than 5 parts per million to be called "gluten free." In the end, breads used for the celebration of the Eucharist must have some gluten for validity (i.e., to confect the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ). The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops <u>recommends</u> a number of approved low-gluten manufacturers, including the <u>Benedictine Sisters of Perpetual Adoration</u>, who make breads at 10 parts per million. The Precious Blood should be made available for recipients unable to receive any gluten at all. This chalice ought not have any particles of the host in it (*fermentum*). Also, the celiac sufferer ought to receive from the chalice prior to anyone who has received a host.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (employee, volunteers, vendors, religious or clergy). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608-519-8002 or <u>kbecker@cclse.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of the Vicar for Clergy or on the diocesan website at: <u>www.diolc.org</u>. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. Reminder: 2018-19 Safe Environment reports are due March 1, 2019. All paid employees and coaches and Janitors regardless if they are paid or not, need to be fingerprinted - there are <u>no exceptions and nobody is grandfathered in anymore</u>. Your report will not be complete until print cards are submitted for those that need to be printed.

The **Mite Box program** is an outreach from the Missionary Childhood Association, one of the Pontifical Mission Societies represented in the Mission Office. It is a mandatory annual program in our Catholic Schools, CCD and Religious Education programs for children and youth. The **Rice Bowl program** is sponsored by Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Rice Bowl is an elective program that has a Lenten focus but could also be held at another time of year if desired. In any case, it is not to conflict with or replace the Mite Box program.
