"A home is more than merely a shelter; it is a foundation that allows one to focus on the future." The Diocese of La Crosse Catholic Charites works to transition the most chronic of homeless in our diocese from a life on the street: a life that is full of despair, shame, and volatility to one filled with hope, dignity, and stability.

## FORMATION

The largest single need that is supported by the Diocesan Annual Appeal is the support of our seminarian education and formation. Our diocese, to have the blessing of 29 men in seminarian education and formation, requires us to invest financially on average \$40,000 a year per man to support their needs. The annual appeal provides about half of the \$1.2 million needed to form good and holy men to the priesthood.

David is one of 29 seminarians in our diocese to undertake the discernment of the priesthood. David has overcome physical and spiritual obstacles on his journey to be a priest.
