

Praying with Scripture

Reflecting on a passage of Scripture each day allows you to encounter the Person of Jesus and to go deeper in your friendship with Him. You will come to know how much He loves you, that He is faithful and that you can trust Him. *(Read one passage each day. After 7 days, start over.)*

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen

The Father, Son and Holy Spirit live in us through Baptism. Close your eyes and take some time in silence to be aware of Jesus within your heart and to greet Him. Thank Jesus for a blessing in your life.

Day 1: Healing of Bartimeus the Blind Man

Mark 10: 46 - 52 “As Jesus and His disciples, together with a large crowd, were leaving Jericho, a blind man, Bartimaeus (which means “son of Timaeus”), was sitting by the roadside begging. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout, “Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!” Many rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, “Son of David, have mercy on me!” Jesus stopped and said, “Call him.” So they called to the blind man, “Cheer up! On your feet! He’s calling you.” Throwing his cloak aside, he jumped to his feet and came to Jesus. “What do you want me to do for you?” Jesus asked him. The blind man said, “Rabbi, I want to see.” Jesus said, “Go, your faith has healed you.” Immediately he received his sight and followed Jesus along the road. *(What stood out?)*



Day 2: Jesus Calms the Storm

Matthew 8:23- 27 Then Jesus got into the boat and His disciples followed Him. Suddenly a furious storm came up on the lake, so that the waves swept over the boat. But Jesus was sleeping. The disciples went and woke Him, saying, “Lord, save us! We’re going to drown!” He replied, “You of little faith, why are you so afraid?” Then He got up and rebuked the winds and the waves, and it was completely calm. The men were amazed and asked, “What kind of Man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey Him!” *(What stood out?)*

Day 3: Jesus Changes Water Into Wine

John 2: 1 – 11 On the third day a wedding took place at Cana in Galilee. Jesus’ mother was there, and Jesus and His disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine was gone, Jesus’ mother said to Him, “They have no more wine.” “Woman, why do you involve me?” Jesus replied. “My hour has not yet come.” His mother said to the servants, “Do whatever he tells you.” Nearby stood six stone water jars, each holding from twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, “Fill the jars with water”; so they filled them to the brim. Then He told them, “Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet.” They did so, and the master of the banquet tasted the water that had been turned into wine. He did not realize where it had come from, though the servants knew. Then he called the bridegroom aside and said, “Everyone brings out the choice wine first and then the cheaper wine after the guests have had too much to drink; but you have saved the best till now.” What Jesus did here in Cana of Galilee was the first of the signs through which He revealed His glory; and His disciples believed in Him. *(What stood out?)*

Day 4: Jesus Calls Levi and Eats With Sinners

Luke 5: 27 – 32 After this, Jesus went out and saw a tax collector by the name of Levi sitting at his tax booth. “Follow me,” Jesus said to him, and Levi got up, left everything and followed him. Then Levi held a great banquet for Jesus at his house, and a large crowd of tax collectors and others were eating with them. But the Pharisees and the teachers of the law



who belonged complained to His disciples, “Why do you eat and drink with tax collectors and sinners?” Jesus answered them, “It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.” (*What stood out?*)

Day 5: Jesus Heals Ten Men With Leprosy

Luke 17: 11 – 19 Now on his way to Jerusalem, Jesus traveled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As He was going into a village, ten men who had leprosy [a serious skin disease] met Him. They stood at a distance and called out in a loud voice, “Jesus, Master, have pity on us!” When he saw them, He said, “Go, show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were cleansed. One of them, when he saw he was healed, came back, praising God in a loud voice. He threw himself at Jesus’ feet and thanked him—and he was a Samaritan. Jesus asked, “Were not all ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? Has no one returned to give praise to God except this foreigner?” Then he said to him, “Rise and go; your faith has made you well.”

(*What stood out?*)



Day 6: The Transfiguration

Matthew 17: 1 – 8 Jesus took Peter, James and John the brother of James, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. There He was transfigured before them. His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became as white as the light. Just then there appeared before them Moses and Elijah, talking with Jesus. Peter said to Jesus, “Lord, it is good for us to be here. If you wish, I will put up three tents here—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” While he was still speaking, a bright cloud covered them, and a voice from the cloud said, “This is My beloved Son, with him I am well pleased. Listen to him!” When the disciples heard this, they fell facedown to the ground, terrified. But

Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.” When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus. (*What stood out for you?*)

Day 7 Jesus forgives sins.

Mark 1: 3 – 12 Some men came, bringing to Him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. Since they could not get near to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus and then lowered the mat the man was lying on. When Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralyzed man, “Son, your sins are forgiven.” Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves, “Why does this man speak that way? He’s blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?” Jesus immediately knew in his mind what they were thinking to them-selves, and He said to them, “Why are you thinking such things in your hearts? Which is easier: to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are forgiven,’ or to say, ‘Get up, take your mat and walk’? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority to forgive sins on earth” – he said to the paralytic, “I say to you, rise, pick up your mat and go home.” He rose, took his mat at once and went away in the sight of everyone. They were all astounded and praised God, saying, “We have never seen anything like this!” (*What stood out?*)

When to pray...

With most things in life, when we schedule something, it takes place. Choose a specific time for this.

A wonderful way to support your son or daughter in personal prayer is to let them know that you will read a Scripture each day also.

You can further support your young adult in personal prayer by initiating discussions during this year. Here is a “conversation starter.” I understand that you are reflecting on a Bible passage each day. I am also committed to this. What stands out for you in these Scriptures? (Then offer what stands out for you.)
