

## My Daily Prayer Time

The focus of prayer for Fourth Grade is thinking about the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary.

Reflecting on one Mystery of Jesus' life each day will help you to develop and deepen your relationship with Jesus. You will grow in your awareness of how much Jesus loves you. You will also be guided by the Holy Spirit to make the connection between each Mystery and your own life.

Begin your prayer time with the Sign of the Cross.

Make the Sign of the Cross respectfully as you are honoring the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

### The Mysteries of the Holy Rosary

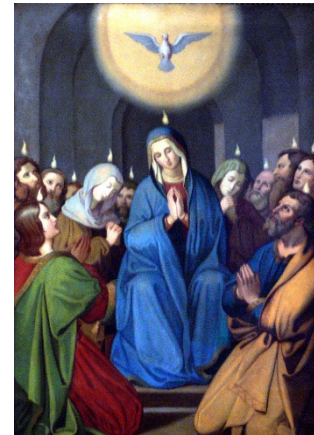
During the Easter Season, take time to think about one of the Glorious Mysteries each day.



**Jesus, You rose from the dead** three days after You died on the Cross for my sins. Sunday is the feast of the Resurrection. Help me to go to Mass every Sunday.



Forty days after rising from the dead, **Jesus ascends into Heaven**. Strengthen me to know and believe that You are with us in the Eucharist.



**The Holy Spirit descends on Mary and the Apostles.** God the Holy Spirit, transform me into a courageous disciple of Jesus.



**Mary is taken body & soul into Heaven.** As my spiritual Mother, pray for me that I will be faithful to Jesus.

**Mary is crowned Queen of Heaven & earth.** Mary, guide me on the path to Heaven.



Dear Parents,

As the primary educators of your children, we thank you for allowing us to partner with you to help your children come to know the Person of Jesus Christ through studying the Catholic Faith, daily conversation with Him in prayer and reception of the Sacraments.

Learning about God needs to be accompanied by daily prayer in the home in order for your child to develop and grow in a personal friendship with Him. This relationship with the Son of God in turn strengthens your child, and every member of the family, on the true path to happiness. That is why your child will be learning several prayers this year. Focusing on one of the *Mysteries of the Rosary* and praying one decade of the Rosary (1 Our Father and 10 Hail Mary's) will be a specific focus throughout the entire year for Fourth Grade.

### **Why focus each day on one major event (a Rosary Mystery) of Jesus' life?**

In focusing on one Mystery of Jesus' life and praying a decade of the Rosary each day, we will come to realize better and better how much God the Father loves us. Sin separated us from God and we needed a Savior. Jesus is our Savior. The Mysteries of the Rosary focus on key events in the life of Jesus. The Joyful Mysteries focus on the Incarnation and birth of Jesus – God becoming man to save us. The Luminous Mysteries are about the major events of Jesus public ministry. The Sorrowful Mysteries relate Jesus' Passion and death on the Cross. He died for each one of us so that our sins could be forgiven. The Glorious Mysteries help us to understand Jesus' Resurrection from the Dead, His Ascension into Heaven and the sending of God the Holy Spirit. The last two Glorious Mysteries focus on Mary. God chose Mary to be the Mother of the Savior and these Mysteries focus on her significant role in His plan.

It is helpful to have a picture or statue of Jesus to help stay focused on Him during prayer time. To be consistent, it is essential to choose a specific time that best fits your family life, such as

- At a meal time
- In the evening or at bedtime

### **Prayers for praying a Decade of the Rosary**

#### **The Our Father**

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name; Thy Kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

#### **The Hail Mary**

Hail Mary, full of grace! The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

#### **The Glory Be**

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
