Motu Proprio regarding sexual abuse

In May 2019, the Holy Father established new universal law for the global Church to protect children and vulnerable people from the evils of clergy sexual abuse, while holding all members of the clergy accountable regardless if they are the direct abuser or involved in the cover-up of such crimes. These norms add more layers of response to The Charter that has already been implemented by the American Church since 2002. The Motu Proprio serves as a global baseline to be implemented and complemented by additional reforms relevant to individual countries, so that differing cultures and civil reporting laws are taken into consideration. Reminder: What is next with MyParish app? Introducing EVANGELUS

In 2015, FAITH Catholic, the publishing partner for Catholic Life, was proud to collaborate with Diocesan to make MyParish app available to all parishes of the Diocese of La Crosse for free. Now Diocesan has announced an exciting new solution for dioceses and parishes called EVANGELUS. It enables parishes to use a single new communications tool to reach parishioners through email, text, MyParish app, social media and websites. To find out more, click here.

The typical cost is \$99/month per parish. Exclusively for the Diocese of La Crosse and its parishes, the cost is \$59/month per parish. MyParish app will still be available for free when you purchase EVANGELUS. If your parish wants to continue with MyParish app without

EVANGELUS, it will remain free as a stand-alone solution through 2020. After January 1, 2021, your parish can continue to use it for \$37/month.

A representative from MyParish/EVANGELUS will be contacting your parish to go over the program and answer your questions. They will assist your parish with the transition, should you wish to do so. In the meantime, you can also contact Mike DiCosola directly.

Reminder: Cleanup of Staff Records in ParishSOFT

We will assist parishes who need to update their Staff records to the Staff only standard. Our goal is to bring all Staff records up to standard by August 1; there are 865 records that need attention. In the next few weeks we will be sending you a list of your particular parish staff records that need attention. Please begin now by reviewing your parish Staff records and making changes as needed to meet the Staff only standard.

Diocesan Parish Census Software <u>Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)</u> state "All Staff records should be administered separately from a parishioner's Family/Member record. Use Add New Staff to generate a separate, unregistered, Staff specific, record." Reference SOP pages 73-79 for details, and specifically page 76 for standard Staff Family/Member field values. There is a new training video, <u>Staff Standards</u>, available on <u>https://diolc.org/pims</u> which illustrates how to meet parish Staff record standards.

ParishSOFT Staff records are being used more and more by curia offices. Accurate and well-formed records, for both paid and volunteer staff, are important. Staff records for priests and deacons are maintained by curia offices, but all other parish Staff records are the responsibility of each parish. A complete listing of required and suggested positions, Parish Staff Listing, is maintained online at https://diolc.org/pims. Position listings have been recently updated to include Synod references and norms which established them. Position listing updates include these notable changes:

- <u>PCCW Women's Ministry Contact</u> has been newly added, per synod documents. According to Synod V section 8 under Associations of the Faithful #199-227 and in particular #217 "The mission statement of the PCCW is to support and educate all Catholic women in spirituality, leadership and service."
- Vocations Contact has been newly added, per synod documents. According to Synod V section 7 under Vocations and Ministries #76-96 and in particular #80 "Parishes are to have a vocations committee or at least one member of the pastoral council who has the special responsibility for promotion and fostering vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life."

The Office for Vocations recommends each pastor appoint either one member of the current pastoral council or an additional member to serve on the pastoral council whose focus is on promoting vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life. This person should distribute

vocational prayers for seminarians and consecrated life through parish social media and parish bulletins, and should promote vocation retreats in their parish. The Office for Vocations will provide ongoing support and vocation literature as requested by parishes, youth groups, catechetical classrooms, schools and for young adult events happening in your parish or deanery.

• Pastoral Council Chairperson has been renamed to <u>Parish Council Assistant to the President</u> in accord with synod nomenclature.

Liturgical Observance of Blessed Solanus Casey, July 30

The feast day of <u>Blessed Solanus Casey</u> is July 30. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal permits a votive Mass in his honor to be said: "On weekdays in Ordinary Time, there may be chosen either the Mass of the weekday, or the Mass of an Optional Memorial which happens to occur on that day, or the Mass of any Saint inscribed in the Martyrology for that day..." (n.355c). If a Mass for Blessed Solanus Casey is said, the orations can be taken from either the "Common of Pastors" or the "Common of Holy Men, for Religious." Readings may be taken from Tuesday of the 17th Week in Ordinary Time or from the same Common sections in the Lectionary.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (clergy, employee, religious, vendors or volunteers). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608.519.8002 or kbecker@cclse.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of the Vicar for Clergy or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. James Miller was born into a family of farmers near Stevens Point on September 21, 1944, attended Pacelli High School, and joined the De La Salle Christian Brothers in 1959. He served as a missionary in Nicaragua and then Guatemala, where he was shot and killed by 3 hooded men on Feb. 13, 1982, during Guatemala's civil war. Pope Francis decreed that he died a martyr for the Faith and has set his beatification for Dec. 7, 2019 in Huehuetenango, Guatemala. Diocesan Annual Appeal – Endurance in Hope

Thank you to everyone who helped with this year's annual appeal. For the third straight year we have raised funding nearing the \$6.2 million mark. The Diocesan Annual Appeal is how we, as a diocesan community, fund our commitment to do our part of fulfilling Christ's mission for the Church. The good works continue; how we live out the Gospel is in part through the appeal. As Henri Nouwen said, "Fundraising is a very concrete way to help the kingdom of God come about." The Diocesan annual appeal is an important avenue to invite people to participate in the Church's mission. Again, thank you to all parish leaders who continue to promote this vital ministry. Remember to keep developing this ministry, as it is our community's largest source of funding for our charitable works and ministries.

Final Numbers for 2018-19 Diocesan Annual Appeal:

- We raised \$6,182,228.03 for the 2018-19 Appeal: *Endurance of Hope.* This is \$15,456 more than the previous year.
- 117 Parishes are receiving rebates.
- 590 new investors to the Annual Appeal. These people have never invested in the Diocesan Annual Appeal before and represent 1.4% of funds received (\$85,607).
- 1,433 investors who were lapsed for at least one year are now re-engaged for \$200,783 or 3.2% of funds received
- 18,608 (85.7%) of our supporters from last year have reinvested again this year

The importance of Stewardship:

- Of all parishes that went over their Diocesan Annual Appeal goal, parishes who have a Stewardship effort went over by 20.9% more than parishes who do not have a Stewardship effort.
- Parishes with a Stewardship effort have investors who give on average 9.5% more than parishes who do not have a Stewardship effort.
- Parishes with a Stewardship effort have investors who are 8.5% more likely to give by
 pledging than parishes who do not have Stewardship effort. FYI: The average pledge
 is \$472.65 compared to the one-time gift \$263.20; that is 78% more from people who
 pledge than those who make one-time gifts.
- Parishes who have a Stewardship effort have an average of 4.71 new investors to the Diocesan Annual Appeal. Parishes who do not have Stewardship effort average only 2.79 new investors, that is 69.2% more new people invested into the parish.
- Parishes who have a Stewardship effort have on average 11.34 lapsed investors reengage the Diocesan Annual Appeal. Parishes who do not have Stewardship effort average only 6.86 reengaged lapsed investors. That is 65.4% more.
- Parishes with a Stewardship effort on average reported over double the number of lapsed parishioners being reconciled last year than parishes who do not have a Stewardship effort.

 Parishes who have a Stewardship effort on average nearly doubled the number of Baptisms 13.5 versus 6.8 and celebrated the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony on average more often; 3.92 versus 2.11 times.
