The Human Person – God's Masterpiece addresses three questions. The answers to these questions affect the way that we think about ourselves and every person we meet.

Planning for the Fall

It is highly recommended that a schedule for your parish Faith Formation Program be set up to include roughly 30 sessions during the academic year. Youth "must be ensured a catechesis attuned to them, so that they will be able to grow in faith and live by it more and more, in spite of the lack of support or even the opposition they meet in their surroundings." (On Catechesis in Our Time, n. 42) 30 sessions allow time to complete the textbook, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation possibly during Advent and Lent, pray the Stations of the Cross, and allow for a few cancelled sessions due to inclement weather.

Formation of Adults

"... One of the constant concerns whose urgency is confirmed by present day experience throughout the world is the catechesis of adults. This is the principal form of catechesis because it is addressed to persons who have the greatest responsibilities and the capacity to live the Christian message in its fully developed form." (CT 43)

Best Practices for parent formation includes the following: Prepare a simple meal for families, such as spaghetti and a salad. After the meal, provide a dynamic presenter for the parents about a topic that interests them, while the children receive Faith Formation. This setting allows families to eat together, strengthens the faith of parents as they receive ongoing formation and builds community among parishioners. Start with 2 or 3 sessions the first year and move to monthly sessions in the second year. The initiative needs to be required; the free meal provides another compelling reason to attend.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (clergy, employee, religious, vendors or volunteers). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La

Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608.519.8002 or kbecker@cclse.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679; or tbrown@diolc.org.

ParishSoft is a database that is used daily by the diocesan curia. I'm asking each parish to verify that the name of the Safe Environment Contact for their parish is in the staff listing of ParishSoft and assigned the Safe Environment Contact position. Even if the DRE/CRE or Parish Secretary does the Safe Environment work, they should have the Safe Environment Contact position label behind their name. A person can be assigned multiple positions within their Parish. I will be sending out many important and informational emails in the next few weeks to names in this database, and I'd like to ensure that every parish contact receives the information.

James Miller was born into a family of farmers near Stevens Point on September 21, 1944, attended Pacelli High School, and joined the De La Salle Christian Brothers in 1959. He served as a missionary in Nicaragua and then Guatemala, where he was shot and killed by 3 hooded men on Feb. 13, 1982, during Guatemala's civil war. Pope Francis decreed that he died a martyr for the Faith and has set his beatification for Dec. 7, 2019 in Huehuetenango, Guatemala. amount added last July 1. It is no longer a flat \$150.00, but includes the 2.0% cost of living adjustment. Payroll centers should not be adding Self-Employment Tax to priest salaries. Please note, that priest wages and auto and food allowances are subject only to Federal and State income taxation, not FICA contributions.
