Protocols for missionary priest help-outs for your parish

This is just a reminder regarding invitations to missionary priests who may come to give pastors a weekend break. They are important and helpful options, but they need to follow diocesan protocol during their visits. The Mission Office has no connection to or official relationship with Catholic associations like Food for the Poor, Cross Catholic Outreach, Unbound Ministries or other such organizations. Their individual policies for the collection of funds should be clearly stated before their arrival and pastors should communicate the information to staff and parishioners in preparation for their appeal. As always, Safe Environment policies need to be followed. Therefore, Letters of Suitability for priests need to be on file with the Vicar for Clergy office if they are celebrating the sacraments.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (clergy, employee, religious, vendors or volunteers). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to the Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Karen Becker, Victim Assistance Ministry, 608.519.8002 or <u>kbecker@cclse.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>.
