#### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse,

WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <a href="mailto:intakeagent@diolc.org">intakeagent@diolc.org</a>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <a href="mailto:diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting">diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</a>. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <a href="mailto:diocesan website">diocesan website</a>. Reminder: The Above Safe Environment Bulletin announcement has changed—the most current announcement is above. This must be published in your parish bulletin at least once a quarter, and 2 bulletins need to be sent in with your yearly Safe Environment Report.

**Reminder: Dispose of all old forms-** Please dispose all old Safe Environment forms and begin using the new forms. Old Basic Background Check forms, without the disclaimer, are still being used. This form changed July 2018. Beginning January 1, 2020, any background checks sent on an old form will be rejected and sent back to your parish or school to be completed on the correct form.

**2019-20 Safe Environment Report**: As of November 7, all parishes should have received a spreadsheet for their parish, including the report form and online training dates for staff and volunteers. If you have not received your spreadsheet or have questions or need more information, contact the Safe Environment Office.

**Maintaining Boundaries:** Respecting the personal space of others is maintaining boundaries. Boundaries are limits, or lines that should not be crossed. Appropriate boundaries with youth help create an environment where they can focus on learning, and have healthy social, emotional and spiritual growth.

Be mindful of your tone, communication and actions. We are Catholic role models and are responsible for our behavior, speech and actions when with children. Remember that words as well as actions can be misinterpreted. Set good examples.

Ways to maintain healthy boundaries with students:

- Have students address you as Mr., Mrs., Miss, etc.
- If you must meet with a student alone, always keep the door open and sit in a visible location.
- Never "friend" students on social media
- Do not send private messages to students other than on school approved platforms and for education – related reasons. Copy parents on student communications.
- Do not meet them outside of school.
- Don't give rides in your vehicle.
- Limit physical contact to high fives, fist pumps, and handshakes.
