What is the Main Point?

When we teach the Faith in order to lead others to Jesus, we need to present the main point in a short sentence. This important sentence, which is referred to as a proclamation, is to express the essence of the lesson. For example, we can let the students know that today we will talk about creation and then pause and announce this proclamation: "God created us out of love." (This could be used for young children.) and "God created us to be united with Him in a deep friendship." (This could be used with young people.) The entire lesson is about explaining this main point, and it is repeated over and over again so that the students will never forget it. It is a truth about God - "a pearl" – that they (and we) are meant to unlock the rest of our lives. Presenting the proclamation and staying focused on it for the entire lesson helps us from overloading the students with too much information that they will never remember. Reminder: Proper Handling of Monies - Review of parish/school accounts and financial control guidelines

In an effort to protect you and your volunteers, please read the Review of Parish/School Accounts and Financial Control Guidelines by <u>clicking here</u>. The section on Cash Receipts/Money Counting should be followed for all events within your Parish including but not limited to bazaars, raffles, outings, etc. Please ensure those responsible for oversight on each event is made aware of the policy and is following the guidelines established.

Simply put, the policy is asking all parishes to use the buddy system when collecting, counting and transporting money. To follow policy there needs to be two unrelated persons involved

in the process. Please check with your parish finance secretary and pastor for the specific manner that your parish has in place to meet these guidelines.

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception: December 9, 2019

Since December 8, 2019, is the Second Sunday of Advent, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred to Monday, December 9, 2019. The obligation to attend Mass, however, does NOT transfer. The Optional Memorial of Saint Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin, December 9, is omitted this year. (From the USCCB)

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u><u>environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. CHANGES TO SAFE ENVIRONMENT WEBSITE AND FORMS

Reminder: The Above Safe Environment Bulletin announcement was changed on Oct. 22, 2019 — the current announcement is above. This must be published in your parish bulletin at least once a quarter, and 2 bulletins need to be sent in with your yearly Safe Environment Report.

<u>New Safe Environment Poster</u> – please note there is a new <u>Safe Environment Poster with</u> updated contact information. Please update your parish and school posters at your earliest convenience. If you are unable to print the poster at your parish or school, you may contact the Safe Environment office and we will print copies for you. **New Safe Environment Forms** - <u>The Basic Background Check #1</u>, <u>Annual Training #2</u>, <u>Confidential Questionnaire #3</u>, <u>FBI Release #4</u>, and <u>Verification of Parent Safe Environment</u> <u>Training / Student Declination #5</u>, have been updated. Please visit the <u>Safe Environment</u> <u>Forms webpage</u> to print off the most current forms or contact the Safe Environment Office and they can be mailed to you. Please dispose of all of the old forms and begin using the new forms. Old Basic Background Check forms without the disclaimer are still being used. This form changed July 2018. Beginning January 1, 2020 any background sent on an old form will be rejected and sent back to your parish or school to be completed on the correct form.

Form # 4, the FBI release form is only filled out and returned with fingerprint cards.
