Of Highest Importance

The work of handing on the Faith – catechesis – is more than passing on information; it is assisting others into a relationship with Jesus. Of highest importance is the relationship of every person with Jesus, and their understanding that they are deeply loved by God.

Each of us, whether parent, parish catechist, catechetical leader, Catholic school teacher, administrator, priest, friend or neighbor is called to help students of all ages encounter the *living God* and feel His call to develop a loving relationship with Him. This responsibility requires that we are forming a deeper relationship with Christ, regardless of the point we are at in our relationship with Him. Therefore, let us be committed to daily, personal prayer.

A privileged place to encounter Jesus is through praying with Scripture. During the Advent and Christmas Season, consider using a simple prayer worksheet and praying with one of the passages provided. The Tradition of the "Nativity Scene"

Families are encouraged to set up the Christmas crib at home together so that children learn the facts of the mystery of God's love that was revealed in the poverty and simplicity of the Bethlehem Grotto. The Nativity Scene can help us understand the true meaning of Christmas because it expresses the humility and merciful goodness of Jesus Christ, who *though He was rich He made Himself poor* for us (2 Corinthians 8:9). Christmas brings joy, peace and hope to those who, like the shepherds in Bethlehem, accept the angel's words: "Be not afraid, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger." (Luke 2: 10-12) This is still the true meaning of Christmas. We need a Savior; the Son of God came to us as a tiny infant in the poorest of circumstances. Jesus is the Savior because in Him and through Him is the grace necessary for us to overcome all of the dysfunction, sinfulness, shame and guild which separates us from God and from one another. In Him is the grace to

overcome all obstacles to friendship with God. In Bethlehem "a Savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord."

BEET Grants

The Bishop's Education Endowment Trust Grants were established to support parishes and schools, where there is a need, to strengthen the mission of Catholic education and formation. For example, if the Faith Formation Program would like to purchase Bibles for the 8th Grade, but there is not enough money in the budget, a BEET Grant can be submitted to help pay these costs.

The General Instructions and Grant Application for BEET Grants are now available online by clicking this link: <u>diolc.org/schools/beet-grant</u>. Please read the instructions carefully because there are specific signatures needed and dates that are firm for the grant application. Grants are due to the Office for Catholic Schools by February 7th. Applications cannot be accepted for any reason after that date. Remember that your parish priest and dean must sign the application. Be aware of their schedule in case they will be out of town in January.

International Priests

We have been given a sizeable donation of religious articles, including Rosaries, Crucifixes, medals and chains, and magnets with the image of the Divine Mercy etc. The donor asked that these articles be distributed outside the U.S. Fathers, if you will be traveling to your home country soon, please plan to take some of these religious articles with you. The first donation of religious items, totaling \$60,000 was given to Diocesan parishes and schools and a few missions.

Mark Your Calendars: Clergy Workshops on the revised Order of Baptism of Children

Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, serving as USCCB President, has issued a decree formally publishing the *Order of Baptism of Children, Second Edition*. The new rite will be available for purchase after January 6; available for use on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2; and must be used beginning Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020.

Workshops will be held for priests and deacons (only) in three locations in early 2020: February 18 at St. Joseph Church in Stevens Point; March 3 at St. Olaf Church in Eau Claire; March 17 at St. Patrick Church in Onalaska. The day will begin at 10:30 and conclude by 3:00, and the schedule will include an in-depth look at the revised ritual (Chris Carstens), clarifications on frequently-asked canonical questions (Vicars General), lunch, and a review of the Diocesan baptismal preparation program (Ann Lankford). Registration information will be available in January.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u>

<u>environment/reporting</u>. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. 2019-20 Safe Environment Report: As of November 15, an email has been sent to all parishes and schools with their spreadsheet for the 2019-20 Safe Environment Report. Included in the email were the report forms and online training dates for staff and volunteers. If you have not received your spreadsheet, have questions or need more information, contact the Safe Environment Office. Reports are beginning to trickle in, thank you for not putting this off to the last minute.

Please take a minute or two to review your parish spreadsheet. Are all of your staff and volunteers current on their background checks? All background checks must be current when you submit your report. Any background check that will expire by June 30, 2020, must be renewed before you turn in your report, since it falls in the audit time period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. Also check on your training dates - everyone's training must be current when your report is submitted or the report will not be considered complete. If you have any questions, contact the Safe Environment Office.

Accounting Software Project Update

We are still in the due diligence phase of this project, surveying current parish accounting practices. Our focus is understanding how the Chart of Accounts (COA) are applied in the parish, school, cemetery and other operations and then how those accounts are reconciled into the Annual Report to the Bishop. There are apparent variances in practices between parishes, perhaps due to sparse documentation of how the COA should best be applied. Separately, we've engaged both prospective vendors, ParishSOFT and QuickBooks, to produce a prototype Annual Report using their respective accounting platform by the end of December.
