## Reminder: Clergy Study Day on the revised Order of Baptism of Children

The Order of Baptism of Children, Second Edition is now available for purchase. It may be used as early as the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on February 2; it must be used beginning Easter Sunday, April 12, 2020.

Workshops will be held for priests and deacons in three locations in February and March (a workshop for DRE's and other parish staff will be offered on another occasion in 2020):

- March 3 at St. Olaf Church in Eau Claire
- March 17 at St. Patrick Church in Onalaska

The day will begin at 10:30 and conclude by 3:00, and the schedule will include an in-depth look at the revised ritual (Chris Carstens), clarifications on frequently-asked canonical questions surrounding baptism (Vicars General), lunch, and a review of the second edition of the Diocesan baptismal preparation program (Ann Lankford).

The ritual text is available (in many cases in both English and Spanish) from <u>Catholic Book</u> <u>Publishing Company</u> (\$27.95), <u>USCCB Publishing</u> (\$44.95), <u>Liturgy Training Publications</u> (\$39.95), <u>Liturgical Press</u> (\$39.95), and <u>Magnificat</u> (\$29.95).

## Rite of Election, March 1

The Rite of Election and the Call to Continuing Conversion will be held at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman on Sunday, March 1, at 2:00. It is an occasion that marks entry into the period of Purification and Enlightenment (for newly-named "elect") that coincides with Lent. It is a wonderful opportunity for candidates and catechumens to see the larger Church, meet Bishop Callahan, be introduced to their new Cathedral, and receive the grace of the Rite. ## Liturgical Precautions During Flu Season

In light of the high incidence of influenza and the recent Coronavirus outbreak, Bishop Callahan asks all pastors and parochial administrators in the Diocese of La Crosse to use their own discretion about inviting the exchange of the Sign of Peace and the distribution of the Precious Blood from the chalice. Individual members of the faithful can also determine for themselves whether to exchange the Sign of Peace with their neighbors or to receive the Precious Blood from the chalice. If a significant change in the situation surrounding the incidences of either influenza or Coronavirus occurs, further direction from the Diocese will be offered.

## Prayer for the Intercession of Blessed Brother James Miller, FSC

February 13, 2020, marked the first annual observance of the feast day of Blessed James Miller.

A prayer for his intercession has been approved by Bishop Callahan:

"O Blessed Brother James Miller, you heard God's call to become a Brother of the Christian Schools and so became a sign of faith to youth in the United States and in Central America. You placed your life and your trust in Divine Providence and, for spreading the faith, merited the crown of martyrdom. In a world that denies the dignity of the human person, obtain for us from Divine Providence an ever increasing love of God and our neighbor, especially the poor and oppressed. Obtain for us also the favor we are now asking for *[mention request]* and the grace and strength to be a witness to Christ's love to all. Amen."

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. #### Attention Pastors, Deacons and Parish Respect Life and Social Concerns Representatives -Walking with Moms in Need: A Year of Service

The USCCB has asked all dioceses to participate in a nationwide effort called <u>Walking with</u> <u>Moms in Need: A Year of Service</u>, taking place from March 25, 2020 through March 25, 2021. The USCCB is developing educational, pastoral, prayer, and action-oriented resources for parish use, such as the following:

- Tools for documenting an inventory of local resources for pregnant women in need;
- Ideas for improving parish (and deanery) responses;
- Prayers for building a culture of life and a civilization of love;
- Resources for reflecting on the teachings of *Evangelium Vitae*, *Evangelii Gaudium*, and *Laudato Si*.

These resources will include homily helps, suggested prayers, bulletin inserts, and more. All of these will be posted online.

The diocesan contact for *Walking with Moms in Need* is Chris Ruff, Director of the Office for Ministries and Social Concerns.
