1) A Compelling Resource for Parish Small Groups

It calls for a conversion of heart and mind and, according to the CCO objectives: "Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, it is designed to bring participants to a real and effective encounter with Jesus Christ and to progressively build them into the Missionary Disciples the Church needs them to be." This workshop will provide an overview of CCO's mission, objectives and goals as well as the learnings and experiences of those who have facilitated CCO faith-sharing groups over the past two years.

3) Theology of the Body: A Basic Overview for Forming Youth

Julie will focus on equipping and energizing facilitators to present Theology of the Body to our youth using the very best programs, such as *YOU* for High School and *Theology of the Body for Middle School* from Ascension Press. She will introduce you to approaches that will help you feel comfortable presenting this important and necessary topic.

4. The Power of Stories and 3 Conversion Stories Everyone Should Know

6. Addressing Confusion about Identity and Gender

In the midst of a confused culture, how can we affirm and teach God's fundamental design for the human person as male and female, created in His image and called to a life of self-giving love? How can we do this in a way that is sensitive to the ears of our young people (and their parents) and to their sincerely-held though often misled beliefs? And yet in a way that is also unafraid to speak the truth -- because we know God has written that truth deep within every human heart? These are the questions that Chris Ruff and Chris Rogers will address as they consider the most common misconceptions about identity and gender.

7) Fostering Communication and Collaboration between the Pastor and Parish Leaders

8) Relationship, Intentionality, and Accompaniment: The Cornerstones of Ministry

This session will give practical tips on how to become intentional in your ministry for people of all ages.

9) What's the Story with You and God?

10) Suicide Prevention: Ask a Question, Save a Life

Question – Persuade – Refer (QPR) is a way of understanding and recognizing the signs of suicide in those we love and care about and knowing what to do to get help. In this presentation, you will learn the risk factors and warning signs of suicide and how you can help by asking a question, persuading them to get help, and referring them to that help. This could possibly save a life.
