Free GoToWebinar/Meeting online meeting resource to help stay connected

Zach Tudahl, the Technical Support Specialist for the diocese, applied for and received 200 <u>GotoMeetings</u> licenses and 160 GotoWebinar 90 day licenses. These are 90-day licenses for both of these products, good through mid-July.

The differences between the 2 platforms:

GoToMeeting is for meetings where all attendees are participants; GoToWebinar includes everything meetings does, but is designed for larger groups attending that do not participate. In other words, there is a panelist (or one person) that presents and a large group of attendees that view and can send in questions via chat. They are full licenses with no time limits that expire mid July. Parishes already using these platforms are seeing abundant fruit.

Virtual Classroom: Primer On the Sacraments of Initiation

Men and women across the world are still looking forward to that moment they have been waiting for—each an event in time but with eternal ramifications: baptism, confirmation, and first Holy Communion. In most places, the COVID-19 pandemic has forced a postponement of these life-giving sacraments. But even for the rest of the Church, this limbo is a painful trial, for the new life of the neophyte is a fresh transfusion of blood for the larger Mystical Body. We thus wait and pray for that imminent day when the blood and water from Christ's side will wash over the Church in the sacraments.

As we wait, consider joining Christopher Carstens and Jesse Weiler, Director of Mundelein's Liturgical Institute, as they look at these saving sacraments and prepare for their eventual reception. These three, 1-hour sessions introduce the Church's teaching on the sacraments and look to baptism, confirmation, and the Eucharist as the first privileged examples of these awesome mysteries of the Catholic Church. DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. <a href="mailto:Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. Reminder: Are you teaching your students remotely?

If you have any questions regarding the use of social networking and technology, our guidelines are <u>found here</u>. You should never be communicating one on one with a student through email, phone call, Facebook or any other form of electronic communication. It is inappropriate for personnel to include minors and vulnerable adults within their own social circle, online or otherwise. Always email their parent to keep them in the loop. If a teacher needs to call a student, always inform the parent prior to the call and let them know when you will be calling and why you are calling the student. Always have 2 adults on an email with a student. That can be another teacher or their parent. When possible, do group chats and emails.

Be responsible:

You are personally responsible for posted content and will be held accountable for such. Be selective – use the right medium for your message. Always identify yourself with your real identity and not a nickname. Respect the privacy of others. Don't publish personal information of others without their permission.

Reminder: Important audit information: The USCCB has declared that there will be no extensions on the 2019-20 Safe Environment Audit. Therefore, when you send in your parish or school report, all background checks need to be current and all training must be complete. Training must take place during the audit period of July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. Paid employees, coaches and janitors need fingerprinting done.

Erica and I are working everyday so you can continue to send in your information.

If you have volunteers or staff that are not trained, tell them to go to the <u>Diocese of La Crosse website</u> and train online. Last year many of you did not have training dates because of the weather issues we experienced. This is why it is best to do your training right away at the beginning of the school year or at the start of your religious education programs. New hires and volunteers should be trained prior to any involvement at a parish or school. You should not wait until spring to train spring and summer coaches. If needed, I can set up a ZOOM meeting and we can do a large group training.

If you have questions or concerns let me know.

Reports are now more than a month past due. I still need 47 parish reports, 1 system school and 5 parish school reports.

The efforts to support your parish online offertory has seen a steady stream of activity. We've had 365 unique supports provide 450 gifts, generating nearly \$65,000 in three-weeks. While this was never intended to be the panacea to make up for lost offertory, it is just another convenient and safe channel for your parishioners and supporters to continue to invest in your mission, helping to meet payroll and keeping the lights and heat on.

Not only is it important for the people of God's spiritual and mental well-being for us to remain connected to them, it is also vital for their parishes to have a vibrant and sustainable life post-quarantine. Our efforts of evangelization and community outreach (read building and strengthening) must continue. We must continue to be connected via phone calls, social media, regular USPS mail, email and drive by or walk by visits, etc. Service is time consuming and expensive, however, and I know this is cliché, we will only get out what we put into it. Of Time, Talent, and Treasure; Time is the most valuable.

Since we now have a quarantine that is scheduled to last through May 26, now is a good time to reflect and start preparing for reopening. Are there been changes you wanted to institute at your parish? How can parish life become more vibrant? What needs are not being met? Is our parish inviting and welcoming?

If anything is certain, we will see a marketing and consumerism blitz to the like we have not seen. Every business, product and service, will be encouraging a consumerist mentality while trying to promote a safe, homey, and comforting relationship with their product and services. We cannot sit idly by and let the message of hope and mercy of the gospel get lost.

If we look back to another significant emotional event, September 11, 2001; the influx of people finding their way back to church lasted about six weeks. Afterwards, people returned to their pre-event Mass attendance levels and trends. If we want to avoid a similar experience, we must ask ourselves what we learned, and how can we repeat the good and avoid the mistakes. We as a church can use this opportunity to become more proactive in our stewardship and evangelization and less reactive.
