Year of St. Joseph

"Now is the time of St. Joseph! God has given clear indications that He wants His people to pay more attention to St. Joseph—clearer indications than in any previous era in Church history. In 1961, St. Pope John XXIII put it very bluntly. He wrote:

In the Holy Church's worship, right from the beginning, Jesus the Word of God made man, has enjoyed the adoration that belongs to Him, incommunicable as the splendor of the substance of His Father, a splendor reflected in the glory of His saints. From the earliest times, Mary, His mother, was close behind Him, in the pictures of the catacombs and the basilicas, where she was devoutly venerated as the 'Holy Mother of God.' But Joseph, except for some slight sprinkling of references to him here and there in the writings of the Fathers of the Church, for long centuries remained in the background, in his characteristic concealment, almost as a decorative figure in the overall picture of the Savior's life. It took time for devotion to him to go beyond those passing glances and take root in the hearts of the faithful, and then surge forth in the form of special prayers and of a profound sense of trusting abandonment. The fervent joy of pouring forth these deepest feelings of the heart in so many impressive ways has been saved for modern times!" (Consecration to St. Joseph, The Wonders of Our Spiritual Father, by Donald H. Callaway, MIC).

May is the month of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

A beautiful way to honor our Blessed Mother during the month of May is to pray a decade of the Rosary each day as a family. This takes less than 10 minutes and consists of praying one *Our Father*, ten *Hail Mary's* and one *Glory Be* while pondering an event of Jesus' and Mary's life that has a connection to your own life. Another way to honor Mary is to have a "May Altar" which consists of a statue of Mary (any size) with flowers. This May Altar provides a reminder of our devotion to Mary as the Mother of Jesus, our Savior, and a place for coming together with Our Lady in prayer.

Novena for Pentecost

A Novena consists of praying a prayer during a period of nine days for a specific intention. The Pentecost Novena, in honor of the Holy Spirit, is the oldest of all novenas since it was first prayed at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His Apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. This Novena is addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity as a powerful plea for your personal intentions. Take this opportunity to come to know the Holy Spirit in a much deeper way and allow Him to guide, strengthen and console you.

Pentecost Novena Dates: The Pentecost Novena will be prayed from **Friday, May 22 to Saturday, May 30.** Sunday, May 31, is the Feast of Pentecost. The simple Novena Prayer Card and short reading for each of the nine days can be downloaded here: diolc.org/deeper.

Here are 3 things your parish can do to stay connected with your parishioners during this time when they are away, courtesy of <u>Faith Catholic</u>:

- 1. Make wellness calls. Ask members of your parish council, finance council, education committee, or Knights of Columbus to divide your parish list and call every registered household found in your ParishSOFT census database. Provide a script. Find out how parishioners are doing, whether they have specific needs, and whether they need help signing up for online giving setup for all parishes at diolc.org/parishes.
- 2. Organize a phone tree. Check in each week with seniors and those who are vulnerable. Ask parishioners if they are willing to join an ongoing phone tree to make weekly calls to a few parishioners. You can use your ParishSOFT census database for phone numbers.

3. Offer digital tutoring. Create a "Digital Natives" ministry. Have parishioners who are familiar with digital media call those who are not to provide telephone training about how to use email or social media sites. <u>Click here</u> for technical help with virtual meetings or live streaming.

World Mission Sunday (WMS) 2020: Coronavirus makes it even harder to think about World Mission Sunday in October when we are still uncertain about the summer. However, WMS envelopes need to be ordered by the Mission Office soon. Please <a href="mailto:emailto:

MISSION CO-OP Summer 2020: As the Badger Bounce Back program is enacted and the Wisconsin Catholic Conference determines the details of the slow roll-out of public Masses we are urging that you stay the course. We have fielded a few questions, especially regarding traveling missionaries who are not able to leave their country of origin. Please let us know if you have similar questions. Gratefully, most mission areas represented in our program have priests or missionaries in Wisconsin or somewhere nearby in the United States. This helps the program continue as planned with face to face contact between the missionary and our parish congregations.

If the possible extension of "Safer at Home" or "Badger Bounce Back" restrictions prohibits public Masses longer than anticipated, we will be sending out instructions to missionaries and pastors for Missio, an online format promoting and supporting Catholic missionary projects and activities. To explore the Missio option early, go to missio.org and select "Donate" from the menu options. That will lead to many projects around the world for you to learn more.

Missionary Childhood Association (MCA) and Lenten Mite Boxes 2020: Since the suspension of public Masses occurred during the Lenten Season, we are aware that the mite box program was affected. We encourage you not to collect the boxes until public Masses are restored. At that time, since they have the potential of being contaminated, we recommend that you follow the specialized internal controls set in place during the pandemic. That is, store them safely in a lockable place without touching them for at least three days. Then the money can be counted and deposited at the parish. Forward the totals to the Mission Office and we will forward the collection to MCA. If you have already gathered the boxes and deposited the funds, no worries. You can forward the totals at any time. DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the Children and Young People, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679; or tbrown@diolc.org.

There are 39 parishes and 5 schools that have not submitted their 2019-20 Safe Environment Report. If you are one of these, please call Teresa at 608-791-2679 to give status of your report and a possible turn in date. Reports are now more than 60 days past due.

<u>There is a new Basic Background Check form</u>. It is called Authorization and Acknowledgement of Criminal Background check and is found <u>here</u>. It will incorporate form #4, the FBI release form for fingerprinting. The new form has the Diocesan Seal in the left-hand corner and the icon for Promise to Protect and Pledge to Heal in the right-hand corner.
