Parish Census SOP update: 5-12-2020

Please note that there has been an update to the <u>Parish Census Software Standard Operating</u> <u>Procedures</u>. Here are the revision notes:

Duplicate Member Merge on Page 6

When Duplicate Member records reside within the same parish census, the records can now be merged by the parish. For duplicate member records involving more than one parish please continue to notify Margot Lorraine in the diocesan Stewardship & Development Office.

Exporting Members on Page 12

Before exporting an adult child, search your census database to make sure the person does not already have a separate Family record within your parish census. It could even contain a spouse and/or children. If a Family record exists, you should merge the two Member records rather than Exporting the adult child Member record to a new Family record. The existing Member number would be the Master and the Member number in the parents' record would be the duplicate. Sacramental information travels with the Member merge.

Entering a Non-Catholic Spouse on Pages 14 and 24

For consistency, the male name is always entered first – John and Susan. Even if one spouse is not Catholic, enter both spouses as an individual Family Member. Unless specifically requested to be removed from mailings, both spouses' first names should appear in the First Name(s) and the Formal Mailing Name fields.

o The Catholic Spouse's Role would be 'Head' while the non-Catholic spouse would be Husband or Wife.

o The Member Status for the non-Catholic spouse is ActOther and not Active.

Reminder: World Mission Sunday (WMS) 2020: COVID-19 makes it even harder to think about World Mission Sunday in October when we are still uncertain about the summer. However, WMS envelopes need to be ordered by the Mission Office soon. Please <u>email</u> us the number of envelopes, parish addresses, or anything else in your order which needs to be changed from last year. If we do not hear from you by May 23, the same amount and shipping information as last year will be used. Thank you.

Reminder: Missionary Childhood Association (MCA) and Lenten Mite Boxes 2020: Since the suspension of public Masses occurred during the Lenten Season, we are aware that the mite

box program was affected. We encourage you not to collect the boxes until public Masses are restored. At that time, since they have the potential of being contaminated, we recommend that you follow the specialized internal controls set in place during the pandemic. That is, store them safely in a lockable place without touching them for at least three days. Then the money can be counted and deposited at the parish. Forward the totals to the Mission Office and we will forward the collection to MCA. If you have already gathered the boxes and deposited the funds, no worries. You can forward the totals at any time. DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. Why We are Celebrating a Year of St. Joseph

This year marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pius IX's decree naming St. Joseph Patron and Protector of the Universal Church. He is also the primary patron of the Diocese of La Crosse, and our Cathedral is named after him. In this challenging time of COVID-19, we can turn to St. Joseph with great hope:

- We can turn to him as *protector* from harm, even as he protected Mary and the child Jesus from Herod's wrath;
- St. Joseph was *worker* and *provider* for the Holy Family, so to him we can entrust ourselves and our nation in the face of unprecedented unemployment and economic distress;
- As model *husband* and *father*, we turn to St. Joseph at a time when good examples of both are so desperately needed. We can ask him to help strengthen our families as well as the bonds of our "parish family" at a time when these can be fragile.
- As *patron of the dying*, we can invoke the intercession of St. Joseph on all who are in their last moments of life, including the elderly in nursing homes and others with terminal disease.
