DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. The 2020-21 School & Religious Ed year begins in 3 months. Many of you have begun planning. Do you have Safe Environment Training scheduled with your staff and volunteers? I am available for Zoom Meetings and in person training at parishes and schools. Get the bulk of your training done at the beginning of the year so you are not scrambling in the spring for training dates. Remember 2019? - We had bad weather that closed most programs for almost a month and now 2020 has COVID-19. We never know when an unexpected event will cancel or delay our programs.

Onsite Safe Environment Training Dates: August 6: 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. Prairie Catholic School August 13: 1-5 p.m. Prairie Catholic School August 17: 11 a.m. St. John the Baptist, Marshfield, 6:30 p.m. St. Mary August 21: 9:00 a.m. Aquinas, La Crosse ------ p.m. available August 24: afternoon – Thorp August 24: evening - Boyd August 25: 6 p.m. St. Agnes, Weston Staff and volunteers must be background checked and trained <u>before</u> they begin working with students whether it's in a classroom, field trip or sports field.

New form: The basic background check form and the FBI Release for Authorization form have been combined. Please destroy any old forms and begin using the new form. The new form is called: <u>Authorization and Acknowledgement of Criminal Background Check</u>. It has the Diocesan seal in the left corner and the Protect and Heal seal in the right corner and can be downloaded here: <u>diolc.org/files/safe-environment/Criminal Background Check.pdf</u>. Going forward fingerprint cards will not be accepted unless this form is sent with the cards.

Who needs fingerprinting? All paid staff over the age of 18 and Coaches and Janitors regardless if paid or volunteers. All grandfathered staff and volunteers must be fingerprinted by the end of 2020.

Stewardship: food for thought

As we reopen, it is an excellent time to remind ourselves that stewardship is caring for the whole person. Stewardship popularly focuses on the three extrinsic aspects of time, talent, and treasure. By focusing on the external, we ultimately end in a utilitarian effect, "what can they do for us?" Often leaving people feeling used. Stewardship that focuses on the person will promote a greater sense of community. They, as a person, are essential and vital part of that community because of who they are, not for what they can do for us. Stewarding the whole person is critical for rebuilding and reinvigorating our faith communities, which draws us back to Christ's given mission to share the good news of the gospel. So why do we focus on the externals of stewardship? It is more manageable than concentrating on a full relationship, and it helps satisfy our self-interest more quickly. Stewarding of the whole person does not exclude the need for them to contribute their time, talent, and treasure. Stewarding the whole person encompasses those elements, so the whole person is an active participant in our community.

Our communications should reinforce the mission of our Church, locally (parish), regionally (diocese), and globally. To reinvigorate our parish communities, we must remind our members why our parish communities are essential both for the person and the larger society. Encouraging witness to the importance of our Catholic faith personally, and highlighting the effects of the parish's mission in the community at large is the two-prong approach to rebuilding our faith communities.
