#### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679; or <u>tbrown@diolc.org</u>.

New form: The basic background check form and the FBI Release for Authorization form have been combined. Please destroy any old forms and begin using the new form. The new form is called: <u>Authorization and Acknowledgement of Criminal Background Check</u>. It has the Diocesan seal in the left corner and the Protect and Heal seal in the right corner and can be downloaded here: <u>diolc.org/files/safe-environment/Criminal Background Check.pdf</u>. Going forward fingerprint cards will not be accepted unless this form is sent with the cards.

Who needs fingerprinting? All paid staff over the age of 18 and Coaches and Janitors regardless if paid or volunteers. All grandfathered staff and volunteers must be fingerprinted by the end of 2020.

## Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Update

There have been recent developments related to the PPP program. <u>Click here</u> for the complete list of proposed changes to PPP loan forgiveness. On May 28, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 7010, the Paycheck Protection Program Flexibility Act of 2020, by a vote of 417 to 1. The Senate may consider changes to the PPP as soon as this week.

Some of the key changes being presented for purposes of loan forgiveness, redefines the covered period to begin on the date of loan origination and end on the earlier of the date that is 24 weeks after loan origination, or December 31, 2020. For purposes of avoiding a reduction in the amount of loan forgiveness, extends the date for rehire of employees to December 31, 2020. Requires, as a condition of loan forgiveness, that at least 60 percent of the loan be used to cover payroll costs.
