FISCAL YEAR-END REPORT – MISSION CONTRIBUTIONS: We understand the financial and "limited time in the office" strains and other challenges during this corona pandemic for all our parishes. If possible, please send in any outstanding World Mission Sunday 2019, Mission Coop 2019 and MCA (Lenten Mite Box Program) 2020 donations to the Mission Office by June 30, in order to be included in the Fiscal Year-End Report. These amounts will be featured in the Sept/Oct 2020 *Catholic Life* article highlighting our diocesan generosity to the Missions. Contributions received after June 30 will be applied to the new fiscal year.

MISSION COOP 2020: Our public Masses have begun with 25% capacity and we hope things continue to improve soon as we move directly into the summer. Gratefully, most mission areas represented in our program have priests or missionaries in Wisconsin or somewhere nearby in the United States. This helps the program continue as planned with face to face contact between the missionary and our parish. If you are assigned an international priest who is not able to come, or you are having difficulty setting up a schedule, please let us know. Other alternatives may include the following:

- 1. Another representative could be sent by the missionary to make the appeal on the missionary's behalf
- On the chosen week-end of the pastor, the pastor could read a statement from the missionary on his behalf as he conducts the appeal for the missionary. The Mission Office can help supply envelopes
- 3. A final option was presented to us by our national Society for the Propagation of the Faith office. It involves uploading information about the appeal to <u>missio.org</u> by the missionary. This is a website that seeks funders for Catholic mission projects around the world. They have set up an internal way for the Mission Co-op Program missionaries to connect with pastors and their parishioners for online giving. The set up happens through the office in New York. We just offer information to missionaries and pastors if this is the route chosen.

If you are an international priest serving in our diocese as the Mission Coop coordinator for appeals for your home diocese, please send the Mission Office a copy of your appeal schedule (the arranged date and who is giving the appeal) as soon as possible. If you are having another priest outside our diocese help with any appeals, please send us their Letter of Suitability as soon as possible also. These need to be in the Mission Office before any appeals are given.

Many thanks to the combined efforts of all missionaries and pastors in helping to facilitate a smooth program under difficult circumstances. May God bless our desire to spread the Gospel to all ends of the earth together!

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

Reminder: Online Meetings and Gaming

If you are doing religious education and/or youth ministry online, whether it be ZOOM Meetings, gaming, etc., there must always be two adults who have been background checked through the Diocese of La Crosse and gone through the Diocese of La Crosse Safe Environment Training present for the duration of the online meeting/gathering.

Staff and volunteers must be background checked and trained before they begin working with students whether it's in a classroom, field trip or sports field. I will be offering Safe Environment Training through Zoom on Wednesday, August 12. If you have not received an invitation and would like to train, please let me know. Training times will be at 1-2 p.m. or 6-7 p.m. This is open to all staff and volunteers. This will count as annual training.

I have been receiving a lot of fingerprint cards without a release form. They can't be processed without this form. There is a new form that combines both the Basic Background Check form and the FBI Release for Authorization form. Please destroy any old forms and begin using the new form. The new form is called: Authorization and Acknowledgement of Criminal Background Check. It has the Diocesan seal in the left corner and the Protect and Heal seal in the right corner and can be downloaded here: diolc.org/files/safe-environment/Criminal Background Check.pdf. Going forward fingerprint cards will not be accepted unless this form is sent with the cards.

Who needs fingerprinting? All paid staff over the age of 18 and All coaches and janitors regardless if paid or volunteers. All grandfathered staff, coaches and janitors must be fingerprinted by the end of 2020.

Stewardship: food for thought

As we reopen, it is an excellent time to remind ourselves that stewardship is caring for the whole person. Stewardship popularly focuses on the three extrinsic aspects of time, talent, and treasure. By focusing on the external, we ultimately end in a utilitarian effect, "what can they do for us?" Often leaving people feeling used.

Stewardship focusing on the person will promote a greater sense of community. They, as a person, are essential and a vital part of the community because of who they are, not for what they can do for us. Stewarding the whole person is critical for rebuilding and reinvigorating our faith communities, which draws us back to Christ's given mission to share the good news of the Gospel.

So why do we focus on the externals of stewardship? It is more manageable than concentrating on a full relationship, and it helps satisfy our self-interest more quickly. Stewarding of the whole person does not exclude the need for them to contribute their time, talent, and treasure.

Stewarding the whole person encompasses those elements, so the whole person is an active participant in our community. Our communications should reinforce the mission of our Church, locally (parish), regionally (diocese), and globally. To reinvigorate our parish communities, we must remind our members why our parish communities are essential both for the person and the larger society. Encouraging witness to the importance of our Catholic Faith personally and highlighting the effects of the parish's mission in the community at large is the two-prong approach to rebuilding our faith communities.
