Join a Small Group this Fall to Grow in Your Relationship with Jesus Christ

Here are five good reasons to join with some people from your parish for a Bible Study or Faith Study Group:

Growing in Your Relationship with Jesus Christ through Reading the Catechism in a year Sign up to read through the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in the next 10 months. From

year-to-year, there are always more than 100 people who will participate. We begin Monday, September 14th and end mid-June, with a week off for Thanksgiving and two weeks off for Christmas.

A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week for 38 weeks. It is worth the effort. Professional Email communications

Given the many Email scams and counterfeits we see weekly, here are a few helpful guidelines to help expose forgery and improve the overall perception of your email communications.

1. It is recommended that all electronic communications coming from a diocesan office, parish or school be on a domain for the corresponding organization. Example: <u>Secretary@allsaintsparish.org</u>, or <u>Info@allsaintsparish.org</u>.

2. It is recommended that all clergy use an email with the diocesan domain diolclergy.org or one from their parish domain.

3. It is recommended that parish and school staff eliminate the use of free domains such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, or domains from their Internet provider and other such services when representing the diocese/parish/school via email correspondence. Adherence to this recommendation will establish an authenticity of the correspondence and reduce the potential for misrepresentation or impersonation.

We are happy to help clergy establish a diolclergy.org email address. Just send us a request and we will create the account for you. The diolclergy.org domain is part of the diocesan GSuite. Your diolclergy.org account will include the full range of G Suite functionality.

Reminder: Guidelines for Infant Baptism during Coronavirus

As infant baptisms resume, pastors and parishes should consider appropriate measures to safeguard the health of all participants. The Thomistic Institute has published guidelines here. In addition to general pandemic guidelines (e.g., 6' social distancing, masks, hand sanitization, etc.), some of the Thomistic Institute's ritual observations include:

1. *Tracing the Sign of the Cross on the Forehead*: This may be done as normal. If hand hygiene is done at the beginning and end of the ceremony, there is not a significant risk of transmission.

2. Anointing with Oil of Catechumens: The minister dips his thumb one time in the small quantity of the oil of catechumens he prepared in a small vessel before the start of the baptism. He then anoints the child on the breast. After the ceremony, he should reverently dispose of any remaining oil and wash the vessel with soap and water.

3. *The Baptism itself*: According to the CDC, "[t]here is no evidence showing anyone has gotten COVID-19 through drinking water, recreational water, or wastewater. The risk of COVID-19 transmission through water is expected to be low." Still, out of an abundance of caution, it is prudent to avoid reusing baptismal water for multiple children. Therefore, before the baptism, empty the font and refill it with fresh water (to be blessed during the ceremony). After the ceremony, ensure that the baptismal water is drained or emptied out of the font.

4. Anointing with Sacred Chrism: The minister dips his thumb one time in the small quantity of the sacred chrism he prepared in a small vessel before the start of the baptism. He then anoints the child on the crown of the head in the normal way. After the ceremony, he should reverently dispose of any remaining chrism and wash the vessel with soap and water.

5. *Baptismal Candle and White Garment*: Provided that proper hand hygiene is performed at the places described in the guidelines, handing over these items does not pose a significant risk of viral spread.

6. *Ephphetha Prayer*: Insofar as the ephphetha prayer envisions the minister touching the mouth and ears of the recipient, it entails a higher risk. The rite already permits that this prayer be omitted, and we [the Thomistic Institute] recommend that the minister do so.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u> <u>environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>.
