# Growing in Your Relationship with Jesus Christ through Reading the Catechism in a Year

Sign up to read through the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* in the next 10 months. From year-to-year, there are always more than 100 people who participate. We begin <u>Monday</u>, <u>September 14th</u> and end mid-June, with a week off for Thanksgiving and two weeks off for Christmas. A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week for 38 weeks. It is worth the effort. #### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u> <u>environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. #### **Diocesan Annual Appeal**

This year's theme emphasizes the relevancy of the Church, the community, and the importance of its mission. The theme is **"His Church is Still Here, His Church is you and Me, His Church Still Provides."** 

Your parish's Appeal allocation should be arriving in the mail in the next few days. Through prayer, administrative moves, and the realities of the need for our missionary works, the overall target will remain at \$5,675,035. Individual parishes will see changes to their goal based on the portion of the diocesan aggregate.

If you would like to include a letter/postcard from your parish priest or finance council, please have a draft in Microsoft Word or Google Docs (please no pdfs) to us by September 9, 2020. Please include the Parish Name, City, and three-digit parish number in the email subject line. We will also need a good quality jpg or png file of any signatures included. This year a letter may be the only way your parishioners will hear of your support for the works the Diocesan Annual Appeal funds.

Our first kickoff weekend is September 26/27; we have a signup form on the Appeal Portal for the weekend you wish to choose to kick off. Due to the environment we are currently operating in, and our communities are not able to come together as we ordinarily do; therefore, we are not limiting the weekends available for kickoff. The weekend will be your choice for what is best for your parish community. You will need to register your parish and

tell us which weekend you want to kickoff. Our strategy this year to keep the Appeal fresh in people's minds will be to increase our marketing through social media substantially.

We will be building out the materials over the next few weeks and making them available to you as they become ready. Be sure to check the Appeal Portal at <u>http://appeal.diolc.org</u>. To further save cost and since most parishes download the video from the Appeal Portal, DVD's will be shipped upon request only.

Did you know GivingTrend now has Key Alerts on the right-hand side of your parish's page? Here all in one place, you can find New Donors, Your LYBUNTS, Large Gifts, Writeoffs, and any of your parishioners who have supported the Appeal but have since passed away. These alerts are an easy way to find and welcome and thank new supporters from a local perspective (encouraged); they may or may not be registered in your parish. Others identified are Major Investors (+\$2,000.00), and help you identify hurdles that you may need to strategize to overcome; LYBUNTS, and deceased.

# Reunite, Rebuild, and Rejoice Recovery Appeal

Some of our participating parishes are entering into the final stages of the Appeal. Others are about halfway through. Overall, the participating parishes have already received more than \$487k in one-time gifts and have received pledges for an average 31% increase in the respondent's offertory. As of 8/24, the combined total dollars raised was nearly \$885,000

These are essential investments by our parishioners in their local parishes. With these increased investments, our parishes will be able to keep the lights on, keep our parish campuses in working order, and ride out the current state of affairs. More importantly, they will also be able to invest in their local missionary works, allowing them to help more of those in their parishes and communities who are suffering a more significant burden of the pandemic effects.

#### **Planned Giving**

We continue to receive requests for copies of our Estate Planning Guide. This guide can help people save several hundred dollars in legal and financial estate planning costs. The increased interest in Planned Giving mirrors what we are finding on a national level since the COVID – 19 outbreak came to prominence.
