Advent Virtual Parish Mission

With Advent beginning on November 29, now is the time to advertise the Advent Parish Mission. Designate a specific day and time you will participate. Ask for help from parishioners who will be committed. Otherwise, it is too easy to forget. There are two separate bulletin inserts available at diolc.org/insert as explained below:

- For parishes organizing in-person and/or virtual gatherings for parishioners, a bulletin insert is available with fillable boxes for time(s), day(s) and contact information:
- For parishes who would like to publicize the Advent Parish Mission but who will not be organizing a group, a bulletin insert is available that suggests a day and time, and also explains that the recorded presentations will be available anytime on the diocesan website.

There are three ways for the parish to host the Advent Mission over the four weeks:

1. Gather at the parish to view one of the four recordings at diolc.org/advent and discuss the questions in small groups.
2. Invite parishioners to join an online meeting (such as ZOOM) where parishioners can join virtually to watch the presentation together and then discuss it.
3. Ask parishioners to watch the presentation ahead of time and join an online meeting to discuss it.
4. If the parish does not wish to host the Advent Mission, it will be helpful to encourage parishioners to watch each of the four recordings at diolc.org/advent on a specific day(s) and time. Please consider using the bulletin insert listed above.

The focus of the Advent Mission will be **“Preparing for the Birth of the Christ Child through the Eyes of St. Joseph.”** There will be four presentations, one for each week of Advent. The length of the talks will be roughly 30-40 minutes with discussion questions available at the end of each presentation and available to print from the website. The purpose of this mission is to bring people together to prepare for Christmas and strengthen the community in light of so much isolation. Parishioners may participate by gathering at the parish or by watching at home. Each presentation will be available at diolc.org/advent. The link to each presentation will be available on the Friday before the corresponding Sunday of Advent, and will be available throughout the rest of Advent.

- Week 1) St. Joseph: The Man Selected by God to be Closest to Mary and to Jesus. – Msgr. Joseph Diermeier

For Parish Communication:

Four Reasons to be Thankful

1. Those who cultivate the habit of thankfulness experience true Christian joy. And isn’t this something that we desire? When we count our many blessings, our attitude can turn away from any discouragement and lead us to be more generous with others.
2. The more we hear “thank you” come from our mouth, the more we notice what people are doing for us and it can help to shift an attitude of discouragement as well. This Thanksgiving, consider a person in your family you need to verbally thank for something specific; or thank a family member for who they are and what they mean to you. Growing in the habit of being thankful to God and others is well worth the effort.
3. We have every reason to be thankful. Jesus gave His life for us, experiencing the worst possible pain on the Cross, so that we can have eternal life with Him forever. And the Cross is in the shape of the letter “t” which reminds us of the word “thanksgiving.” Giving thanks to Jesus will foster greater humility as we recognize His incredible love for us.
4. Being thankful leads to peace and calm, which keeps us healthy. When we focus on what we do have, rather than what we don’t have, stress diminishes, our shoulders relax and we can function better in so many ways.

Reminder: Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

In response to growing interest in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS), there have been renewed efforts to make this method of religious formation accessible to families in the Coulee Region. CGS is a Montessori style of religious formation which allows for the child to

contemplate Scripture and the Liturgy through sensorial materials in a dedicated space called an atrium. CGS gives space for the Holy Spirit to work quietly in the child's heart and form a unique relationship with him or her, which has profound effects on the faith of the child.

One of the major steps in bringing CGS to La Crosse and surrounding areas involves having more catechists in our area who have received the catechist formation on how to properly prepare the environment and help facilitate this relationship between child and God. In order to help make this formation more accessible to local men and women, part of our renewed efforts involves hosting a Catechist Formation in the Onalaska area as early as January 2021. The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the [diocesan website](#). 2020-21 Diocesan Annual Appeal

This year's theme emphasizes the relevancy of the Church, our Christ-given Mission, and our community united through our Baptism to the Cross and Resurrection. The theme is "**His Church is Still Here, His Church Still Provides, His Church is You and Me.**"

United States Postal Service: We still continue to have several parishes reporting issues with parishioners reporting they are not getting their appeal mailings as timely as expected. We have found that the mailings are reaching their homes seven days and more later than expected. If you receive reports of parishioners not receiving mailings, please let us know who they are, so we can send them another packet. We cannot help if we do not have names of individuals or families.

Current Results: Eight parishes have already met and surpassed their goals, thank you for your leadership.

With about dozen parishes yet to launch, results continue to be promising. The 8,088 supporters of the appeal last year (45% of last year's total supporters), as of 11/16/19, have given this year, as of 11/16/20; their average investment is up by 20.5%. This increase equates to the appeal experiencing a plus \$628,255.15 YTD, which is a 31.9% increase. Despite limited Mass attendance, we have also added 25 new investors (which is a little over two/week), and 43 more have reengaged.

Reminder: Kick-Off Weekend: Because our communities cannot come together as we ordinarily do, we do not limit the weekends available for kick-off. Your parish community can choose the best weekend for your schedule. **You must [register](#) your parish and tell us which weekend you want the mail to arrive by.**

The next weekend available for sign up is December 6, 2020. **You must sign up on the Appeal portal appeal.diolc.org by 11:59 pm on 11/20/2020 to have the best chance to have the materials delivered by that weekend.** If you have already kicked off and are just now signing up, please enter the next earliest date available. The mailings are placed into the postal mail stream on Tuesday before the weekend of choice, with the hope the envelope will arrive in mailboxes on Friday or Saturday.

Due to COVID, we have prayerfully decided to cancel our annual Pilgrimage for Life to Washington, DC in January 2021. We are looking at some virtual and local options to connect people together to pray for all life. More information is coming soon.

Virtual Retreat: for Youth in Grades 7 and 8

We are very excited about the response to the first retreat for high school students that was held on November 15, 2020! The retreat will be held for youth in grades 7-8 on Sunday, December 6, 2020 from 12:30-3:30pm. This retreat will, again, be led by Young Life Catholic Retreats and will feature speakers and musicians from around the country to minister to our young people. Right now, the plan is to have each parish youth group gather at your parish (while following all COVID/Social Distancing protocols) to listen to powerful speakers, music, games that are virtually interactive with the other joining parishes, and small group discussions (that will be done at your parish). Prior to the retreat, you and your young people could attend Mass together, then gather to eat lunch together in a way that follows all safety protocols for serving food to groups (i.e. box lunches, sack lunch from home, etc.). Then, following the retreat, depending on the availability of your priest or deacon, you could spend time as a group together in Adoration. The cost for this retreat is \$10 per person. If you applied for a BEET Grant for a youth event that has been cancelled due to COVID, those funds could be reapplied to these retreats.
