Up to Four Masses on Christmas Eve, Four on Christmas Day

Bishop Callahan has decreed that Christmas Eve Masses can begin as early as 2:00 p.m. on December 24, 2020. The earlier time will allow, where it is deemed appropriate by the pastor, for priests to offer additional Masses on Christmas Eve to accommodate the faithful, while still keeping overall occupancy numbers below 25%.

Relative to this decree about the start time of Christmas Eve Masses is a further decree from Cardinal Robert Sarah of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. For the year 2020, he says, Bishops may allow their priests to celebrate four Masses (rather than three) on Christmas Eve, and four more on Christmas day. Bishop Callahan will grant this permission in a forthcoming decree.

In short: priests may begin to celebrate Christmas Eve Masses as early as 2:00 p.m. on December 24. They may offer four Masses on December 24, and four more Masses on December 25. Please contact the Office for Sacred Worship with any questions.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the [diocesan website](#). If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679; or tbrown@diolc.org.

Reminder: Form #4- The FBI Release Form is no longer current. When you send in print cards, a completed Basic Background Check Form must also be sent. Print cards will not be processed without the signed form.

All print cards and background checks should be sent directly to the Office of Safe Environment at the Diocesan Center and not to the Attorney's Office.

The 2020-21 Audit is an onsite audit. 3 parishes and 3 schools will be selected to have the auditors visit for an onsite audit. The report form and a spreadsheet for every parish and school has been sent to the contact they have provided. The completed report is due back by March 1, 2021.

Last year, 3 schools sent their reports in May and 3 sent their reports in June. 21 parishes sent their report in May, 15 in June and 5 in July.

When you submit your report, all active staff and volunteers must have a current training date and background check. If their background expires before July 1, 2021 it must be renewed. All paid staff and coaches and janitors need fingerprinting done once during their employment. Police and Sheriff Departments are now open for prints if you call for an appointment.

All students in a Religious Ed program or attending Catholic School need to have Protect and Heal training unless their parent fills out a declination form.

2020-21 Diocesan Annual Appeal

This year's theme emphasizes the relevancy of the Church, our Christ-given Mission, and our community united through our Baptism to the Cross and Resurrection. The theme is "His Church is Still Here, His Church Still Provides, His Church is You and Me."

United States Postal Service: We continue to have several parishes reporting issues with parishioners reporting they are not getting their appeal mailings as timely as expected. We

have found that the mailings are reaching their homes seven days and more later than expected. If you receive reports of parishioners not receiving mailings, please let us know who they are so that we can send them another packet. We cannot help if we do not have the names of individuals or families.

Reminder: GivingTrend: Some of you may have noticed some intermittent issues with this reporting program. We are going through a significant upgrade of our processing and reporting software. This upgrade will expand our ability to process and report gifts. Please be patient as this upgrade is put into production, and know we are trying to minimize any disruptions. If you need information or are having an issue with [GivingTrend](#), please contact our office.

Reminder: Kick-Off Weekend: Because our communities cannot come together as we ordinarily do, we do not limit the weekends available for kick-off. Your parish community can choose the best weekend for your schedule. **You must register your parish** and tell us which weekend you want the mail to arrive by.

Due to the Cathedral Campaign Commitment weekend on 12/13/20, the next weekend available for sign up is December 20, 2020. You must sign up on the Appeal portal appeal.diolc.org by 11:59 pm on 12/04/2020 to have the best chance to have the materials delivered by that weekend. If you have already kicked off and are just now signing up, please enter the next earliest date available. The mailings are placed into the postal mail stream on Tuesday before the weekend of choice, with the hope the envelope will arrive in mailboxes on Friday or Saturday.

Virtual Retreat: for Youth in Grades 7 and 8

We are very excited about the response to the first retreat for high school students that was held on November 15, 2020! The retreat will be held for youth in grades 7-8 on Sunday, December 6, 2020 from 12:30-3:30pm. This retreat will, again, be led by Young Life Catholic Retreats and will feature speakers and musicians from around the country to minister to our young people. Right now, the plan is to have each parish youth group gather at your parish (while following all COVID/Social Distancing protocols) to listen to powerful speakers, music, games that are virtually interactive with the other joining parishes, and small group discussions (that will be done at your parish). Prior to the retreat, you and your young people could attend Mass together, then gather to eat lunch together in a way that follows all safety protocols for serving food to groups (i.e. box lunches, sack lunch from home, etc.).
