What is next with myParish app? Introducing EVANGELUS

Diocesan has announced an exciting new solution for dioceses and parishes called EVANGELUS. It enables parishes to use a single new communications tool to reach parishioners through email, text, myParish app, social media and websites. To find out more, <u>click here</u>.

The typical cost is \$99/month per parish. Exclusively for the Diocese of La Crosse and its parishes, the cost is \$59/month per parish. myParish app is included when you purchase EVANGELUS. MyParish app will remain free until Easter 2021. If your parish wants to continue with MyParish app, it will be \$39/month per parish. If you parish does not want to continue with myParish app after Easter, the app will stay in place but your parish will not have the ability to use the app for messaging, adding new content or do any further customizing.

Missionary Childhood Association (MCA), Lenten Mite Boxes: Orders are posted and shipping should begin in the next weeks for parishes and schools receiving the annual Mite Boxes from MCA. Mite Boxes can be distributed to Catholic School and Parish Religious Education (CCD) programs for Grade School and Middle School students. The Office of Social Concerns makes available Rice Bowls from Catholic Relief Services (CRS) for High School students and family participation. Both are a very productive way to enter the 40 days of Lent with a commitment to sacrifice and service on behalf of the Catholic Church and the recipients of her care living under the conditions of poverty and extreme need. As the pandemic continues, the cry of God's people is indeed getting loader, but so has the charity

of God's people and their desire to be part of "the solution." A letter with more details regarding MCA will be sent to all Catholic school principals and DRE's/CRE's in the near future. If you have any questions, please call or e-mail the Mission Office.

Mission Co-op Program (MCP), summer 2021: Because of the delay caused by the pandemic, we are just closing up the program from 2020. None-the-less, we cannot delay in preparing for MCP, 2021, so preparation for the next round has already begun. The assignment of missionaries to parishes usually takes place for us at the end of January and beginning of February. Many requests and applications are in and being organized. So here are some last-minute notes for missionaries and pastors:

Missionaries: Many thanks to all those who have completed the annual application process. If you have confirmed your diocese or religious order, all is set. If you are unsure if your bishop or religious superior has completed the application process, please confirm with the Mission Office by phone or e-mail to ensure you are not missed for 2021.

Pastors: If you have any special requests for MCP this summer please let us know as soon as possible. We try during the assignment process to accommodate any particular mission request, date request or 'exceptions to the rule' request. For example, the appeals are usually to be held in the months of June, July, August, but exceptions can be made with certain precautions. Cancelled: Diocesan celebration of the Rite of Election, February 21

After receiving input from other dioceses around the country and in the state of Wisconsin, and after hearing from RCIA Coordinators from within the Diocese of La Crosse, Bishop Callahan has cancelled the diocesan celebration of the Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion at the Cathedral this year. Instead, Bishop Callahan will delegate to each pastor with catechumens and candidates permission to celebrate the Rite in their parish. The Rite can take place either within or outside of Mass, usually on the First Sunday of Lent (February 21) or the week preceding or after. If only unbaptized catechumens will be elected, see the RCIA book at number 118; if only baptized candidates will be called, see the RCIA book at number 446; if both catechumens and candidates will participate, see the combined rite at RCIA, number 547. Lenten Regulations

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17. Lenten regulations are as follows:

1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.

2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Distribution of Ashes on Ash Wednesday

The Congregation for Divine Worship in Rome recently released the following instructions for the distribution of Ashes during the present pandemic conditions: "The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: 'Repent, and believe in the Gospel', or 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return'. The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything."

The US Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship continues: "These changes minimize the necessity of physical contact between minister and recipient and remove the need for the minister to speak while in close proximity to the recipient. The distribution of ashes via sprinkling is a common practice in some countries but is not well known here. Therefore, the Committee encourages ministers to provide some explanation to the faithful, to avoid unnecessary confusion."

The faithful ought to be alerted to this alternative manner of distributing ashes in 2021. As the Bishops' Committee on Divine Worship notes, while sprinkling ashes upon the top of the head is not customary in the United States, this legitimate manner of giving ashes is practiced in other countries around the world. The Ash Wednesday texts from the Missal themselves speak variously of ashes "put on our heads" "receive[d] upon our heads," and "place[d] on the head." The practice also recalls Old Testament accounts of "the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust" (Nehemiah 9:1).

Feast Day of Blessed James Miller: February 13

Blessed James Miller was declared "blessed" on Saturday, December 7, 2019 in Huehuetenango Guatemala. (Read Bishop Callahan's tribute to his life, here.) While there are no proper liturgical texts for Mass or the Liturgy of the Hours on his February 13 feast day (the anniversary date of his death), Blessed James may be celebrated using texts from the "Common of Martyrs: For One Missionary Martyr" at Mass and the "Common of One Martyr" at the Liturgy of the Hours. Readings at Mass may be taken from the weekday or from the similar sections of the Lectionary.

Prayer for the Intercession of Blessed Brother James Miller, FSC

February 13, 2021, will mark the second annual observance of the feast day of Blessed James Miller. A prayer for his intercession has been approved by Bishop Callahan:

"O Blessed Brother James Miller, you heard God's call to become a Brother of the Christian Schools and so became a sign of faith to youth in the United States and in Central America.

You placed your life and your trust in Divine Providence and, for spreading the faith, merited the crown of martyrdom. In a world that denies the dignity of the human person, obtain for us from Divine Providence an ever increasing love of God and our neighbor, especially the poor and oppressed. Obtain for us also the favor we are now asking for [mention request] and the grace and strength to be a witness to Christ's love to all. Amen."

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the diocesan website. Protect and Heal Training (formerly known as Safe Environment Training):

Pastors NOTE: Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) Collection

Bishop Callahan has asked parishes to take up the CCHD collection the last weekend of January or the first weekend of February. Normally the CCHD national office sends out the materials at least a month ahead of time, but due to a database error on their part, they failed to do so this year and only a week ago expedited the shipment. Parishes should now have received the envelopes and promotional materials. Normally the week before the collection, a bulletin announcement is run. To allow for this, it is advisable that the collection be taken up the weekend of February 6-7. Here is the suggested bulletin announcement:

Blessed Brother James Miller, Martyr and Witness to the Gospel – Feast Day Feb. 13
Saturday, Feb. 13 will mark the Feast Day of Blessed James Miller. A native of Stevens Point and a De La Salle Christian Brother and missionary, Brother James was gunned down while repairing a wall at the school where he worked in Huehuetenango, Guatemala on Feb. 13, 1982. He was declared a martyr and beatified by Pope Francis on Dec. 7, 2019. Let us turn to Blessed James Miller as an example of fidelity to the Gospel and humble and fearless service on behalf of the poor and the vulnerable.

Wisconsin Bishops Issue Statement on Morality of COVID-19 Vaccines

There are three COVID-19 vaccines that are available (currently only for the most vulnerable populations), or likely to be available in the coming months. They are from Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Neither Pfizer nor Moderna used morally compromised cell lines in producing the vaccine, but they did use a morally compromised line (from kidney cells taken

from an aborted child in the Netherlands in 1972) for confirmatory testing. The AstraZeneca vaccine used that cell line in the design, development, and production stages of that vaccine, as well as for confirmatory testing. Where possible, then, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are to be preferred. But the US Bishops Conference has recently stated that all three are morally permissible because of the remoteness of the material cooperation in the evil of abortion. Catholic moral theology has always made a distinction between formal and material cooperation in an act which is morally compromised. Formal cooperation with a moral evil such as abortion is always sinful. An example of this kind of cooperation might be the doctor or nurse who directly assists with, and intends, the abortion itself. Material cooperation can be different in that it does not intend the evil act and is often more distant or remote from the act itself. Stewardship Bulletin Reflection January 31, 2021 — Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time Our readings today remind us of God's authority.

As we reflect on our Gospel, we recognize that God possesses all authority and that we want to give Him all authority. Jesus was teaching in the synagogue on the sabbath. All were fixed on His words and astonished at what He had to say. Suddenly everyone's attention shifted to a man with an unclean spirit who began to question Jesus and His authority. Jesus responded, "Quiet, come out of him!" and removed the evil spirit from the man. All were amazed at the healing of this man.

Life can sometimes look like the synagogue in Capernaum. We are living as disciples of Christ when we suddenly recognize evil around us — through events in our lives, temptations we are enduring, or by falling into sin. It can distract us, consume our attention, or even cause us to despair. In these moments of trial, we must remember the Healer in our Gospel today. Recall His words, "Quiet, come out of Him!" Jesus has the power and authority over evil, for He has conquered sin and death. He also has the power and authority over us. And when we invite Him to have that authority, He will heal us and help us persevere.

Today, we are reminded that God is in control and that we want Him to be in control. He is the loving Healer that will work miracles in our lives if we give Him the authority to do so.
