Votive Mass of St. Joseph on Wednesdays

A long-standing tradition in the Church has designated each day of the week with a particular theme to be recognized at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Priests are encouraged to offer a Votive Mass in honor of St. Joseph every Wednesday, so long as the liturgical calendar allows (see GIRM 374-376 or the ordo). Prayer texts for the Votive Mass of St. Joseph can be found

in the Roman Missal. This Votive Mass of St. Joseph every Wednesday will help parishioners draw closer to our spiritual father. In light of the titles from the Litany of St. Joseph, "Head of the Holy Family," and "Pillar of Families," a suggested prayer intention at the Votive Mass could be for a strengthening of marriages and family life.

The Diocesan "Year of St. Joseph" has been extended to December 8, 2021

With the Apostolic Letter *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021. This year recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. The Holy Father wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation." Read more ...

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The above statement must be published in your Parish Bulletin at least once a quarter and 2 nonconsecutive bulletins must be sent in with your 2020-21 Safe Environment Report.

Reports are due in 55 days. All students need Safe Environment training or a signed declination must be sent with your report. All paid staff and volunteers need a current background check and training. If their background expires before June 30, it must be renewed when you submit your report. As of today, 9 parishes have sent complete reports. St. Mary's of Greenwood is the only school to submit a report and it is complete.

<u>Are you Ministering Online to Youth?</u> Create a Safe Environment for Minors.

- Be aware of your location don't broadcast from a bedroom or a room with adult related items ie, a bar or graphic pictures on the wall.
- What type of attire do you have on? Always be professional. No pajamas.
- Consider your platform: Use Flocknote, Google Handouts or Zoom. Direct connections such as FaceTime is discouraged.
- Schedule online face-to-face contact with minors in advance through a group forum and with the knowledge & permission of parents or guardians.
- Avoid sharing personal contact information, instead provide minors with parish or group related email addresses or accounts.
- Arrange to host group meet ups and always provide parents with links/access to the meeting ups, emails, and other messages.

U.S. Bishops' Statement on Ethics of COVID-19 Vaccines

There are three COVID-19 vaccines that are either currently available (right now only for "emergency use"), or likely to be available in the coming months. They are from Pfizer, Moderna, and AstraZeneca. Neither Pfizer nor Moderna used morally compromised cell lines in producing the vaccine. A confirmatory test, however, employing the commonly used, but morally compromised HEK293 cell line (from kidney cells taken from an aborted child in the Netherlands in 1972) was performed on both vaccines. Thus, while neither vaccine is

completely free from any connection to morally compromised cell lines, in this case the connection is very remote from the initial evil of the abortion. The AstraZeneca vaccine is more morally compromised. The HEK293 cell line was used in the design, development, and production stages of that vaccine, as well as for confirmatory testing. Where possible, then, the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are to be used instead. Where that is not possible or would mean significant delay, the AstraZeneca vaccine may be used, in the same way that the Rubella vaccine is used because there is no alternative.
