DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Karen Becker, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Becker at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local parish and on the [diocesan website](#). If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the

implementation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679 or tbrown@diolc.org.

I'd like to extend a heartfelt THANK YOU to the 60 Parishes and 16 Schools that were able to send in their annual Protect and Heal Report by the March 1 deadline. I am also grateful to the parishes that called to ask for an extension. If you have questions or need help completing your report, please let me know and I will assist you.

April is National Child Abuse and Neglect Prevention Month: In 1982, President Ronald Reagan proclaimed April to be the first National Child Abuse Prevention Month, and that tradition continues on today. May survivors of abuse experience God's profound love for them, and receive comfort and healing.

Attention needed on all forms: When your volunteers or staff are filling out Safe Environment forms, please advise them that we must have their full legal name. If their legal name is Christopher, the form must have Christopher and not Chris listed and it needs to be signed as Christopher. Digital signatures are not accepted. The entire last name must be included as well. If legally your name is 2 or more names, you must list them all. Background checks must be on the current form. If it is submitted on an old form, it will no longer be accepted and the form will be destroyed.

The FBI Release form is no longer used. DO NOT send them with print cards. This form was updated last year and is now included with the Basic Background Form.
