Reminder: Employment Contracts for Catechetical Leaders

If you would like to receive an Employment Contract for your parish DRE, CRE and/or Youth Minister, please contact Ann Lankford. It is suggested that contracts only be offered to fulltime Catechetical Leaders who work 30 hours or more, which was the original reason that contracts were established.

Keep in mind that contracts are not an absolute necessity. For example, everyone working at the Diocesan Offices are at-will employees. Note: If a pastor would like information on the benefits to be offered in hiring a new catechetical leader for 30 hours or more or if a pastor does not intend to renew a contract with any of the above-mentioned employees, please contact Ann at your earliest convenience.

Preparation for First Holy Communion

- One of the most important aspects to prepare children for their First Holy Communion is to help them know what to say to Jesus after receiving Him in the Holy Eucharist. Thanking Jesus for this incredible gift and praying the Our Father slowly are a good place to start.
- The children will look beautiful to receive their First Holy Communion. Let us guide these compliments in the proper direction. The children look beautiful in order to receive Jesus.
- Inform parents that there will be time after Mass for photos of the First Communicants. The sacred moment of a child receiving Jesus for the first time is not the time to take pictures.

First Holy Communion Guidelines

As preparations are being made for children to receive their First Holy Communion, please review these guidelines that have been in place. In many parishes, the well-intentioned leaders want each child to have a specific role at Mass so that the children feel a greater sense of being part of the celebration. However noble this intention may be, this desire for each child "to do" something at Mass improperly forms children and is not the way to approach coming to the table of the Lord for the first time. Those in leadership are to help Catholic School teachers and catechists teach the proper sense of active and conscious participation in the Mass as taught by the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council. You will find a brief article on "Active Participation" and "Instruction on the Most Holy Eucharist" here: diolc.org/catechesis/sacramental-prep. Furthermore, the reader for the Liturgy of the Word is a ministerial role. This designated role of reader should be the commissioned individuals who have been properly trained to proclaim the Word of God. Breaking up the reading into sections to be read by several children is to be avoided.

Reminder: Prayers for Farming and Rural Life

As the temperatures rise, remember to support those who grow our food and fulfill God's command to "till the earth and keep it." Please find below possible intercessions for the Universal Prayer which can be used at Sunday Masses around the time of spring planting or throughout the year; a prayer to St. Isidore, the patron saint of farmers and rural life, which can be used when blessing a farmer's fields or the crosses to be placed in fields, gardens, etc., or during the weekend Masses of May 15-16 (his feast day is Saturday, May 15, 2021); and other blessing prayers. For more information, please contact Father Daniel Sedlacek, Chaplain of the Diocesan Rural Life committee.

Sample Intercessions for Sunday Mass

For a favorable weather during planting season: that the fruits of the earth may provide food enough for all people and provide for the livelihoods of farmers and growers. Let us pray to the Lord.

For farmers and their families, and for those who work in agriculture: that they be good stewards of the goods of the earth and receive what they need for their spiritual and material wellbeing. Let us pray to the Lord.

For farmers who are struggling to make ends meet: that they may be encouraged by the support of their neighbors, their Parish, and all of God's people. Let us pray to the Lord.

For a greater knowledge and love of rural life: that its values, traditions, and faith be nurtured in our communities. Let us pray to the Lord.

Prayer to St. Isidore

Good Saint, we are told that your devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was so great that you would rise before it was light in order to be able to attend Mass before beginning your work in the fields. Obtain for us, we pray, some of that loving devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. There it is that the fruits of our farm labor, bread and wine, are brought and offered to God by the priest. Then, in the Consecration, Christ Himself, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, becomes present on our altars under the appearances of this same bread and wine. And in what was the altar bread, He comes to us to be the very food of our souls. If we deeply realize the value and beauty of Holy Mass, we will be very happy to attend as often as we possibly can. Help us to understand that in the Mass we offer ourselves to God with Christ by the hands of the priest. There we can bring to God all that we do, and offer it to Him in union with His Holy Sacrifice. The more often we do this now, the happier we shall be hereafter. Good Saint Isidore, bless us and our labors, that we may someday reap the reward of good works with you in heaven. Amen.

Blessings

Sample Bulletin Announcement—Blessing of Crosses for Fields and Gardens: Planting season is underway! There is an old tradition of blessing crosses which are then placed in our fields and gardens during the growing season. It is a sign of our faith and trust in Jesus Christ with one of the fundamental necessities of life: food. The blessed cross at the edge of our fields or gardens remind us of God's care for us, especially in the things outside of our control (like the weather). Jesus said, "Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they?" (Matthew 6:26). And so, I will be blessing crosses at the weekend Masses of ______. Make (or buy) a cross that you can place in your garden or field, bring it to the Mass that weekend, and I will bless it for you.

Texts: Celebrate the blessing of the crosses after the Post-Communion prayer and before the final blessing. For the words of the blessing, use Chapter 44 of the Book of Blessings, "Order for the Blessing of Religious Articles"; or from The Roman Ritual: The Blessings, Number 24: "Blessing of Crosses to be set in fields."

A priest or deacon could also bless farm fields individually before or after the spring planting. Use either of these options from the *Book of Blessings*: Chapter 26: "Order for the Blessing of Fields and Flocks" or Chapter 27: "Order for the Blessing of Seeds at Planting Time."

Alternately, please find blessings (to be said in Latin) from *The Roman Ritual: Volume II The Blessings* by Fr. Philip Weller: Number 105: "Blessing of Young Crops and Vineyards," Number 106: "Blessing of Fields or Pastures."

How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood.
