

# Catechist Role Description

“Every baptized Catholic is personally called by the Holy Spirit to make his or her contribution to the coming of God’s Kingdom.... The catechist is a lay person specially appointed by the Church to make Christ known, loved and followed.” (*Guide for Catechists*, p. 9, 10)

**God intends to establish a true friendship with each person. The aim of your efforts is to lead the students in your care step by step to be an intentional, committed disciple of Jesus Christ through**

- 1) encountering Him in prayer at every session**
- 2) developing a daily commitment of time with Him in prayer**
- 3) receiving Jesus in the Holy Eucharist every weekend and Confession frequently**
- 4) cooperating with God’s grace to live according to His Laws of Love that keep us from harm**
- 5) loving the one Church that Jesus established**

## Responsibilities:

- Be committed to a daily habit of prayer. In order to be an authentic witness, a personal relationship with Jesus Christ is essential. Seek the guidance of the Person of the Holy Spirit, the “Teacher Within.” (National Directory for Catechesis n. 73)
- Attend training / formation sessions (National Directory for Catechesis n. 55)
- Willingness to work as a team with other catechists, catechetical leader(s) and pastor
- Pray for the children of your group and develop a partnership with parents
- Must teach approved curriculum as assigned to each grade level
- Be prepared and arrive promptly to teach weekly sessions; maintain a safe environment

## Knowledge and Skills:

- A basic understanding of Catholic teaching, Scripture, and Tradition
- Honest and caring relationships with the age group being served
- A commitment to grow in effective teaching techniques and strategies

## Qualifications:

- A desire to grow in and hand on the Catholic Faith
- A love for the Church and commitment to Her moral teachings and Sacramental life.
- Be in full communion with the Catholic Church as well as an active parishioner by participating in Holy Mass every weekend and frequent Confession
- A strength of character built on patience, responsibility, confidence and creativity
- A spirit of joy, courage, hope, enthusiasm, generosity and respect
