Free subscription to Franciscan At Home Learning System

All parishes and schools have a free subscription to *Franciscan At Home* learning system by way of generous donors. The format of each workshop is ten-minute videos, each followed by an application task, with the spiritual life of the learner at the heart of the formation. There are currently 13 different tracks available, such as Parenting Track, Adult Faith Study Track, Catechist Track, Catholic School Teacher Track, Adult Study of Sacred Scripture, Parish Catechetical Leader Track etc.

Below are simple directions to onboard

1. Visit <u>franciscanathome.com/diocese-la-crosse</u> and scroll to the bottom of the page.

2. On the right, click on the middle blue button: "My parish or school is already registered, and I would like to set up my individual free account under that institution." This will allow you to create a free account under your Parish or school.

3. Then click "Create an Account." Complete the information and click Save. Select the Diocese of La Crosse from a drop-down menu, and then your Institution = your parish / school from a second drop-down menu, listed by city and name. Once you have finished by clicking on the "Sign Up" button, you will have a dashboard. This will enable you to select from the variety of tracks. A track is a grouping of workshops. Select a track on the left, and then enter it to see the various workshops.

Memorial of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus (July 29)

From the USCCB's Committee on Divine Worship

On January 26, 2021, Pope Francis ordered the inscription of Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus into the General Roman Calendar, to replace the existing celebration of Saint Martha alone. Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus are celebrated each year as an Obligatory Memorial on July 29.

Roman Missal: An interim Mass formulary has been approved for use at this time in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>.

Lectionary: The Lectionary for the Mass readings on this Memorial have been retained (Proper of Saints, no. 607): the Gospel Acclamation and Gospel are mandatory, but the First Reading and Responsorial Psalm may be taken either from the Mass readings of the day or from the Proper of Saints.

Liturgy of the Hours: Office of Readings—Psalmody of the day (i.e., Psalter, Week I). First and Second Readings with their Responsories of the day, and Concluding Prayer from the Common of Holy Men. Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer—Psalmody of the day. Other elements from the Psalter of the day or the Common of Holy Men. Concluding Prayer from the Common of Holy Men.

Calendar Advisory: Christmas 2021 and Solemnity of Mary 2022

Adapted from the USCCB's Committee on the Liturgy March-April 2021 Newsletter This year, Christmas falls on a Saturday and is immediately followed on Sunday by the Feast of the Holy Family. In cases of consecutive feast days, there are often questions regarding which Mass is to be celebrated on Saturday evening and whether Evening Prayer II of the current day or Evening Prayer I of the following day is prayed at the Liturgy of the Hours.

On the evening of Saturday, December 25, the Nativity Mass during the Day is celebrated with its accompanying readings from the Lectionary, and Evening Prayer II is prayed. There are also questions regarding the fulfillment of the obligation to attend Mass. In short, the prevailing view of many canon lawyers is that each obligation (in this case, one for Christmas and another for Holy Family) must be fulfilled with a separate Mass. The fulfillment of the Mass obligation does not depend upon the Mass prayers and readings but rather on the time of day at which one attends Mass. The obligation to attend Mass for Christmas may be fulfilled from the evening of Friday, December 24 through Saturday, December 25. For example, one may attend the Vigil Mass of the Nativity, or Mass during the Night (celebrated at any time), or a morning/afternoon/evening Mass on December 25. The situation with the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God on Saturday, January 1, 2022 and the Solemnity of the Epiphany on Sunday, January 2, 2022 is more straightforward. In the United States, the obligation to attend Mass on the Solemnity of Mary is abrogated when this celebration occurs on a Monday or a Saturday. In this case, because the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God occurs on a Saturday, the Vigil Mass of the Epiphany is celebrated and Evening Prayer I of the Epiphany is prayed at the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. Diocesan Buildings and Grounds-Asbestos Information

School asbestos billings will be going out in August for all open and active schools in the Diocese. This billing helps to cover the costs of consultant fees, asbestos management, record keeping and some asbestos services.

This school year is also a re-inspection year. These 3-year re-inspections typically run through the fall and winter season. The Diocesan Office for Buildings and Grounds will start to schedule those in the near future. If you are operating or leasing a previous school (or building) as part of a school program (Head Start, Daycare, Preschool, etc.) these buildings must be put on an asbestos inspection schedule.

If your school has closed, please contact the office so it can be removed from the asbestos schedule. Any newly built facility does not require an asbestos inspection if the builder has provided a written statement indicating to the best of their knowledge there is no asbestos containing materials used in the construction of the building.
