# Franciscan At Home Learning System – for Busy People

Every person in the Diocese of La Crosse is welcome to a free subscription to *Franciscan At Home* learning system through your parish. The format of each workshop is ten-minute videos, followed by an application task, with the spiritual life of the learner at the heart of the formation.

# Feature workshop: Sacred Scripture: The Big Picture

The most important historical events of the Bible can be briefly described in one Story, connected by one common theme: *union with God*. The Story of the Bible portrays the drama of God's love for every soul and the whole human race: how God created us to be united with Him in a relationship of love; how we lost union with God through the original sin; how Jesus re-united us with God in a relationship of love through His passion, death and Resurrection; and how the Holy Spirit fosters a continuing unfolding of those saving events in the life of Church, as the Lord's Bride. This workshop provides 7, ten-minute videos with accompanying application tasks.

# Below are simple directions to onboard Franciscan At Home.

1. Visit <u>franciscanathome.com/diocese-la-crosse</u> and scroll to the bottom of the page.

2. On the right, click on the middle blue button: "My parish or school is already registered, and I would like to set up my individual free account under that institution." This will allow you to create a FREE account under your Parish or school.

3. Then click "Create an Account." Complete the information and click Save. Select the Diocese of La Crosse from a drop-down menu, and then your Institution = your parish / school from a second drop-down menu, listed by city and name. Once you have finished by clicking on the "Sign Up" button, you will have a dashboard. This will enable you to select from the variety of tracks. A track is a grouping of workshops. Select a track on the left, and then enter it to see the various workshops. For the workshop **Sacred Scripture: The Big Picture**, click on Adult Study of Sacred Scripture

#### Votive Mass for Blessed Michael McGivney

Fr. Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus and a priest of the Archdiocese of Hartford, was beatified on October 31, 2020. Normally, a blessed is celebrated liturgically only if he or she is inscribed in the calendar of a diocese. Since Blessed McGivney is not on our Diocesan calendar, his August 13 feast day is not observed locally. However, and by way of exception, the Holy See has permitted that "gatherings of Knights [may] celebrate a votive Mass in honor of Fr. McGivney with the permission of the local ordinary and respecting the rules of precedence laid out in the Table of Liturgical Days." In short, if a priest wishes to celebrate a votive Mass in honor of Blessed Michael McGivney for a group of Knights of Columbus—whether on August 13 or on any day that the liturgical calendar allows—he should request permission from the bishop and proper texts will be forwarded to him.

#### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u> <u>environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>.
