Looking to Renew Your Mind

Free subscription to Franciscan At Home Learning System

All parishes and schools have a free subscription to *Franciscan At Home* learning system by way of generous donors. The format of each workshop is ten-minute videos, each followed by an application task, with the spiritual life of the learner at the heart of the formation. There are currently 13 different tracks available, such as Parenting Track, Adult Faith Study Track, Catechist Track, Catholic School Teacher Track, Adult Study of Sacred Scripture, Parish Catechetical Leader Track etc.

Below are simple directions to onboard

- 1. Visit franciscanathome.com/diocese-la-crosse and scroll to the bottom of the page.
- 2. On the right, click on the middle blue button: "My parish or school is already registered, and I would like to set up my individual free account under that institution." This will allow you to create a FREE account under your Parish or school.

3. Then click "Create an Account." Complete the information and click Save. Select the Diocese of La Crosse from a drop-down menu, and then your Institution = your parish / school from a second drop-down menu, listed by city and name. Once you have finished by clicking on the "Sign Up" button, you will have a dashboard. This will enable you to select from the variety of tracks. A track is a grouping of workshops. Select a track on the left, and then enter it to see the various workshops.

Pandemic Information for the Fall?

Regarding the COVID-19 and the fall Faith Formation Program, no mandates are planned. At this time, we are asking all of our parishes to make sure you are working with your local county health department to plan a safe Faith Formation year. Decisions on wearing masks, social distancing, what type of sanitizing takes place, etc. will be made at the local level. If Bishop Callahan wishes to make a mandate due to changes within the pandemic, you will be notified immediately.

Theology of the Body is to be implemented in Middle and High School Parish Programs starting in the fall 2021 (Catholic Schools have already fully implemented TOB)

Bishop Callahan has wisely called for implementation of Theology of the Body to combat the culture which bombards our young people with lies about their true identity and dignity. The suggested resources to be used are Theology of the Body for Teens: Middle School Edition and You: Life, Love and the Theology of the Body for High School which are available from Ascension Press. Calendar Advisory: Christmas 2021 and Solemnity of Mary 2022

Adapted from the USCCB's Committee on the Liturgy March-April 2021 Newsletter This year, Christmas falls on a Saturday and is immediately followed on Sunday by the Feast of the Holy Family. In cases of consecutive feast days, there are often questions regarding which Mass is to be celebrated on Saturday evening and whether Evening Prayer II of the current day or Evening Prayer I of the following day is prayed at the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

On the evening of Saturday, December 25, the Nativity Mass during the Day is celebrated with its accompanying readings from the Lectionary, and Evening Prayer II is prayed. There

are also questions regarding the fulfillment of the obligation to attend Mass. In short, the prevailing view of many canon lawyers is that each obligation (in this case, one for Christmas and another for Holy Family) must be fulfilled with a separate Mass (i.e., two Masses for the two obligations). The fulfillment of the Mass obligation does not depend upon the Mass prayers and readings but rather on the time of day at which one attends Mass. The obligation to attend Mass for Christmas may be fulfilled from the evening of Friday, December 24 through Saturday, December 25. For example, one may attend the Vigil Mass of the Nativity, or Mass during the Night (celebrated at any time), or a morning/afternoon/evening Mass on December 25. The obligation to attend Mass for the Feast of the Holy Family may be fulfilled from the evening of Saturday, December 25 through Sunday, December 26. For example, one may attend an afternoon/evening Mass on December 25 (even though the Mass texts will be for the Nativity), or a morning/afternoon/evening Mass on December 26.

The situation with the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God on Saturday, January 1, 2022 and the Solemnity of the Epiphany on Sunday, January 2, 2022 is more straightforward. In the United States, the obligation to attend Mass on the Solemnity of Mary is abrogated when this celebration occurs on a Monday or a Saturday. In this case, because the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God occurs on a Saturday, the Vigil Mass of the Epiphany is celebrated and Evening Prayer I of the Epiphany is prayed at the *Liturgy of the Hours*.

Paid Staff also need to be fingerprinted. Many places closed during COVID, but are now open by appointment. If you have staff that have not been fingerprinted yet, please try to get this done as soon as possible.

- Frequently unwashed or hungry.
- Not wearing clothes suitable for the weather
- Having untreated illnesses or injuries
- Beg or steal food or money
- Lose or fail to gain adequate weight
- Being left alone or allowed to play in an unsafe situation
- Frequently late or missing from school.

All children deserve:

- A safe shelter.
- Adequate food
- An education.
- Medical care
- Freedom from violence
- Loving caregivers.

Neglect occurs when children are consistently deprived of the above.
