Given the many email scams and counterfeits we see weekly, it is recommended that all deacons use an email with the diocesan domain diolclergy.org or at least one from their parish. The diolclergy.org domain is part of the diocesan <u>GSuite</u>. Your diolclergy.org account will include the full range of G Suite functionality. Simply send an email message to Jack Felsheim, <u>ifelsheim@diolc.org</u>, indicating you would like to get a diolclergy.org email account setup.

It is recommended that all parish and school staff eliminate the use of free domains such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, or domains from their Internet provider and other such services when representing the diocese/parish/school via email correspondence. Adherence to this recommendation will establish an authenticity of the correspondence and reduce the potential for misrepresentation or impersonation.

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u> <u>environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. Pastors: Liturgical Notes for Sept. 22, Rural Life Day

On this annual liturgical celebration of Rural Life Day in the Diocese of La Crosse, we ask that all parishes celebrate this day by prayer and some penitential practice (fasting, abstinence from meat, etc...), especially remembering those whose livelihood depends on the land and the harvest.

Per instructions from the Office for Sacred Worship, prayers for the Mass celebrated on this day can be taken from The Mass for Various Needs and Occasions: After the Harvest (n.28), along with Preface V of the Sundays in Ordinary Time. The readings may be taken from "After the Harvest" in the Lectionary (n.20), numbers 917-921. The Gloria also ought to be said.

Sample Intercessions for Rural Life Day

- For the rural areas of our Diocese, for farmers and their families, and for those who work in agriculture, that they be good stewards of the goods of the earth and themselves receive what they need for their spiritual and material wellbeing. Let us pray to the Lord.
- For all farmers who are struggling to make ends meet, that they may be encouraged by the support of their neighbors, their parish, and all of God's people. Let us pray to the Lord.
- For a greater knowledge and love of rural life, that its values, traditions, and faith be nurtured in our communities. Let us pray to the Lord.
- For a bountiful harvest and favorable weather, that the fruits of the earth, received from God's bounty, may provide food enough for all people. Let us pray to the Lord.
- You could also pray a prayer to St. Isidore, the patron saint of farmers and rural life.

Prayer to St. Isidore

Good Saint, we are told that your devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was so great that you would rise before it was light in order to be able to attend Mass before beginning your work in the fields.

Obtain for us, we pray you, some of that loving devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. There it is that the fruits of our farm labor, bread and wine, are brought and offered to God by the priest. Then, in the Consecration, Christ Himself, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, becomes present on our altars under the appearances of this same bread and wine. And in what was the altar bread, He comes to us to be the very food of our souls. If we deeply realize the value and beauty of Holy Mass, we will be very happy to attend as often as we possibly can.

Help us to understand that in the Mass we offer ourselves to God with Christ by the hands of the priest. There we can bring to God all that we do, and offer it to Him in union with His Holy Sacrifice. The more often we do this now, the happier we shall be hereafter.

Good Saint Isidore, bless us and our labors, that we may someday reap the reward of good works with you in heaven. Amen
