Reminder: Catechetical Leader: Surveys of Students' Attitudes and Practices to be given

Attitudes and Practices Surveys will be given this year. The surveys will be given in 4th, 8th and 10th grades (and 9th if grades are combined). Surveys will be given the last week of October or one of the first 3 weeks in November. Faith Knowledge Assessments will **not** be given this year. The purpose of the surveys is to allow the catechetical leader, the pastor, catechists and parents to recognize the attitudes that students have toward faith and how they are practicing (or not practicing) the Catholic Faith in their daily lives. Each student will need access to a computer or laptop and if that is not possible, then they can use a paper copy. The surveys can be completed in about 15 mins. There must be at least 3 students in the grade to take the surveys, as there must be total confidentiality.

Keep in mind a diolclergy.org email address is highly available, portable and moves with you as you move between assignments. The diolclergy.org domain is part of the diocesan GSuite. Your diolclergy.org account will include the full range of G Suite functionality.

Simply send me a message indicating you would like to get a diolclergy.org email account setup and I'll take it from there.

It is recommended that all parish and school staff eliminate the use of free domains such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, or domains from their Internet provider and other such services when representing the diocese/parish/school via email correspondence. Adherence to this recommendation will establish an authenticity of the correspondence and reduce the potential for misrepresentation or impersonation.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the [diocesan website](#). If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679 or tbrown@diolc.org.

He takes great pleasure in helping people grow and heal from psychological wounds. He has worked for over 10 years with both survivors and perpetrators of sexual violence, including clergy sexual abuse. Mitch obtained his Masters degree in counseling at the University of Minnesota and a Master of Arts degree in Theology from the University of St. Thomas. Mitch is honored to be able to share and discuss healing with you.



Deborah Schiessl, a survivor of abuse as an adult by a Catholic priest and provided pertinent testimony resulting in his conviction for 3rd degree sexual misconduct in a recent case. She has worked as a Physical Therapist Assistant for 21 years. Deborah is a mother of 5 children and 6 grandchildren. She serves on the Restorative Justice Committee for the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis, MN. Deborah is committed to transforming and utilizing her experience of abuse to be relevant in supporting, and promulgating, efforts toward the healing of survivors. She continues to hope and is actively involved with addressing systemic changes resulting in a safer environment for all members of the Church and society.

How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood.
