Note: Bishop Callahan issued a letter in 2011 requiring that all Catholic Schools and parish programs implement the Theology of the Body for Grades 7-12. If you have not yet implemented these resources, please plan for that process in 2021-2022.

The following Programs are being used in many parishes with great impact in the Diocese:

- ➤ Edge for Middle School
- ➤ Life Teen for High School

The Life Teen model includes adult mentors that participate in the small groups during these sessions. These trained mentors are most valuable to the process, as they walk with students and encourage them in their lives.

Online Meetings: (ZOOM, GoToMeetings, Google hangout, Bluejeans)

There must always be two adults for an online meeting with children and youth. Both for the protection of the children and the adults, these two adult facilitators must be background checked and complete the Diocesan "Protect and Heal" Safe Environment Training.

Acknowledging and being engaged with young people before teaching them:

It is always the case that before teaching young people in middle school and high school, they need to be engaged with the catechist: he/she will need to know their name, acknowledge them and listen to them. One possible format for this process: Begin with an opening prayer; allow each person to state a high point of the week; then allow each person to state a difficult point of the week; and allow each person to voice an intention for which the group will pray. Close with prayer. At the next session, students may want to relate how prayers were answered.
