DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-</u> environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil** **authorities.** Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the <u>diocesan website</u>. If you have any questions about the Diocese of La Crosse and the implementation of the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*, please contact Teresa Brown, Diocese of La Crosse, at 608.791.2679 or <u>tbrown@diolc.org</u>.

Background checks and print cards are being sent in with errors, causing delays in processing. Review the forms before they are mailed to ensure all information is completed.

Background forms:

- Full names must be used. Susan not Sue, Michael not Mike if that is their name.
- Cities need to be added to the address.
- Signatures need to be written, not computer generated.

Print cards:

- When it asks for the employer, use the Parish or School name and address,
- On the bottom of the card, when it asks the reason for prints, it is NCPA/VCA Employee Do not write in "for new hire," or "local" or "for employment."
- Are you using the most current print cards? The OCA number should be N10923. If it is not, you have old, outdated cards and they should be destoyed.

I have begun sending out 2021-22 Parish Spreadsheets and Report Forms to parishes. Reports can be mailed in as soon as they are complete. You do not need to wait until the March 1 deadline. Remember, all staff and volunteers must have a current background check. If the background check expires before June 20, 2022, it must be renewed. All staff, volunteers and students need training. Students that are taught at home or through Zoom must be trained. If a parent does not want their child trained, they must complete a declination form.

Safe Environment Power Points have been Updated.

Planned Giving - Leaving a Legacy, Wills, Bequest, and Endowments:

We are in the midst of the most significant transfer of wealth ever known. The Wall Street Journal estimates that generational wealth transfer between 2018 and 2042 will be upwards of \$70 trillion. As those dollars get divided among a younger generation who are less connected to Church, it will be harder for parishes to maintain operational finances and satisfy their capital needs in the future. This forecast becomes readily apparent when we look at the confluence of the current trend of dissociation of denominational religion reflected in our declining Mass attendance and lower participation of the other Sacraments. Compounding all this is the declining general population of those under 18 in our 19 counties. These trends do not bode well for those who fail to plan.

We have been given such treasures from our parents, grandparents, those whose shoulders we stand on today; now it is our turn to make sure future generations can enjoy the reverence and beauty of a well-maintained parish. Providing parishioners with information on Endowments, Trusts, and Bequest, are just a few ways a parish can help prepare for its future.

Our Estate Planning Guide can help people save several hundred dollars in legal and financial estate planning costs. We have sent out several hundred copies per individual request, and each parish has received a copy. If you would like additional copies, don't hesitate to get in touch with our office.
