Because the process is new please allow yourself extra time to familiarize yourself with the new process, review the application questions and set aside time to complete the Google Form (application). The online form makes reading applications easier for all of the grant reviewers and dramatically reduces the time it takes to process the grants for review. The deadline for submission and approval is Friday, January 28, 2022.

Given the many email scams and counterfeits we see weekly, it is recommended that all clergy use an email with the diocesan domain <u>diolclergy.org</u> or at least one from their parish. Keep in mind a <u>diolclergy.org</u> email address is highly available, portable and moves with you as you move between assignments. The <u>diolclergy.org</u> domain is part of the diocesan Google Workspace. Your <u>diolclergy.org</u> account will include the full range of <u>Google Workspace</u> functionality.

Simply send me a message indicating you would like to get a <u>diolclergy.org</u> email account setup and I'll take it from there.

It is recommended that all parish and school staff eliminate the use of free domains such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, or domains from their Internet provider and other such services when representing the diocese/parish/school via email correspondence. Adherence to this recommendation will establish an authenticity of the correspondence and reduce the potential for misrepresentation or impersonation.

#### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

#### January is National Slavery and Human Trafficking Prevention Month.

Human trafficking can be described as a form of modern slavery, where victims, either male or female are forced into commercial sex and/or labor. Victims come from any socioeconomic group, race, culture, religion, ethnic background or age. Nobody appears to be immune or safe. However, this is an issue that many Americans are unaware of.

Every day, people are coerced, deceived and forced into being trafficked, even by those close to them. Human trafficking and exploitation thrive on secrecy, and can only be ended through awareness.

There are 25 different types of trafficking within the United States. Examples are: Sex trafficking, forced labor, forced marriage, exploitative begging and pornography. Many are targeted online. They are groomed and coerced.

## **Identify the Emotional and Physical Signs of Trafficking**

- Avoids eye contact
- Not trusting law enforcement
- Appears to lie about their age
- Uses rehearsed lines and phrases
- Avoids answering questions
- Has tattoos with symbols
- Sexualized behavior
- Act fearful, submissive or timid
- Have no type of identification
- Inability to clarify where they are living or staying
- Exhibits self abuse such as cutting
- Has older friends with different lifestyles
- Lack healthcare and/or are under nourished

If you think you have information about a trafficking situation, report immediately.

How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, God often takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood.
