Catechetical Leader Information

Preparation for Confirmation

- For information regarding the parish providing a Confirmation Retreat for the students, click here: diolc.org/catechesis/sacramental-prep/confirmation Scroll down to Confirmation Guidelines/Resources.
- According to Canon Law, “To be licitely confirmed it is required that one be suitably instructed, properly disposed and able to renew one’s baptismal promises.”
- At the heart of the Sacrament of Confirmation is the Person of the Holy Spirit and the sevenfold Gifts of the Holy Spirit. For a recorded teaching by Msgr. Joseph Hirsch, click here: diolc.org/catechesis/sacramental-prep/confirmation In order to be properly disposed to receive Confirmation, young people need to make a good examination of conscience and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
- If the students preparing for Confirmation write a letter about why they want to be confirmed and why they chose a specific saint, those letters are for the pastor only.

Witnesses for Christ Conference – August

The Witnesses for Christ Conference will be held this year in August. In working with a committee, it was decided to hold the "Conference" virtually on a Wednesday evening. A national, keynote speaker will present virtually to your catechists, parents and any interested adult as you meet together at the parish. This interactive presentation will be from roughly 5:30 - 7 p.m., with the suggestion that the Catechetical Leader then host further formation and information for the catechists. This could also include a meal before the presentation or even during, if you so desire. Cost will be \$10 per person. Further details to follow.

Infant Baptismal Preparation – ZOOM Mtg on Feb. 11th

If you are interested in reviewing the Infant Baptismal Prep booklet developed by the Offices for Catechesis & Evangelization, Marriage & Family Life and Sacred Worship, please join in a ZOOM Meeting on Feb. 11th at 11 a.m. Register ahead so the booklet can be mailed to you ahead of time. This vetted formation of parents contains two parts: “Entering into the Words and Symbols in the Rite of Baptism” and “Living as a Catholic Family.” There are also materials of preparation for parents welcoming their 2nd, 3rd, and 4th child. The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil**

authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the [diocesan website](#). 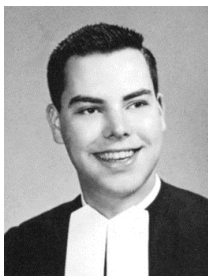

Feast of Blessed Brother James Miller – February 13

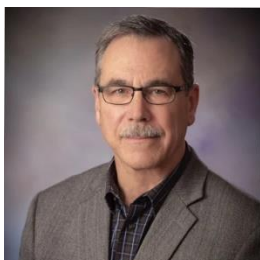
A native of Stevens Point and a De La Salle Christian Brother and missionary, Brother James Miller was gunned down while repairing a wall at the school where he worked in Huehuetenango, Guatemala on Feb. 13, 1982. He was declared a martyr and beatified by Pope Francis on Dec. 7, 2019. He stands as an example of fidelity to the Gospel and humble and fearless service on behalf of the poor and the vulnerable. Eau Claire – Rally for Life – Sunday, Feb. 6

Featured speaker – Brian Gibson, Executive Director of Pro-Life Action Ministries.



Under Brian's direction, Pro-Life Action Ministries has grown from a small activist group in the Twin Cities of Minnesota into the nation's largest and most organized sidewalk counseling ministry. Over the years, Pro-Life Action Ministries has documented nearly 3,600 babies saved directly from abortion. Brian has led *40 Days for Life* Campaigns in the Twin Cities since the first national Lenten campaign in 2008.

These led to the closing of the abortion facility inside Regions Hospital, the first abortion facility to close in Minnesota because of pro-life efforts. Pro-Life Action Ministries organizes the largest prayer events at abortion facilities in the world. Its annual all-day Good Friday Vigil brought out more than 3,800 Christians in 2019.
