Lenten Study at Home – for the Busy Person Every parish in the Diocese of La Crosse has free access to Franciscan at Home. This beautiful and compelling online learning system is worth checking out. Each workshop is 1 hour, broken into 10-minute video segments with an application that follows. There are currently 1,121 active learners on the system giving excellent evaluations.

Scroll down to “**Start Learning...**” with “**Institution Tracks**” under it and select “**Adult Faith Study**” and click on “**Christ: His Person and Works**”. Or you may click on “**Adult Study of Sacred Scripture**” and click on either “**Introduction to the Old (or New) Testament.**”

Why do Catholics Give Up Something for Lent?

During Lent, we want to make sacrifices by giving up something, such as a type of food like chocolate or dessert, or a habit that we want to quit, such as spending too much time on social media. Or we can make the choice to do something for others. Why do we do this? Lent is a time to accompany Jesus into the desert, imitating His example of prayer and fasting. By making such sacrifices of giving up something or doing something for others, we have more room in our heart to refocus our attention on God. Further, we may offer these sacrifices for the people of Ukraine, as so many are living away from home with the possibility that their home and city have been destroyed. We can also pray for the conversion of Russia, most especially the leaders of the country.

Chrism Mass, April 12

The Chrism Mass is one of the diocesan highlights at which the Bishop blesses the oils for the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and the Anointing of the Sick, and consecrates the Sacred Chrism used in the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Orders. Priests also renew their priestly promises at this Mass, and the faithful pray for them. The Chrism Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, April 12, at 10:30 a.m., at St. Joseph the Workman Cathedral in La Crosse. Please consider attending!

Easter Vigil Start Time

Sunset in La Crosse on Saturday, April 16 is to be at 7:50 p.m. So that the Vigil may begin in darkness, 8:30 should be the earliest beginning time for the vigil.

Prayers over the People at the end of Mass

The Roman Missal includes an optional “Prayer over the People” for each weekday during Lent. The rubrics for using “Prayers over the People” are found in the collection of “Blessings at the End of Mass and Prayers over the People” in the Roman Missal, immediately following the Dismissal texts in the Order of Mass. These indicate the following order:

1. Prayer after Communion.
2. Brief announcements, if necessary.
3. “The Lord be with you.”
4. “And with your spirit.”
5. “Bow down for the blessing,” said by the Deacon or Priest.
6. Prayer over the people, with hands outstretched. R/. Amen.
7. “And may the blessing of almighty God, the Father, and the Son, + and the Holy Spirit, come down on you and remain with you ever.” R/. Amen.
8. “Go in peace.”
9. “Thanks be to God.”

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its [policies and procedures](#), seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at:

The donations received last week, counting medical equipment donated by healthcare institutions, filled 64 pallets at McDonell High School! Three full semi-trucks will carry this aid to then be transported by air to a neighboring country, and on to the areas of need in Ukraine. Valentyna has excellent contacts at each step and a solid plan. Please pray that this aid safely reaches those in dire need of it.

Stewardship Homily Reflections:

Parishes that incorporate Stewardship of Time and Talent in their Stewardship efforts see greater returns in their Stewardship of Treasure. For example, those who include Time and Talent in their Reunite, Recovery, and Rejoice appeal saw an increase on average of 18.22% of their pre-covid offertory. At the same time, those who did just a Treasure appeal saw an average increase of 8.31%. In contrast, those who did not participate in the appeal effort saw an average -3.5% decrease over their precovid offertory.

We will leave Prairie du Chien on Sunday, July 24 in the evening by Warco Bus to Schriever, Louisiana. We will make our camp there for the week and start our work on Tuesday morning. We will work through Friday. We are planning a fun event with a possible airboat ride to see alligators and a few other life sightseeing tours as our fun day Saturday. Then we will return home on Sunday July 31, 2022. We are following all COVID guidelines and taking every precaution necessary. Let's all pray that by that time things are much improved by then.

Cost of the trip is \$400. Only out of pocket expenses will be meals on the ride to and from Louisiana and souvenirs. We are asking for at least a \$200 deposit by March 15th to hold the spot, and paid in full by May 1, 2022.
