Pastors: Employment Contracts for Catechetical Leaders

If you would like to receive an Employment Contract for your parish DRE, CRE and/or Youth Minister, please contact Ann Lankford. It is suggested that contracts only be offered to full time Catechetical Leaders who work 30 hours or more, which was the original reason that contracts were established. Further, keep in mind that contracts are not an absolute necessity. For example, everyone working at the Diocesan Offices are at-will employees. Note: If a pastor would like information on the benefits to be offered in hiring a new catechetical leader for 30 hours or more or if a pastor does not intend to renew a contract with any of the above-mentioned employees, please contact Ann at your earliest convenience.

Catechetical Leader Information

First Holy Communion - Guidelines

In many parishes, the well-intentioned leaders want each child to have a specific role at Mass so that the children feel a greater sense of being part of the celebration. However noble this intention may be, this desire for each child "to do" something at Mass improperly forms children and is not the way to approach coming to the table of the Lord for the first time. Help your Catholic school teachers and catechists to teach the proper sense of active and conscious participation in the Mass as taught by the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council. Furthermore, the reader for the Liturgy of the Word is a ministerial role. This designated role of reader should be the commissioned individuals who have been properly trained to proclaim the Word of God. Catechesis of the Good Shepherd A Vision for Children

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd offers Christian formation for children ages 0 through 12. Through this experience, children (and adults) are helped to form an authentic, faithful relationship with God. This Catechesis is grounded in scriptural and liturgical study, framed by Montessori's principles of education. It gives children the opportunity to hear the Gospel and absorb its message through the use of sensorially rich materials and the work of their hands.

This method of catechesis began with Maria Montessori and was continued in Rome, Italy, in 1954 by Sofia Cavalletti, a Hebrew and Scripture scholar, and her colleague, Gianna Gobbi, a Montessori trained educator. Both women were Roman Catholic. In their work with children, they sought to discover what face of God children most needed to see, in order to grow in their knowledge and love of God. Children need the sensitive guidance of the adult and the inner guidance of the Holy Spirit to nurture this relationship. The adult prepares the sacred space for children, called the atrium, which allows them a prayerful place to learn to listen to and respond to a relationship with God through Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

The atrium is a place of community and worship. It is a place to be with God, enjoy Him, listen to His Word, and to pray. It is designed to reflect the beauty of His creation and God's abiding love. It is also a place to begin to learn and recognize the signs and symbols that speak of Him through the liturgies of Eucharist and Baptism.

Grounds Crew - (up to 8 Seasonal Employees)

Catholic Cemeteries in the La Crosse area runs four cemeteries. Each requires lawn mowing, watering and general grounds keeping work during the Summer months. Flowers and memorials also need to be maintained and watered.

The Director of Catholic Cemeteries is in need of a team of grounds keepers this summer. Part time or full time work is available. You will work mainly outdoors, at multiple locations, mowing and watering lawn, watering flowers, and general grounds keeping.

No driver's license is required, as full time staff will drive teams between the cemetery locations. Each team will work with a supervisor or experienced groundskeeper.

Must be able to lift up to 60 lbs, be on your feet for the majority of the work day (4 hours or 8 hours) and must be able to tolerate the heat / sun.

The total number of hires will depend upon the number of hours each individual is willing/able to work. Number of hours is flexible, but once a schedule is determined, each employee will be expected to maintain a consistent work schedule.

Masses to Offer for Peace in Ukraine

The selection of Masses for Various Needs and Occasions in the Roman Missal offers additional ways in which parishes can continue to pray for peace in Ukraine. These are found in Part II of the Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, "For Civil Needs." They include the Mass for the Preservation of Peace and Justice (no. 30), the Mass In Time of War or Civil Disturbance (no. 31), and the Mass for Refugees and Exiles (no. 32). During Easter season, these Masses can be used on most weekdays, even on obligatory memorials, at the discretion of the celebrant in the case of serious need or pastoral advantage. Prayers for Farming and Rural Life

As spring and planting season arrives, remember to support those who grow our food and fulfill God's command to "till the earth and keep it." Please find below possible intercessions for the Universal Prayer that can be used at Sunday Masses around the time of spring planting or throughout the year. Consider, also, distributing and/or praying a prayer to St. Isidore, the patron saint of farmers and rural life, at the weekend Masses of May 14-15 (his feast day is Sunday, May 15, 2022). Also consider offering a blessing for seeds, soil or crosses that are placed in fields and gardens, which the people can bring to Mass that weekend to be blessed. There is also a blessing of a farmer's fields at their farm.

Sample Intercessions for Sunday Mass

For favorable weather during planting season: that the fruits of the earth may provide food enough for all people and provide for the livelihoods of farmers and growers. Let us pray to the Lord.

For farmers and their families, and for those who work in agriculture: that they be good stewards of the goods of the earth and receive what they need for their spiritual and material well being. Let us pray to the Lord.

For farmers who are struggling to make ends meet: that they may be encouraged by the support of their neighbors, their parish and all of God's people. Let us pray to the Lord.

For a greater knowledge and love of rural life: that its values, traditions and faith be nurtured in our communities. Let us pray to the Lord.

Prayer to St. Isidore

Good Saint, we are told that your devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was so great that you would rise before it was light in order to be able to attend Mass before beginning your work in the fields. Obtain for us, we pray, some of that loving devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. There it is that the fruits of our farm labor, bread and wine, are brought and offered to God by the priest. Then, in the Consecration, Christ Himself, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, becomes present on our altars under the appearances of this same bread and wine. And in what was the altar bread, He comes to us to be the very food of our souls. If we deeply realize the value and beauty of Holy Mass, we will be very happy to attend as often as we possibly can. Help us to understand that in the Mass we offer ourselves to God with Christ by the hands of the priest. There we can bring to God all that we do and offer it to Him in union with His Holy Sacrifice. The more often we do this now, the happier we shall be hereafter. Good Saint Isidore, bless us and our labors, that we may someday reap the reward of good works with you in heaven. Amen.

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its policies and procedures, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available through your local Parish and on the diocesan website. NET Ministries

Each year, NET Ministries sends more than 175 young adults across the country in teams of 8-14 to proclaim the Gospel to Catholic youth.
