First Holy Communion - Guideline

In many parishes, the well-intentioned leaders want each child to have a specific role at Mass so that the children feel a greater sense of being part of the celebration. However noble this intention may be, this desire for each child "to do" something at Mass improperly forms children and is not the way to approach coming to the table of the Lord for the first time. Help your Catholic School teachers and catechists to teach the proper sense of active and conscious participation in the Mass as taught by the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council. Furthermore, the reader for the Liturgy of the Word is a ministerial role. This designated role of reader should be the commissioned individuals who have been properly trained to proclaim the Word of God. Breaking up the reading into sections to be read by several children is to be avoided. Potential Tax Credits:

Parishes may be eligible to receive tax credits (Employee Retention Credit) due to government shut-down (WI - Safer at Home Order: March, 2020 - May 13, 2020), and /or reduced collections/earnings during COVID. (Quarterly comparison prior year or prior quarter) may be eligible for up to 8 tax credits (each quarter 2020 and 2021).

Your parish may be eligible, even if you claimed the PPP loan. The restrictions and regulations have been amended, and may provide additional credits. The only restriction is you are not able to claim the same dollar for both PPP and the Employee Retention Credit.

Masses to Offer for Peace in Ukraine

The selection of Masses for Various Needs and Occasions in the Roman Missal offers additional ways in which parishes can continue to pray for peace in Ukraine. These are found in Part II of the Masses for Various Needs and Occasions, "For Civil Needs." They include the Mass for the Preservation of Peace and Justice (no. 30), the Mass In Time of War or Civil Disturbance (no. 31), and the Mass for Refugees and Exiles (no. 32). During Lent, each of these collections of prayers and antiphons may be used on most weekdays with the permission of the diocesan bishop or at his direction (which Bishop Callahan gives). These Masses cannot be authorized on a Sunday in Lent, however. During Easter season, these Masses can be used on most weekdays, even on obligatory memorials, at the discretion of the celebrant in the case of serious need or pastoral advantage. On weekdays in Ordinary Time, it is sufficient that their use simply foster the devotion of the people. (Read more at Adoremus Bulletin: <u>https://adoremus.org/2022/03/mass-during-wartime/</u>)

Chrism Mass, April 12

The Chrism Mass is one of the diocesan highlights at which the Bishop blesses the oils for the celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and the Anointing of the Sick, and consecrates the Sacred Chrism used in the Sacraments of Confirmation and Holy Orders. Priests also renew their priestly promises at this Mass, and the faithful pray for them. The Chrism Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, April 12, at 10:30 a.m., at St. Joseph the Workman Cathedral in La Crosse. Please consider attending! Some Liturgical Reminders

5th Sunday of Lent

• In the Dioceses of the United States, the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from the Fifth Sunday may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil.

Mass of the Lord's Supper

- Altar may be decorated with flowers. (Rubric for Holy Thursday [=HT], 5)
- At the beginning of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, there may be a procession of the faithful in which gifts for the poor may be presented with the bread and wine. (HT, 14)
- Adoration is not to take place in a monstrance: "The Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a closed tabernacle or pyx. Under no circumstances may it be exposed in a monstrance." (*Paschalis Sollemnitatis*, n.55)
- Holy water stoups are emptied after Mass.

Good Friday

- Good Friday liturgy may not be celebrated in the absence of a priest. (Rubric for Good Friday [=GF], 4)
- Only one cross may be used for adoration. (GF, 19)

Easter Vigil

- The Paschal Candle is to be replaced each year: "The paschal candle should be prepared, which for effective symbolism must be made of wax, never be artificial, be renewed each year, be only one in number, and be of sufficiently large size so that it may evoke the truth that Christ is the light of the world." (*Paschalis Sollemnitatis*, n.82)
- If a deacon is not present to carry the Paschal Candle in the procession, the candle is carried by another minister and not the priest. (Rubric for the Easter Vigil [=EV], 15 and following)
- Lights in the church building are turned on when Paschal Candle is placed in its stand at front of church at end of the entrance procession. (EV, 17)
- If possible, the Priest intones triple Alleluia. (EV, 34)

• It is appropriate for the baptism of infants to take place at the Easter Vigil. (*Rite of Baptism for Children*, n.9; also Roman Missal, Easter Vigil rubric n.38)

Faculties for Adult Confirmation

Presently, a priest has the permission, either in virtue of universal Church law or by grant of the diocesan bishop, to confirm the following persons:

- (a) those persons who are no longer infants and whom he baptizes (cf. Cann. 530, 1°; 566, §1; 882; 883, 2° and 885, §2; *RCIA*, Nos. 14, 24, 215 and 305);
- (b) those persons who have attained the use of reason but already have been baptized in another church or ecclesial communion, when they are received by him into full communion with the Catholic Church (cf. Cann. 883, 2° and 885, §2; RCIA, No. 481; NSC, No. 35);
- (c) the baptized Catholic who has been an apostate from the faith (cf. Can. 883, 2°; *NSC*, No. 28);
- (d) the baptized Catholic who through no fault of his or her own has been raised in a non-Catholic religion or joined a non-Catholic religion (ibid);
- (e) the baptized Catholic who through no fault of his or her own never put the faith into practice. (cf. Can. 884, §1; *NSC*, No. 29).
- (f) those who are in danger of death (cf. Cann. 566 §1 and 883, 3°)

If, however, a priest wishes to confirm <u>a baptized Catholic who has been practicing the faith</u> (that is, he or she is not in the circumstances described above), permission for the faculty to do so must be requested from the diocesan bishop (Can. 882, Can. 884, §1). DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office for Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at:

Restorative Justice - Healing the Harm Thursday April 7th 7:00 - 8:30 pm CST on Zoom

Fr. Daniel Griffith from the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis will be the speaker. In his words, "Restorative justice, as practiced today, asks three fundamental questions: who was harmed, what was the nature of the harm, and how can the harmed be repaired?"

Teresa Brown, the Director of Safe Environment for the Diocese of LaCrosse will also speak on how to make a report of allegation and the resources available from the diocesan office.

April is National Child Abuse and Prevention Month.

A report of child abuse is made every ten seconds in the United States and 5 children die each day due to abuse or neglect. If you see something, say something. If not you...then who? It not now...then when? If not for the sake of Jesus Christ and his kingdom...then why?

The policy on Background checking and training:

There is some confusion on background checks and training. Before someone can begin working or volunteering at a school or parish, they need to complete a background check form and it must be approved prior to their first day in their position. Safe Environment training must also be done before they begin in their position. Background checks are for those age 16 and older who are employed by a parish or school or volunteers who have consistent contact with minors.

Parishes may decide they want others background checked, such as money counters or council members and this is acceptable. Beginning with the next audit period, July 1, 2022, it had been requested by the USCCB Auditors to have anyone who does home ministry to have a background check. This means those going into a parishioner's home to pray or give communion should be background checked. This is to ensure the safety of the sick and vulnerable.

- All field trip chaperones must be background checked and trained prior to the event they are chaperoning even if it is a one time event.
- Background checks need to be renewed every 3 years. Training is done annually.
- Paid staff age 18 and older and all Coaches and Janitors, regardless if they are paid or volunteer age 18 must be fingerprinted. Fingerprinting is good for a lifetime unless there is a break in service.
- Fingerprints, background checks and training can be transferred from parish to parish, school to parish or school to school as long as there has not been a break in service,
- All background checks must be signed with an actual signature. Digital signatures will not be accepted.
- Fingerprints not done for the Diocese of La Crosse are not accepted even if the person has had them done through the military or as a law enforcement officer.

- The Gross Amount Pledged & Received before Parish Rebates YTD versus YTD same time last year is up 5.1%
- The Net Amount Pledged & Received after Parish Rebates YTD versus YTD same time last year is up 4.2%

Stewardship Homily Reflections:

Parishes that incorporate Stewardship of Time and Talent in their Stewardship efforts see greater returns in their Stewardship of Treasure. For example, those who included Time and

Talent in their *Reunite, Rebuild, and Rejoice* appeal saw an increase on average of 18.22% of their pre-covid (2018-19) offertory. At the same time, those who did just a Treasure appeal saw an average increase of 8.31%. In contrast, those who did not participate in the appeal effort saw an average -3.5% decrease over their precovid offertory.

Potential Tax Credits:

Parishes may be eligible to receive tax credits (Employee Retention Credit) due to government shut-down (WI - Safer at Home Order: March, 2020 - May 13, 2020), and /or reduced collections/earnings during COVID. (Quarterly comparison prior year or prior quarter) may be eligible for up to 8 tax credits (each quarter 2020 and 2021).

Your parish may be eligible, even if you claimed the PPP loan. The restrictions and regulations have been amended, and may provide additional credits. The only restriction is you are not able to claim the same dollar for both PPP and the Employee Retention Credit.

<u>This file</u> provides information regarding the tax credit and should help you determine if you are eligible to claim the credit. Should you have any questions, please reach out to Jim Reider (<u>ireieder@diolc.org</u>) or Margaret Ebner (<u>mebner@diolc.org</u>).

After April 18 (tax day) Wegner CPAs is willing to help our parishes file for the tax credit - for an hourly fee. We are providing this information to you now so you can determine if you may be eligible to receive the credit for some or all of the eligible quarters.

We are working with Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux to set the housing and job sites organized. They have secured us housing at the Lumen Christi Retreat Center. There will be beds for all and is in a dorm like seng. The center will also provide our breakfast and dinners each day. We will be working with Catholic Charities and the Cajun Navy on the job sites. Students must have at least completed their freshman year of high school to qualify. We will leave Prairie du Chien on Sunday, July 24 in the evening by Warco Bus to Schriever, Louisiana. We will make our camp there for the week and start our work on Tuesday morning. We will work through Friday. We are planning a fun event with a possible airboat ride to see alligators and a few other lile sightseeing tours as our fun day Saturday. Then we will return home on Sunday July 31, 2022. We are following all COVID guidelines and taking every precaution necessary. Let's all pray that by that time things are much improved.

Cost of the trip is \$400. Only out of pocket expenses will be meals on the ride to and from Louisiana and souvenirs. We are asking for at least a \$200 deposit by March 15th to hold the spot, and paid in full by May 1, 2022.
