Getting to know Jesus Christ in a deeper way: Reading the Catechism in 10 months

We grow in our love for someone as we get to know them better. Would you like to grow in your love for Jesus Christ through coming to know Him better? Reading the Catechism, a few pages each day, will help you to deepen your understanding of His incredible love for you. A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week over 38 weeks. Confirmation: Goals for the Process of Preparation

There are specific, stated goals that need to be built into the preparation of students to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. These include

- Develop a more intimate union with Jesus Christ in daily prayer (CCC 1309).
- Cultivate a relationship with the Holy Spirit as well as have a more lively familiarity with His actions, His gifts and His promptings in order to be capable of assuming the apostolic responsibilities.
- Be committed to living a Sacramental Life, above all by participating in Sunday Mass each week and receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation frequently.
- Comprehend how to live life in the Holy Spirit.

Clarification/Refresher for secretaries/bookkeepers: MC vs WMS

The Mission Co-op (MC) Program facilitates the annual assignment of a specific missionary group (vetted and assigned by the Mission Office) to make an appeal at each parish of the diocese. Assignment letters are sent in early spring to each pastor/parish administrator. This appeal takes place each summer (usually May through August, unless special arrangements are made between the missionary and the pastor). It provides a personal connection between the missionary life of the Church and parishioners, whose most important support is prayer. Financial donations for the Mission Co-op Program should be recorded with regular contributions and are deposited in the parish accounts. The totals are later forwarded from the parish to the Mission Office, with "Mission Co-op" in the check memo. We do not keep any records of individual donations for MC. The program is designed to protect the donor information so their offering remains anonymous and does not generate continued solicitation for support. The notice "*Please return and make checks payable to your parish*", should be printed in the bulletin and/or on envelopes used for the Mission Co-op Program from the parish or missionaries.

World Mission Sunday (WMS) is a completely separate event from MC, and **takes place the second to last Sunday of October each year** (this year October 22-23, 2022 week-end). This is a universal pontifical celebration for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, and more information for WMS 2022 will be coming soon. No Mission Co-op appeals should be given on World Mission Sunday, as this Sunday is set aside specifically for the pontifical SPOF collection. DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities**. Annual Report schedule for parish Finance Contacts

Thank you everyone for your good work toward reconciling your parish accounts. Together we've made tremendous progress incorporating the new chart of accounts and online software. The automated prototype Annual Report, the Cemetery and Endowment reports are making good progress toward balancing. A number of parishes have asked that we run another, individual, per-parish prototype Annual Report to check their work. Unfortunately that is not possible. The report instruments we've developed involve all of the parishes being run in a batch-type process. Here is our planned overall schedule for the next several months as we work together to finalize the Annual Report.

The schedule for the Annual Report

- The parish fiscal year ended June 30, 2022.
- Complete the online Statement of General Statistics for this past fiscal year (2021-2022) bishoprep.diolc.org/
- Download and complete On Consultation in the Parish. Email the completed form to kjereczek@diolc.org.
- Plan to close your parish books for this past fiscal year (2021-2022) not later than August 31, 2022. This includes cemetery and endowment accounts.
 - Parishes with schools that participate in the state voucher program and are subject to state audits are exempt from the August 31 closing. They will not close the fiscal year until their voucher program audit is finalized and adjusting journal entries are recorded. These journal entries must be completed, and the books closed, by October 31, 2022.

- Parishes with schools should download and complete Catholic Mutual Financial Review Verification Form. Email the completed form to kjereczek@diolc.org.
- Parishes using nonstandard accounts, including header accounts, have been repeatedly advised since May to reclassify transactions into valid accounts. Any nonstandard account transactions not reclassified by September 1 are subject to reclassification at Finance staff discretion, with notice to the parish.
- Data for the automated Annual Report will be extracted after close of business on Tuesday, September 14, 2022.
 - We will accept data updates for parish schools audits until close of business Monday, November 1, 2022.
- Parish adjusting journal entries subsequent to review of the prior year (2021-2022) Stewardship analysis must be completed no later than October 31, 2022.
- After November 1, 2022 parishes with less than \$5,000 imbalance on the (2021-2022) Annual Report will be resolved to balance at Finance staff discretion and with notice to the parish.
- After November 1, 2022 parishes with more than \$5,000 imbalance on the (2021-2022) Annual Report are required to schedule up to 1 hour with Claudia Weinberger to resolve the parish imbalance, cweinberger.youcanbook.me. Claudia will advise a resolution at finance staff discretion including notice to the parish.
- Stewardship offices will report each parish's final and official Annual Report on each parish's Giving Trend website.
- Stewardship offices will calculate next year's (2023-2024) Annual Appeal and Finance offices will calculate next year's (2023-2024) Quota assessments no later than November 30, 2022.
- Final Annual Appeal and Quota assessments (2023-2024) will be issued to parishes at the beginning of December, 2022.
