Catechetical Leader Information

Teaching Children and Youth How to Pray - Essential Foundation

Over the last several years, young people from various parts of the diocese have expressed a desire to develop a deeper friendship with Jesus Christ through prayer, asking that they go beyond simply saying words that possibly have no meaning for them. Rather, they truly want to pray the words of these prayers from their heart, speaking with and listening to Jesus Christ as they do so.

In this initiative of "Going Deeper in Prayer," the resources provide a focus on one prayer for each age level for the entire year. These prayers have been carefully chosen, beginning with the simplest in words and what the smallest children are able to grasp. As the young people mature in their late teens, there is a progression that builds, always moving toward an adult relationship

For the 12th grade, upon multiple requests by students, a series of sessions on "How God Guides Us" was developed. Each session contains a teaching on one way that God guides us, a Scripture study on how God guided a particular person in this manner, and two real-life stories of how God guided a man and a woman in our time, in this way. This training is essential for the student throughout the year, with a focus on the dignity of the human person. Surveys of Catholic Attitudes and Practices

For parishes who were not able to take these last year, the surveys will be given in 4th, 8th and 10th grades (and 9th if grades are combined). Surveys will be given the last week of October or one of the first 3 weeks in November. The purpose of the surveys is to allow the catechetical leader, the pastor, catechists and parents to recognize the Catholic attitudes that students have toward the Faith and how they are practicing (or not practicing) the Catholic Faith in their daily lives. Each student will need access to a computer or laptop and if that is not possible, then they can use a paper copy. The surveys can be completed in about 15 mins. There must be at least 6 students in the grade to take the surveys, as total confidentiality must be ensured. To confirm, only parishes that did not take the surveys last year will take them this year. Note: The Faith Knowledge Assessments will not be given this year.

Confirmation Retreat - Dec. 3rd

Students preparing for Confirmation need to attend a retreat. There will be an opportunity on Dec. 3rd at St. Olaf Parish in Eau Claire. See further info under Youth and Young Adult.

Sacred Scripture: The Big Picture

The most important historical events of the Bible can be briefly described in one story, connected by one common theme: union with God. *The Story of the Bible* portrays the drama of God's love for every soul and the whole human race: how God created us to be united with Him in a relationship of love; how we lost union with God through the original sin; how Jesus reunited us with God in a relationship of love through His passion, death and Resurrection; and how the Holy Spirit fosters a continuing unfolding of those saving events in the life of Church, as the Lord's Bride. Often in a catechetical setting we fall into the habit of teaching individual topics without reference to the greater context of salvation history. In order to draw others into the life of God and the Church we have to help them make this *Story of the Bible* their own. Everything that the Church teaches, her doctrines, disciplines, worship, and morality makes sense when delivered within the context of the *Story of the Bible*. The *Story of the Bible* tells us of our spiritual roots, our dignity, our destiny, and daily vocation to follow Jesus Christ, providing peace and authentic hope to those we seek to teach and evangelize.

Reminder: Parish/School staff email accounts

We are expanding the offering of Google Workspace for Nonprofits accounts to all parish and school staff in the Diocese of La Crosse. Now you can get diocesan secure accounts branded with diolcparish.org and coupled with your six character parish/city identifier; these accounts create unique email domains linked to your particular parish. As an example, the email address for Holy Family Parish in Poniatowski is parishoffice@hfppon.diolcparish.org. If you have multiple parishes, we have options for constructing your parish prefix. Many parishes are still using gmail.com, hotmail.com or other Internet service provider based accounts. This is a chance to update and standardize your parish email scheme while taking advantage of the Google Workspace platform without incurring any additional expenses.

To get started, simply send Zach Tudahl (ztudahl@diolc.org) the unique names for the people who wish to have parish email accounts. Some examples to consider: secretary@, bookkeeper@, parishoffice@ or dre@. You could also choose to use people's names or abbreviations (first initial, last name) to construct your email addresses. You will have complete flexibility as to what you can use before your @xxxxxx.diolcparish.org domain. We suggest standardizing the naming convention to simplify matters. Keep in mind, these are fully functioning Google Workspace for Nonprofits accounts, complete with email, video calling, calendar, drive, contacts and productivity apps. There are no setup or recurring costs for these accounts. Also, utilizing these accounts will not require you to change your existing Internet service provider. These accounts are not dependent on any particular Internet service provider and will work with mobile devices. Please note: during the setup of your new account, Google may require a cell phone number for verification purposes.

Are you considering a vocation or discerning your life's vocation? This fall the Sisters of the Franciscan Congregation of Divine Mercy are offering the following opportunities at the Merciful Heart of Jesus Farm in Marshfield.

For single men and women: "Discernment Workshop" on Oct. 15th. This workshop will begin with Holy Mass. It will offer instruction to help you discern God's Will for your state in life, whether that be to the married state, the religious life, or the single life.

For single women age 18 and above: "Discernment Weekend for those considering religious life," Oct. 1st and 2nd – A two day opportunity, beginning with Holy Mass, to join with the Sisters of the Franciscan Congregation of Divine Mercy in prayer and work. 

DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or intakeagent@diolc.org. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. Copies of the diocesan policy are available


