We can always deepen our understanding and devotion to this great mystery of Jesus' true Presence in the Eucharist. The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year movement in the United States, sponsored by the U.S. Bishops. This is an extremely significant time to realize fully that the Eucharist is the most important place of encounter with Jesus and is the foundation of our Catholic Faith. Don't miss it! The Parish Advent Series provides a starting point.

- 1<sup>st</sup> week of Advent: Jesus' True Presence in the Eucharist with Msgr. Joseph Hirsch At Christmas we read from Scripture that Jesus is Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." Jesus came on the first Christmas to save us. Again and again, Jesus comes to us in the Eucharist. Our faith comes alive as we understand better that Jesus gives us His Real Presence in the Eucharist.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> week: <u>Receiving and Adoring Jesus Communion and Thanksgiving</u> with Fr. Justin Kizewski

Jesus gives us the Gift of Himself on Christmas. Jesus continues to give us the greatest Gift – the Gift of Himself in the Eucharist again and again in a life-giving encounter. This is really the whole meaning of Christmas. Jesus came to give us Himself as food; He is literally the Bread of Life – supernatural bread that saves us, that spiritually nourishes and strengthens us with His grace.

- 3<sup>rd</sup> week: Offering ourselves with Jesus to the Father with Msgr. Richard Gilles
- 4<sup>th</sup> week: "Source and Summit" of the Church's Life with Father Steven Weller

# A Minute with Jesus for Nov. 27 - the first week of Advent 6. How do we get to know Jesus better?

Jesus knows each one of us better than we know ourselves and He loves us. Friendship always involves two persons. We want to get to know this Person who loves us so much through reading the Scriptures (the Bible). As we enter Advent, it is a perfect time to read the Scriptures and remember how Jesus came to us, born as an infant.

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: Jesus, give me the desire to read the Bible a few minutes each day. This week, read how Mary gave her 'yes' to be the Mother of the Savior in Luke 1: 26-38

#### Preparation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation The Family needs to be "Student"

The family has the most important role in communicating the Christian values that form the foundation for a child's understanding of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The catechesis offered should help parents grow in their own understanding and appreciation of Confession, and enable them to catechize their children more effectively. (See NDC, 36.A.3a)

#### Developing a mindset of focusing on the Family as the "Student"

The faith of children at any age is intimately bound up with the way in which they are parented. As a parish staff, or the catechetical leader and catechists, experience a workshop on *Franciscan at Home*. It works well to watch 2, 10 minute videos and discuss each during an hour.

#### DIOCESE OF LA CROSSE GUIDELINES FOR REPORTING INSTANCES OF CHILD ABUSE

The Diocese of La Crosse, through its <u>policies and procedures</u>, seeks to provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (bishop, priest, deacon, employee, religious, vendor or volunteer). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should send that report to Mrs. Teresa Brown, Complaint Intake Agent, at the Diocese of La Crosse, P.O. Box 4004, La Crosse, WI 54602-4004. Alternatively, you can contact Mrs. Brown at 608.791.0179 or <u>intakeagent@diolc.org</u>. The reporting form is available through the Diocese of La Crosse Office of Safe Environment or on the diocesan website at: <u>diolc.org/safe-environment/reporting</u>. **Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities**.
