

In May of 2023, U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy declared loneliness an epidemic in this country. The pervasive lonesomeness and the lack of unity often result in depression, physical health issues, violence, and increasing the risk of premature death by more than 60%. He added, "Our relationships are a source of healing ... that can help us live healthier, more fulfilled, and more productive lives."
