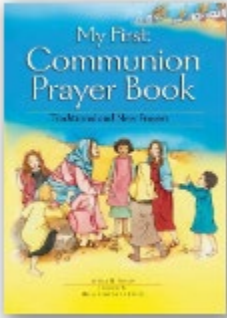

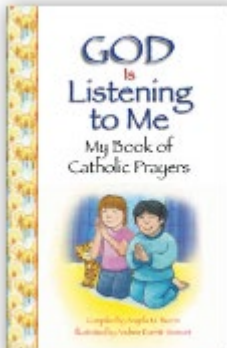
If each parish requests the number of books based upon the **current number of students in these grades**, there should be enough, but this will be based upon first come, first serve.

Author: Angela Burrin

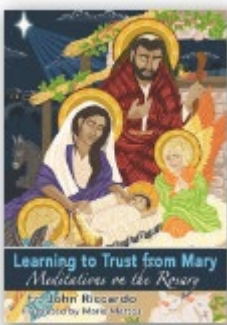

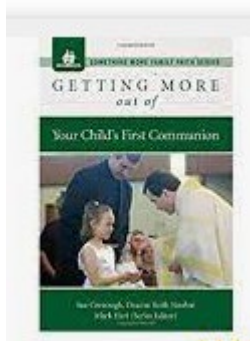


### ***Learning to Trust from Mary: Meditations on the Rosary***

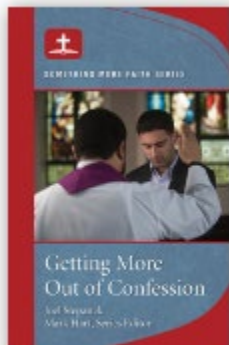


### **Getting More Out of Your Child's First Communion (booklet)**
