

The following truths underlie any formation in prayer:

- 1. The Person of Christ desires that you develop a friendship with Him. This relationship is prayer. You will want to study and continue learning about the Person of Jesus, but even more importantly, you want to encounter, develop and deepen your friendship with Him by being committed to personal and communal prayer.
- 2. Every person needs to learn how to pray. "Like a wise teacher Jesus takes hold of us where we are and leads us progressively toward the Father." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, hereafter CCC, paragraph 2607). Jesus teaches you how to pray!
- 3. The Holy Spirit dwells within you and guides you in prayer! "The Holy Spirit is the interior Master of Christian prayer" (CCC 2672). The Holy Spirit helps and guides you to develop a daily habit of prayer. If you ask, He will even give you the desire to pray.
- 4. Learning about Jesus in an ongoing way, being committed to speaking with and listening to Him on a daily basis and receiving the Sacraments are needed in order to be strengthened by God to love Him and our neighbor.
