The hymn "You are Peter and upon this Rock I will build My Church" (Mt 16:18-19) is sung as Pope Leo XIV processes into St. Peter's Basilica. 55:01 1:00:00
- Pope Leo XIV prays in silence at the tomb of the Apostle Peter beneath the main altar of St. Peter's Basilica, accompanied by Eastern Patriarchs, before his Inauguration Mass begins. This solemn moment marks the beginning of his Petrine Ministry as Bishop of Rome, connecting him to the first Pope.

- The Cardinals and Pope Leo XIV process through St. Peter's Basilica and enter St. Peter's Square for his Inauguration Mass. The procession is accompanied by the ancient Gregorian Chant, a special litany invoking the saints to intercede for the Pope's sanctity as he begins his ministry as the successor of St. Peter. 1:05:04 1:14:27
- The beginning of Mass, the renewal of Baptismal Promises and the Gloria 1:14:28 1:29:20
- The first Reading, the Psalm Response, the second Reading and the Gospel 1:29:29 1:48:30
- Pope Leo XIV receives the pallium from Cardinal Dominique Mamberti. The pallium is a
 woolen vestment symbolizing his role as Supreme Shepherd. Made from lamb's wool
 blessed on the feast of St Agnes, it represents both his pastoral office as the successor of St.
 Peter and visible head of the Catholic Church. 1:48:50 1:52:35
- Pope Leo XIV receives with emotion the Fisherman's Ring, a special gold ring bearing the image of St. Peter and the Pope's name and seal. Cardinal Tagle put the ring on his finger. 1:52:40 – 1:57:00
- A cardinal, bishop, deacon, religious sister, two young people, and a married couple approach Pope Leo XIV to express their obedience

- Pope Leo XIV's Homily at the Inauguration Mass on May 18,2025 is provided in English.

- The **Nicene Creed** is sung, and then the Offertory and the Liturgy of the Eucharist are celebrated, followed by a welcome to all pilgrims by Pope Leo. 2:13:00 3:05:12
