  with the bishop and priests—supported by hospitality, travel, and promotional materials that
  make them fruitful.

## VICAR FOR CLERGY OFFICE

Jesus sends His Church on a mission—and He does so through her priests. The Vicar for Clergy Office safeguards the health, holiness, and ongoing formation of our presbyterate, enabling pastors to preach, celebrate the sacraments, and mentor missionary disciples in every parish. In close partnership with the Vicar for Senior Clergy, this office supports 97 active diocesan priests, 31 international priests, and 35 senior priests, fostering fellowship and ensuring faithful pastoral care throughout the Diocese of La Crosse.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Healthy, holy priests on a mission: Your compassionate support for the Diocesan Annual
  Appeal helps cover medical needs not fully met by insurance, including rising costs, certain
  medications, and long-term care. This enables our priests to stay present at the altar, in the
  confessional, and at the margins where missionary discipleship begins, fostering a sense of care
  and compassion in our community.
- Ongoing formation that evangelizes: Your support helps priests continue their education, attend retreats, take sabbaticals, and pursue advanced studies, ultimately enabling them to preach more effectively, lead evangelizing parishes, and accompany families on the path of discipleship.
- Welcoming and equipping international priests: With a shortage of diocesan clergy, 31
  international priests serve as vital members of our parishes. The Diocesan Annual Appeal funds
  their training, including language and cultural adaptation. It provides ongoing support, such as
  housing and healthcare, transforming cultural bridges into pathways for evangelization and
  ensuring the vitality of sacramental life.
- A stronger presbyterate for a more effective mission: Your support fosters practical care and fraternal support, which in turn fosters unity among our priests. This unity multiplies their ability to invite, accompany, and send parishioners as missionary disciples, making you an integral part of our supportive community.

### REBUILD MY CHURCH INITIATIVE

Rebuild My Church translates this commissioning into a diocesan roadmap that forms missionary disciples and revitalizes parish life at every level. Inspired by Saint Francis' call to "go and rebuild my Church," the initiative moves us decisively from upkeep to a Spirit-led mission—listening, discerning, and acting so that each parish becomes a place of encounter, accompaniment, and evangelization. Building on two years of priestly renewal, the initiative now engages the entire Diocese through a comprehensive pastoral planning process, which will commence with 40 Listening Sessions in the fall of 2025.

- **Diocesan-wide listening and discernment:** Launch and sustain the 40 Listening Sessions to identify local needs and co-create mission-focused parish plans.
- Parishes fully alive on mission: Support the seven indicators—Thriving Sunday Mass, Healthy Leadership, Discipleship, Accompaniment, Missionary Outreach, Lifelong Formation, Stewardship—so evangelization becomes the parish way of life.
- **Foster a culture of accompaniment:** Train mentors and ministry leaders to warmly welcome newcomers, walk alongside seekers, and invite baptized Catholics into more profound conversion.
- **Missionary outreach that extends beyond walls**: Providing support, inviting others, and bearing witness in neighborhoods, campuses, and works of mercy.
- **Priest renewal for apostolic leadership:** Offer retreats, formation, and practical support so pastors can model missionary discipleship and lead with clarity and courage.
- **Mental health and trauma-informed care**: Build a trusted network of Catholic therapists and formation opportunities to enhance resilience for mission.
- **Healing and protection for survivors:** Enhance diocesan pathways of accompaniment, collaboration, and training to ensure our witness is credible, compassionate, and safe.

#### ADVANCING BISHOP BATTERSBY'S VISION — PIVOTING FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

- **From maintenance to mission:** Parish energy shifts from preserving structures to sending out disciples, guided by local discernment and the seven indicators.

- **From isolation to collaboration**: Parishes cooperate across regions, multiplying impact and stewarding resources for evangelization instead of duplicating efforts.

- **Listening Sessions (Fall 2025):** Venue, facilitation, materials, communications, and follow-up that turn parish insights into mission-driven plans.

### OFFICE FOR THE DIACONATE

Deacons serve as living signs of Christ the Servant—standing at the altar and reaching to the margins—so the Gospel touches people where they live, work, and suffer. Through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, the Office for the Diaconate supports ordained deacons and men in formation by providing the necessary formation and guidance needed to preach, teach, assist at the altar, and lead charitable works that nurture and send out missionary disciples in every parish.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Servant leadership at the heart of parish life: Deacons embody diakonia through the Word, the altar, and charity—bridging parish and peripheries. Hence, the Church's worship flows into service and evangelization.
- Accompaniment on the margins: Through jail, hospital, homebound, and poverty outreach

## PARISH MINISTRIES SUPPORT

## OFFICE FOR CATECHESIS & EVANGELIZATION

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). Jesus' words define our path: encounter Him, be converted, become His disciples, live in community, and be sent on a mission. The Office for Catechesis & Evangelization exists to form those who form others—so parishes don't just maintain programs but send out missionary disciples into homes, neighborhoods, and workplaces throughout the Diocese of La Crosse.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Formation that begins in encounter and leads to mission: Training, resources, and events help parish and school leaders foster a personal relationship with Jesus through the Holy Spirit, grow in prayer, cooperate with sacramental grace, study the faith in small groups, and actively participate in parish life—so that growth in Christ naturally overflows into evangelization.
- Equipping the "formers of the faithful": Curated, faithful resources; in-services at diocesan, deanery, and parish levels; and certification for teachers, parish directors, and catechists in doctrine, Scripture, spirituality, and methods—so the faith is taught accurately and evangelically.
- Parish-ready evangelization tools: Practical resources—standalone or aligned with trusted Bible and adult study programs—developed with parish leaders and school personnel, plus a free lending library for parishes and schools.
- On-ramp for busy disciples: Franciscan at Home—free for everyone in the Diocese—offers one-hour workshops (10-minute videos with a practical application task) to form parents, teachers, parish leaders, OCIA teams, and any adult seeking deeper formation.
- Collaborative evangelization across ministries: Providing training and support for men in diaconate formation, couples, Lay Formation Institute participants, and OCIA facilitators, including discernment of spiritual gifts—so leaders can serve effectively and help those who are distant find their way home.
- Reaching the margins—Hmong Ministry & Special Needs: Coordinating the Hmong Ministry (including Mary, Mother of Good Help Parish in Wausau with a full-time pastor and two part-time Hmong catechists), providing translated prayer resources, and supporting daily family prayer by phone (Divine Mercy at 3 p.m.; Rosary with formation at 8 p.m.); overseeing the Ministry for Persons with Special Needs; and offering tuition assistance to help Hmong families access Catholic schools.

#### ADVANCING BISHOP BATTERSBY'S VISION — PIVOTING FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

- From programs to people: Our focus on encounter, conversion, discipleship, communion, and mission transforms the mundane task of 'keeping things running' into a profound journey of accompanying individuals into a missionary life grounded in Jesus and His Church.
- From content to commissioning: Leaders learn what the Church teaches and how to evangelize—so every formation moment concludes with sending, in the spirit of John 20:21.

• From silos to collaboration: Our coordinated work with parishes, schools, and diocesan offices identifies charisms, mobilizes gifts, and makes evangelization the shared effort of the entire Church, making you an integral part of our team.

#### WHAT YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT MAKES POSSIBLE

- **Leader formation and certification:** Courses, in-services, and mentoring that build confident catechists, teachers, and parish leaders.

- Hmong & Special Needs support: Language-appropriate catechesis, daily prayer outreach, parish-based accompaniment, and tuition assistance that open doors to encounter Christ and live the mission.

## OFFICE FOR FAMILY LIFE & YOUTH MINISTRY

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). Jesus sends His Church through families and young people—the everyday domestic churches where faith is first proclaimed, learned, celebrated, and shared. The Office for Family Life & Youth Ministry, with its transformative power, accompanies individuals and families at all ages and stages, fostering a living friendship with Christ and helping households to witness the Gospel within their parishes and the broader community. Working with clergy and parish leaders, the office aims to move us beyond merely running programs to forming and sending out missionary disciples, advancing Bishop Battersby's call to shift from maintenance to mission.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Marriage preparation that evangelizes includes deanery retreats (Married Love: Two Becoming One), parish FOCCUS inventories, and diocesan Natural Family Planning (NFP) formation, all of which prepare couples for a lifelong, holy mission as husband and wife. Last year, over 450 couples celebrated their marriage in the Diocese; more than 500 individuals received NFP formation annually, transforming their homes into centers of evangelization.
- Marriage enrichment and accompaniment: Conferences, evenings of reflection, and retreats strengthen spouses in prayer, virtue, and sacramental love—backed by ministries for troubled marriages, divorce, and bereavement—so couples can witness Christ to their children, neighbors, and parishes.
- Youth Ministry (ages 12–39): encounter → discipleship → mission: We train parish leaders and teams and host experiences that ignite conversion and send young people back to their Conferences, evenings of reflection, and retreats that strengthen spouses in prayer, virtue, and sacramental love—supported by ministries for troubled marriages, divorce, and bereavement—so couples can witness Christ to their children, neighbors, and parishes. Parishioners serve as witnesses through various events, including parish retreats, local, regional, and national conferences, World Youth Day, Pilgrimage for Life, Adventure Camps, Diocesan Confirmation Retreats, and mission service trips. Ministry is integrated across home, parish, and community—each reinforcing the other.
- **High school and young adult formation:** After Confirmation, teens and young adults are accompanied in discerning their vocation and taking responsibility within the Church today—through parish collaboration and diocesan initiatives tailored to different life stages.
- Men's and women's initiatives: Focused gatherings help adults discover their gifts and lead as
  missionary disciples in family, workplace, and parish ministries. These initiatives are designed to
  foster personal growth and empowerment, making each feel valued and important in the
  Church's mission.

#### ADVANCING BISHOP BATTERSBY'S VISION — PIVOTING FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

- From events to sending: Every retreat, course, and gathering aims at commissioning—in the spirit of John 20:21—so participants return to parishes and neighborhoods as apostles.
- From siloed efforts to collaboration: As a service and partnership office, Family Life & Youth Ministry connects pastors, parish teams, and families, transforming individual gifts into

- collective evangelizing efforts. This collaborative approach ensures that everyone feels included and part of a larger mission.
- From maintaining pace to fueling missionary momentum: By forming marriages, empowering parents, and engaging youth and young adults, the office multiplies everyday witnesses who bring Christ to the margins of daily life.

#### WHAT YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT MAKES POSSIBLE

- Marriage foundations for mission: Deanery retreats, FOCCUS preparation, and NFP instruction
  that ground marriages in sacramental love and evangelizing purpose. Last year, these programs
  helped over 450 couples celebrate their marriage in the Diocese, and more than 500 individuals
  received NFP formation, transforming their homes into centers of evangelization.
- Youth & Young Adult Evangelization: Providing training and support for parish youth ministers and teams, along with diocesan retreats, pilgrimages, camps, conferences, and mission trips that ignite faith and send.
- **Pastoral accompaniment for families:** Ongoing marriage enrichment and ministries for troubled marriages, divorce, and bereavement—walking with families in mercy and hope.
- **Expanded young adult outreach:** Deliberate opportunities throughout the Diocese so every stage of life can find a path to missionary discipleship.

## OFFICE FOR MINISTRIES & SOCIAL CONCERNS

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). Bishop Battersby is urging every parish in the Diocese of La Crosse to pivot from a focus on maintenance to one on mission. The Office for Ministries & Social Concerns, as a key player in this pivot, is responsible for building a community of missionary disciples (deacons, lay leaders, and parish teams) who worship Jesus in the Eucharist and then serve the margins in His name. Our work, building on the Eucharistic Revival, transforms personal devotion into evangelizing charity in parishes, deaneries, and communities across the Diocese.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Permanent Deacon Formation missionary servants for the margins: We form men whose
  identity is rooted in diakonia—the Church's servant-love expressed through Word, altar, and
  charity. Deacons bridge parish and peripheries, carrying the Gospel to the suffering, poor,
  incarcerated, and overlooked—and encouraging parishioners to join them. This year's goal is to
  have 17 La Crosse candidates in formation; additionally, the program trains 9 Madison and 8
  Superior candidates (funded by their respective dioceses), demonstrating excellence and
  stewardship.
- Lay Formation Institute everyday apostles for every parish: A two-year journey of study, prayer, and fellowship equips Catholics to evangelize in their communities. Graduates return prepared to lead OCIA, teach the faith, accompany seekers, and strengthen councils and ministries—pivoting parish life from "keep it running" to "let's reach people." Reach this year: 30 first-year participants.
- Leaders of Prayer advancing the Church's presence: We train and commission leaders to bring Christ into nursing homes, jails, and the homes of the sick and homebound— demonstrating pastoral charity and multiplying evangelizing efforts where clergy are unable consistently to be. Reach this year: approximately 100 commissions renewed last year; 14 new Leaders of Prayer commissioned on August 23, 2025, after three weekends of training.
- Parish Social Ministry from programs to people: A part-time Diocesan Liaison visits each deanery, connecting parish leaders and volunteers involved in charity work. We guide parishes to shift from isolated efforts to a culture of accompaniment, helping the baptized identify needs, organize responses, and personally reach out to those on the margins. Impact: A fruitful model of support, encouragement, and practical collaboration among deaneries.
- Hispanic & Migrant Ministry accompaniment in a native language: We assist with Mass, sacraments, formation, retreats, and pilgrimages in Spanish, complementing the legal and material aid provided by Catholic Charities. Language-appropriate pastoral care opens doors for evangelization, leadership growth, and parish integration—enabling families to both receive and become missionaries within our communities. Reach each week: 2,000+ people served.

### ADVANCING BISHOP BATTERSBY'S VISION — PIVOTING FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

• From structures to sent people: We don't just maintain programs; we form disciples who carry Christ. Your support is crucial in this transition. A part-time Diocesan Liaison visits each deanery, connecting parish leaders and volunteers involved in charity work. We guide parishes to move from isolated efforts to a culture of accompaniment, helping the baptized identify needs,

- organize responses, and personally reach out to those on the margins. Impact: A fruitful model of support, encouragement, and practical collaboration among deaneries, reaching into prisons and nursing homes, farm fields and factories, kitchens and classrooms.
- From devotion to deployment: In close collaboration with the Offices for Catechesis & Evangelization, Sacred Worship, Schools, Family Life, and Communication, Eucharistic devotion transforms into evangelizing action—parishes that go and make disciples.
- From duplication to collaboration: We work with Catholic Charities, the Diocesan Mission Office, the Social Ministry Advisory Committee, and USCCB relief initiatives. Your contribution is part of this collaborative effort, which utilizes grants for ongoing education and expands parish capacity without duplicating efforts.

#### WHAT YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT MAKES POSSIBLE

- **Deacon formation and discernment:** Faculty, retreats, spiritual direction, and supervised field experiences that shape missionary deacons—while stewarding resources that also serve neighboring dioceses.
- Lay Formation Institute cohorts: Tuition assistance, faculty stipends, retreat days, and parish practicums—so more lay leaders are equipped to evangelize locally.
- Leaders of Prayer training and commissioning: A three-weekend formation, along with resources and ongoing support, to expand prayer and pastoral care when clergy are not always available.
- **Parish Social Ministry liaison:** Deanery visits, training, and network-building that help parishes transition from isolated activities to coordinated acts of support and works of mercy.
- Hispanic & Migrant Ministry: Mass and sacraments, catechesis, retreats, pilgrimages, and leadership training in Spanish—supporting evangelization that reaches over 2,000 people every week.

Your participation in the Diocesan Annual Appeal fuels missions of hope—forming deacons, equipping lay leaders, multiplying prayer and pastoral care, and welcoming our Hispanic brothers and sisters. Your generosity helps our local Church pivot from maintenance to mission, so every parish becomes a place where missionary disciples are formed, accompanied, and sent.

### OFFICE FOR SACRED WORSHIP

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). The Office for Sacred Worship, in its mission to serve the bishop, clergy, and faithful, plays a crucial role in ensuring that the Church's liturgy forms and sends out missionary disciples. By deepening our understanding of the rites, their meaning, celebration, and impact on daily life, the Office helps our worship become actions of witness, charity, and evangelization. Its mission includes sacramental catechesis for everyone, the liturgical formation of parish ministers, and diocesan leadership for the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA) through support for parish coordinators and participation in diocesan events alongside the bishop and candidates. Your active participation in these activities is what makes our church community vibrant and alive.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- **Liturgy that inspires:** Resources and guidance to help parishes celebrate the rites with beauty and fidelity, so Sunday worship serves as a springboard for weekday mission.
- Sacramental catechesis for all ages: Teaching and materials that connect what we celebrate to how we live, empowering parishioners to witness Christ in family, workplace, and community.
- **Formation for those who serve the assembly:** Training and support so parish liturgical ministers can serve with competence and charity, strengthening prayer that leads to evangelization.
- OCIA leadership and accompaniment: Diocesan coordination that helps parish OCIA teams and diocesan rites with the Bishop—welcoming seekers, forming sponsors, and preparing new Catholics to be sent on mission.

- From siloed efforts to diocesan collaboration: OCIA leadership and diocesan celebrations unite parishes in a shared mission of evangelization and initiation. This shift is a reflection of the strength and unity of our church community, where we work together towards a common goal.

#### WHAT YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT MAKES POSSIBLE

• **Televised Mass ministry:** Production, airtime, and closed captioning that bring Sunday worship to thousands of homebound Catholics—uniting them with the larger diocesan family. Viewer contributions help, but do not cover the full costs; Diocesan Annual Appeal support sustains this vital outreach.

- OCIA support and diocesan celebrations: Providing coaching and resources for parish coordinators and diocesan rites with the Bishop, who welcome catechumens and candidates into full sacramental life—and into mission.
- **Liturgical formation and catechesis:** Workshops, guides, and parish support that strengthen the "Ars Celebrandi", form ministers, and connect sacramental life to everyday discipleship.

## TRIBUNAL

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). The Diocesan Tribunal serves the Church's mission by seeking truth in justice and mercy—rendering judgments about rights, obligations, and a person's status in the Church (including petitions for a declaration of nullity of marriage). For instance, a couple who have been divorced and wish to remarry in the Church may seek a declaration of nullity. By clarifying and healing complex situations like this, the Tribunal helps people return more fully to sacramental life and parish mission—so disciples can be accompanied, reconciled, and sent.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Evangelizing justice and mercy: Supports expert canonical discernment that seeks truth and healing in light of Sacred Scripture, the Church's Magisterium, and the Code of Canon Law—opening paths for renewed participation in the sacraments and parish life.
- Pastoral accompaniment throughout the process: Offers communication, hospitality, and guidance that help people navigate petitions (including marriage nullity) with confidence, dignity, and hope—so wounded disciples can be restored and re-engaged in mission.
- **Partnership with parishes:** Enhances collaboration with pastors and advocates so that those approaching the Tribunal experience a united, compassionate Church that welcomes them back into worship, formation, and service.

- From a standalone office to a diocesan mission: Coordinates with clergy and parish leaders to ensure Tribunal ministry actively fosters a culture of discipleship and mercy throughout the Diocese.

- Justice in the truth of the Gospel: Canonical expertise, research, and formation that ground judgments on Scripture, the Magisterium, and Canon Law, ensuring integrity and credibility in the Church's witness.

## CHANCERY

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). In every mission field, the sacraments are the Church's vital life source. The Chancery serves pastors, parishes, and the faithful through practical and canonical work that enables encounters with Christ—processing prenuptial files, permissions, and dispensations; issuing declarations of matrimony nullity for lack of canonical form; and maintaining the official directories of parishes and clergy. These behind-the-scenes services help ensure our sacramental life is celebrated faithfully and fruitfully, so evangelization can flourish.

#### How Does Your Diocesan Annual Appeal Gift Form and Send Missionary Disciples

- Freeing pastors for evangelization: By navigating complex canonical requirements, the Chancery reduces administrative burdens so pastors can spend more time accompanying people and proclaiming the Gospel.
- **Forming missionary households:** Your generous donations enable us to carefully review prenuptial files, permissions, and dispensations, helping couples enter marriage confidently grounded in the Church—prepared to live and testify as missionary disciples. Your support directly contributes to the formation of these missionary households.

This helps the faithful return to full sacramental life and parish mission, making your contributions instrumental in facilitating these spiritual journeys.

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). The Diocesan Archives, a beacon of hope, safeguards the living memory of our local Church. It is a place where disciples can be identified, accompanied, and sent. By preserving historical, genealogical, and sacramental records—and by serving the Curia, parishes, and individuals with prompt research—the Archives plays a pivotal role in helping people reconnect with the Church's sacramental life and story, an essential step in missionary renewal throughout our Diocese.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Safeguarding sacramental identity: Careful stewardship of baptism, confirmation, and marriage records helps individuals obtain the documentation they need to return to the sacraments, complete OCIA, prepare for marriage, or pursue canonical processes—so they can fully live and share the Gospel.

This collaboration strengthens a culture of discipleship and accompaniment, fostering a sense of unity and shared mission within the Diocese.
- From barriers to bridges: The Archives' transparent processes and compassionate
  communication transform potential barriers, such as complex record requests, into welcoming,
  healing, and meaningful pastoral encounters. For example, a genealogical record request can
  become an opportunity for prayer and connection, turning a potentially daunting task into a
  path of grace today.

### OFFICE FOR COMMUNICATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). Our mission is clear and bold: to create encounters with Christ. Through the Diocesan Annual Appeal, the Office for Communication and Public Relations spreads the Gospel with clarity, credibility, and broad outreach—arming every parish to evangelize in a digital age. Appeal funding has allowed a decisive shift from a centralized print model to a parish-centered, multi-platform evangelization partnership for the entire Diocese.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Parish empowerment at scale: Thanks to the appeal, 42 parishes have been equipped to launch FlockNote, and 69 have been onboarded into Catholic Social Media. This direct parish-tohousehold communication strategy, which invites, accompanies, and sends, is a tangible result of your support.
- Multi-platform evangelization: A new Digital Evangelist & Marketing Specialist role (funded by the Diocesan Annual Appeal) provides parish training, campaigns, reels, podcasts, and radio content that have reached tens of thousands and engage seekers where they are online.
- Storytelling that forms witnesses: Photography, video, and on-site coverage—our "have camera, will travel" service—helps parishes capture sacramental moments and share them broadly so worship becomes a public witness.
- **Direct diocesan engagement:** A newsletter funded by the Diocesan Annual Appeal now has an average open rate of 54%, enhancing formation and mission across audiences.
- Concise printing with broader impact: Catholic Life continues to serve 53,000 households with higher-quality, thematic issues—while resources shift toward parish-focused digital tools that engage younger and previously unengaged audiences.

#### ADVANCING BISHOP BATTERSBY'S VISION — PIVOTING FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION

- From central office to local parishes: We shifted from speaking solely on behalf of the diocesan center to empowering parishes to communicate independently through platforms, training, and creative resources. This shift has made each parish an integral part of our mission, fostering a sense of involvement and shared responsibility.
- From print-only to multi-platform: Recognizing that 96% of the magazine's readers were 50+, we diversified channels to reach younger Catholics and the unaffiliated. This shift was made with your needs and preferences in mind and considered in our communication strategies.
- From cost to catalysis: By reducing the frequency of Catholic Life from 9 issues to 4 and consolidating staff roles, we saved over \$150,000. This financial stewardship allowed us to reinvest in parish services and digital evangelization, catalyzing our mission.
- From 7% to 54%: Over three years, the portion of the office budget allocated to parish-facing services increased from 7% to 54%, aligning resources with the mission.

- Platforms and training for parishes: Expansion of FlockNote and Catholic Social Media parish cohorts; advanced coaching to help leaders sustain digital evangelization.

- High-impact campaigns: Examples like Padres vs. Grannies reached over 52,000 people and generated more than 1,300 clicks to Casa Hogar—part of hundreds of thousands of annual digital impressions.
- **Equipment & field support:** Portable photo/video kits for parish events; mailing of Bishop Battersby and Pope Leo portraits to parishes lacking print capacity.
- **Catholic Life (optimized):** Four high-quality issues each year support beloved storytelling while freeing funds for mission-critical parish services.
- Next-step growth (upcoming year):
  - Enhance parish digital skills with extra training and advanced tactics.
  - Expand podcast, radio, and video outreach to engage younger audiences and those on the peripheries.
  - Improve the diocesan newsletter and start new campaigns that engage people with parish life.
  - Invest in creative storytelling—photography, videography, and social media that showcase the truth, beauty, and goodness of parish life.
  - Maintain careful stewardship, strengthening infrastructure, increasing in-house production, and utilizing technology to expand impact at lower costs.

## OFFICE FOR SAFE ENVIRONMENT

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). Mission requires trust. The Office for Safe Environment fosters trust by promoting healthy relationships and ensuring that our parishes and schools are safe environments in which to worship, work, and learn. Following the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People (2002), the office provides training and background screening for clergy, staff, volunteers, and parent helpers—so the Church's care is trustworthy, and our evangelization is convincing. This is how safety work becomes disciple-making work: it rebuilds confidence, heals memories, and clears the way for people to meet Christ and be sent.

#### HOW DOES YOUR DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL GIFT FORM AND SEND MISSIONARY DISCIPLES

- Whole-church formation for vigilance and care: Annual safe-environment education—online
  and in person—equips clergy, staff, volunteers, and parents to recognize warning signs,

- Every student is formed to speak up: All students in our Catholic schools and Religious Education programs participate in annual youth training, fostering a culture where children understand their dignity and know how to seek help.

- Comprehensive formation and screening: In 2024–25, over 2,700 paid staff and 4,200 volunteers completed Safe Environment training; 12,838 students (grades 1–12) received youth training—demonstrating a culture where protection is everyone's responsibility.
- Charter compliance and external audits: Annual audits and triennial on-site reviews verify fidelity to the USCCB Charter; the Diocese has maintained compliance since audits started.

 Accessible parish and school support: Year-round assistance, updated educational materials, and a mix of online and in-person delivery so every community can meet standards and foster trust.

Covering Finance, Human Resources, diocesan buildings and grounds, Shared Services, Parish Administrative Support Services (PASS), Parish Auditing, and Holy Cross Diocesan Center Maintenance, this office helps pastors and ministries focus more on their mission—allowing sacramental life, evangelization, and works of mercy to flourish.

- **Freeing pastors for people:** PASS, Finance, HR, and Auditing support reduce administrative burdens, so clergy and parish leaders can spend more time accompanying families and evangelizing.

This plan ensures that our dedicated employees, who have devoted their lives to serving the Church, are well cared for in their retirement years.
- St. Joseph the Workman Cathedral—operations and maintenance: Support for the Mother Church where diocesan liturgies (Chrism Mass, ordinations, major celebrations) gather the faithful and send them forth.

• Holy Cross Diocesan Center—operations and maintenance: Providing daily support for the Curia and Catholic Charities across more than 99 rooms, including offices, conference spaces, Christ the King Chapel, Crypt Chapel, St. Martha's Kitchen and Refectory, and a gym—fueling training sessions, retreats, leader meetings, formation days, TV Mass productions, and more.

## Mission & ministry venues:

- Refectory: Priest Unity Days, clergy conferences, donor gatherings, Jubilee Wedding celebrations, Catholic Schools in-services, Casa Hogar Dinner, and diocesan formation events.
- Bishop's Common Room & Riverview Room: Councils, boards, deanery meetings, Bible studies, and ministry collaborations (Catechesis & Evangelization, Consecrated Life, Vocations, Safe Environment, Family Life, Catholic Charities, and partners).
- Fields and facilities for the community: Gym and ball fields used by Aquinas, Western Technical College, and the Warriors Drum & Bugle Corps—strengthening Catholic education and community ties.
- **Emergency readiness & community care:** Holy Cross partners with the La Crosse County Health Department as a family-assistance site in a mass-casualty response—placing our campus at the service of mercy.
- **Creation care and campus stewardship:** Mississippi-shore grounds maintained safely and beautifully—providing habitat for wildlife and a welcoming space for prayer, formation, and hospitality—through consistent, year-round upkeep.

FOCUS (Fellowship of Catholic University Students) is forming missionary disciples on four campuses in the Diocese of La Crosse—UW—Stout, UW—Eau Claire, UW—Stevens Point, and UW—La Crosse. Through the Diocesan Annual Appeal: Fueling Missions of Hope, our local Church sends trained missionaries to accompany students in Bible studies, mentorship, prayer, and sacramental life—so they encounter Jesus Christ and learn to share the Gospel with peers. template

- From programs to people: Case management and mentoring focus on building trustful relationships, not just transactions—so charity becomes a way to connect, support, and empower.
- **From crisis to commissioning:** As lives stabilize, clients, volunteers, and parish partners are encouraged to give back, embodying John 20:21 through service and witness.
- From silos to collaboration: At Catholic Charities, we believe in the power of partnerships. We work with parishes, schools, civic agencies, and diocesan offices to maximize impact and prevent duplication—mission first.

- **St. Lawrence Community Services:** provided \$276,882 in direct aid to 1,981 individuals, covering rent, utilities, food, transportation, and health needs—plus advocacy, financial literacy, and customized case plans.
- **Representative Payee Program:** 310 clients received budgeting support and payment management for rent, utilities, groceries, and essentials—restoring order and peace of mind.
- **Community Homeless Facilities:** 32,372 nights of shelter provided (2024); Sojourner House renovations completed, and a \$300,000 "Leap of Faith" campaign launched; Good Shepherd

- Shelter in Wausau now operates 365 days a year with weekday Day Services; La Crosse Warming Center remains seasonal with added day services.
- **Beyond Shelter:** Long-term housing with case supervision in Wausau, Loyal (*House of Mercy*), and La Crosse—23 families housed in 2024—connecting residents to resources for sustainable independence.
- Family Services Program (Adoption): 46 adoption finalizations in 2024; the agency is Wisconsin's only Hague-accredited provider for international adoptions; provides 24/7 confidential support for expectant parents and offers robust post-adoption resources.
- Immigration Assistance: Served 248 immigrants in 2024 with BIA-recognized, accredited staff
  and access to a contracted immigration attorney (including naturalization, adjustment, VAWA,
  referrals, and more).
- **Disability Services & Recovery Supports:** 10,402 staffing hours in 2024 across Adult, School, and After-School programs; partnerships (e.g., Bridges of Belonging, The Dwelling Place); and the Live By Program sober-living collaboration with La Crosse County.
- **Volunteers:** 937 volunteers dedicated 21,662 hours—an army of hope that keeps doors open and extends Christ's mercy to the margins.
